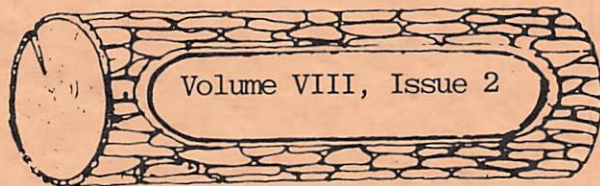

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## GLEANINGS FROM THE EAST SAGINAW COMMON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Monday, 13 July 1874, p 125 ff.

Joseph CAMPAU had been notified to build a sidewalk in front of his premises on Jefferson St, between Emerson and Webber Sts, asked for extension of time; granted. I M & H P SMITH owned about 100 rods of frontage on Sidney St, asked that completion time of their sidewalk be extended; granted. DeWitt C GAGE asked that grading which he proposed in the Merrill, Mott and Gage addition, be completed, leaving a narrower road because of a natural depression and no available fill dirt; referred to committee. Joseph DENNIS of South Saginaw owned a team of horses which ran away on 11 Jul and broke the lamp post on the corner of Water and Genesee. John A BROWN was the lowest bidder for building a city pest house. Following bills were submitted for services rendered: S S Ellsworth, fire dept pay roll, \$278.14; DERBY & CO., fire dept supplies, \$21.45; D I PRALL, poor supplies, \$6.00; A BLANKERTS, poor supplies, \$25.00; John DEERING, et al, work on street, \$134.00; Jacob DAVIDSON, street commissioner, \$35.00; H & E PROUX, work for city, \$24.25; R N WILSON, poor supplies, \$53.53; Isaiah DAVIDSON, Genesee Ave plank, \$92.00; Thomas NESTON, Genesee ave plank, \$352.50.

Monday, 20 July 1874, page 133, ff.

William HEGENER and 3 others asked for crosswalk on Thirteenth St across Carroll, and building of bridge at same point; referred to street commissioner. OWEN & BREWER and others asked for planking of North Washington from railroad track to 1st St; referred to committee. John DEITRICH asked for rebate of \$50 license tax as saloon keeper for 1874 since he wished to discontinue business; filed. W R BURT tendered his resignation from the board of water commissioners. Charles WREGE submitted oath as Foreman of Hose Co #3; Walter H HOWLETT's bond as Clerk of the Recorder's Court was also submitted. Nelson L ROBERTS was recommended to be clerk of the street commission; filed. Following bills were submitted for services rendered: H Y DEPEW, repairs on city property, \$41.00; FEIGE Bros, repairs on ballot boxes, \$6.50; George H WATSON, plumbing, etc, \$45.43; BURTT & LOOMIS, work for city, \$11.80; T Dailey MOWER, repairs on city property, \$68.00; W T ARNOLD, poor supplies, \$2.50; J HENNING & Son, poor supplies, \$5.00; H & E GOESCHEL, poor supplies, \$75.50; Edward PIEPER, poor supplies, \$75.50; W H DOWNS & Co., poor supplies, \$15.00; H H BRADLEY, poor supplies, \$29.50; S S ELLSWORTH, hay for fire dept, \$13.40; Charles P HESS, Mackinaw St work, \$68.50; J DEERING, work on streets, \$135.00; John BROWN, earth moving, \$70.40; H & E PROUX, work for city, \$71.79; Thomas NESTOR, Genesee ave plank rd, \$134.48; Isaiah DAVIDSON, Genesee Ave Plank rd, \$23.44; John A McPARLAN, 14th St improvement, \$58.40. Patrick O'GREADY and William ATHERTON had been assessed for ditch cleaning on 4th st, between Miller and Norman; they objected to paying for work they had done themselves; referred to street commissioner. Patrick McENTEE said that his assessment for cleaning ditch on Potter St, between Warren and 3d St was excessive and unjust as he had dug the ditches himself, but these were afterwards dug deeper and a box drain installed; referred to street commissioner. Petition of Mrs Rosa MEISTER, made earlier, for permit to peddle in city without paying usual fee was granted. John A BROWN declined contract to build pest house, controller was instructed to contract with John P SHEEHY for the building.

## Programs in Review

Leland R Watrous

The meeting of 12 March 1979 found two of our members, Lloyd J Cartwright and Leland R Watrous, speaking on "Getting it Together", which was their way of preparing material for publication.

On 9 April 1979, Anna Mae Thompson was in charge of the evening and spoke on a number of subjects; ordering materials from microfilm catalogs, research in Ohio Land Grants regarding Fire Lands in the Western Reserve and the collection of photographs at the Hoyt Library. Fred Pike suggested writing to the Alden Library, at Ohio University at Athens, Ohio for Ohio records. Arlene Cook noted

that a catalog of newspaper microfilms was available. Peggy Lugthart stated that she had tried to locate Palatine relatives several years ago, but only recently had her letters borne results. Jacob Michel mentioned his problems in becoming naturalized--he had obtained a Russian birth certificate in six months.

The Annual Meeting, held 11 June saw the election of officers for the coming year, as reflected on the inside front cover of this magazine. A slide presentation on Old Saginaw was given by Doug Doughty of the Saginaw Historical Society. This program was delightful, interesting and informative in its approach to history. The narration by Anna Mae Thompson added to the interest.

An "extra" meeting was held on 9 Jul 1979 when Mrs Winifred Sphinks, a well-known English genealogist was made available through the kind offices of Dr Mudd to speak on "English Genealogy". She gave a very knowledgeable talk on brass rubbings, as found in England, and on other aspects of English genealogy.

The new year started off with the meeting of 10 September 1979 featuring three "Mini-Seminar Workshops", led by Anna Mae Thompson on Canada, Georgetta Walker on Massachusetts and Lee Watrous on Connecticut. Judging from the turn-out and the activities in those three areas, this was one of the more interesting meetings.

On 8 October, Bernard Forster spoke on his pet subject, Land Records, providing an extremely educational program on the many facets, such as fact that land is a definite and specific area of the earth and through the years three principal legal descriptions have been used: (1) Metes and bounds for the determination of irregular property lines (2) reference to a city map or plat (3) reference to government subdivision lines. The older land records contain more genealogical information than the newer, but even the more recent ones still are valuable in determination of some relationships and in some cases will state an address of a grantor who has moved away.

CMU's Clarke Historical Library director John Cumming was our speaker on 12 Nov 1979 and regaled the crowd with results of his research into the history of the city in the lumbering days. Little Jake was in the clothing business for only about 10 years, the remaining years in Saginaw were spent in the banking and financial business. Conditions have been magnified out of proportion many times greater than in actuality; only a single police officer was on duty in East Saginaw on many nights. Prostitution flourished but was closely controlled by police and the city council. There were as many as 200 saloons in town for a population of 12,000, but many of these were extremely small--one room in a house--and closed down when the lumberjacks went back to the woods. Many of those lumberjacks were farm boys from Ontario or Ohio who came to the woods, saved their money and later bought farms in the area. Judging from the newspapers of the time, there were a number of forms of recreation offered to the citizens other than the above; the old Academy of Music had outstanding acoustics and a nightly presentation of one type or another, ranging from evangelism and temperance lectures to fine music, lectures by prominent Americans of the day, drama and an almost unlimited variety of the entertainment spectrum.
