

#### EIGHTH ANNUAL SEMINAR SPEAKER ANNOUNCED

The Saginaw Genealogical Society is very proud and immensely pleased to announce that the speaker for the Eighth Annual Seminar will be George E McCracken, Ph. D., FASG, of Des Moines, Iowa and an internally-known authority on Genealogy, publisher of The American Genealogist and university professor. having spent 48 years teaching Latin, Greek, French, German, Italian, ancient and medieval history. He is a former Roman archaeologist, military historian and student of the early Christian church. He was elected as a Fellow of the American Society of Genealogists nearly thirty years ago and has contributed many scholarly articles to various genealogical works and has been associated with The American Genealogist as associate editor, and, for the past sixteen years as editor-in-chief. Dr McCracken is also responsible for a number of volumes of military history, classified as TOP SECRET and in 1970 The Welcome Claimants, Proved, Disproved and Dougtful, which is one of the most important works in Pennsylvania genealogy. He retired from the university five years ago but keeps active with TAG, which is regarded by many as the Number 1 publication of genealogy, with its emphasis on Connecticut. Dr McCracken will be speaking on genealogy in New York and New Jersey, two big problem areas for those with lines in those states. Richard Hathaway, director of the Michigan Unit of the Michigan State Library will share in the speaking duties during the morning hours and our own Dr Richard Mudd will be the featured speaker during the luncheon break, with a program relating to his grandfather, Dr Samuel Mudd and his mistreatment and vindication from the hysteria following the assassination of Abraham Lincoln. Tickets will be \$15.00 for reservations in advance. and \$17.00 after or at the door.

But not satisfied with this revenge, he had Mrs Shad before Justice Miller on the above charge. The lady plead guilty and was fined \$5 and costs.

Following bills for services, recommended for approval by City Controller, Joseph A HOLLON: William E LEACH, jailer's fee for Apr, \$112.28; Edward PIPER, supplies to city poor, \$60.50; John DALEY, services as city scavenger, \$11.50; Albert H FREY, stationery, \$58.18; A EYMER, treasurer, 3 months rent on city building, \$250.00; John DEERING, work on streets, \$48.00; H & E PROUX, work on city streets, \$26.40; Patrick O'GRADY, supplies to city poor, \$167.00; Mosher & Mickley, supplies to city poor, \$86.50; A SCHUPP, et al, pay roll city officers, Apr:\$1,016.68; W L WEBBER, et al, pay roll Common Council, \$152.00; T D MOWER et al, pay roll police force, \$1,374.22; Henry H BRADLEY, supplies to city poor, \$10.50. Claim of A GROHMANN on order on poor fund for \$15, payable to Henry THORNTON and directed to Thomas J MELVIN. The petition of L P MASON and others for crosswalk on Wells St across Thompson was approved. A petition of the following doctors of the city: Andrew McINNES, D'S HALL, J J LUTZ, George A LATHROP, M M WHEELER, B. HESSE, F. MASSBACHER, L SIMONEAU, Henry MELCHER, Richard LUSTER, H C FARRAND, Charles S FRIZELLE who requested deferment of appointment of Dr B B ROSS as city physician due to alleged bad professional character and misconduct until a hearing could be held. Twelve incidents were charged, complainants were: William LEACH, Charles SMEAD, Mrs SHAY, John RICHARDSON, Mrs John RICHARDSON, Mrs Scott, Marshall SMITH, Bertha HOWE, J W FITZMAURICE, Charles MEYER, L SIMONEAU, William T ARNOLD, John HOGAN, Mr GARVEY, Samuel KITCHEN, Odele LAFRIQUIER, Margaret and William HOGAN, George A LATHROP, Tyler BIGELOW, Clara BIGELOW, Thomas MARSHALL, Mrs BOESE, J W DAY; among those mentioned in the allegations were Frank PARENTO, who had been a prisoner in the city jail and had cut his throat; an unnamed son of Mrs SHAY aged about 9 yrs in 1871; a boy surnamed SCOTT residing with parents on Franklin St in Sept 1873; children of Odele LAFRIQUIER; Michael HOGAN, aged about 9 yrs; B M THOMPSON, city attorney was asked for opinion on duties of city physician, which he gave; the committee of councilmen heard the sworn testimony, witnesses were examined and cross examined as in trial and the verdict given was not guilty. P NICKODEMUS asked that the city treasurer be instructed to take poor orders of him in payment for city taxes; tabled. W A ARMSTRONG asked that ditch on west side of Elm St between Maple and Warren be worked on: referred to committee; Peter SCHNEIDER appointed as City Scavenger. Jacob DAVIDSON was elected as street commissioner. Mrs E REARDON granted

thirty days to lay a sidewalk on William St, between Franklin and Washington. Martin MANION was granted permission to use the street in front of his premises for depositing building material. Dr Benjamin B ROSS was elected city physician. Monday, 11 May 1874, page 31

T D MOWER and 5 others asked that water connections be made to 2nd story of market building to police headquarters; approved. BURNHAM & STILL and 5 others petitioned that Mackinaw St, between Webber and the river be filled with sawdust rather than earth; tabled; C P SAGER and 8 others asked to change grading of Washington ave to conform with line first established by city surveyor; tabled. Henry BUTENSCHOEN asked that correction be made in line of Fitzhugh St, incorrectly laid out in 1869; referred to committee. A B WOOD appointed deputy treasurer for city of east saginaw; requested by John GALLAGHER, treasurer. John COWLES, John DUNLAP, Peter BURNS, James FARRELL, Douglas CLARK, George BRIEST, Jacob GALLINGER were the 7 firemen appointed to Hose House #1. John BLIGHT was appointed Asst St Commissioner of 7th and 8th Wards. Bills from the following people were submitted for payment: Jacob DAVIDSON, street commissioner, \$42.00; John DEERING, et al, work on streets, \$58.00; H & E PROUX, work on streets, \$36.00; N SCHMELZER, supplies to poor, \$102.00; H M BRADLEY, supplies to poor, \$16.00; Ed. PIEPER, supplies to poor, \$80.50; H & E GOESCHELL, supplies to poor, \$185.50; OWEN & BREWER, lumber for city, \$342.62. Bills of City Scavenger John DALEY and Frank I CURTIS were referred to committee. A bill from Joseph BROWN, who had completed hose houses was approved. Additional bills from the following were submitted and approved: W E LEACH, jailer's fees, \$112.28, Edward Pieper, supplies to city poor, \$60.50, John DALEY, city scavenger, \$11.50, Albert H FREY, stationery, \$\$58.15; Patrick O'GRADY, supplies to poor, \$67.00; MOSHER & MICKLEY, supplies to poor, \$\$86.50; Henry H BRADLEY, supplies to city poor, \$10.50. Bill from Thomas J MELVIN for \$15 as house rent for Henry THORNTON, listed as poor person and city charge submitted, approved. An earlier proposal for renting vault space from Michael Jeffers was approved. Robert L WARREN, proprietor of the Saginaw Daily Enterprise, submitted bid for printing city notices; the Courier was selected, however. (To Be Continued)

# Programs in Review

Leland R Watrous

Lloyd J Cartwright of our society was the speaker for the meeting of 14 January 1980 and gave us the benefit of his experiences in researching in England. He

also described charting and explained the Everton system, whereby the number of the father is twice the chart number of the child and noted that after ten generations, a person has 512 ancestors; fifteen generations would provide a total of 16,384, ad infinitum. Lloyd emphasized that all information should be recorded before it is lost and that all biographical anecdotes should also be noted. He showed road atlases and gazetters for locating market towns and villages in England. Ordinance maps for locating certain areas are available in various scales. Among various places for researching in England are the General Registry Office at St Catherine in London and the Society of Genealogists in Southwest London. The Public Records office is located in Chancery Lane and has census records. The Parish Records in England began in 1838.

Dr Evelyn Shields, an assistant professor of Speech at Delta College, spoke on the "Irish Folk in American History." She detailed ships and ports of embarkation in Ireland and England and the ports of entry into the United States. Among the causes for emigration were famine, restrictive British laws and chronic unemployment. New York City rose to about 1/3 Irish in population and Boston to about one half of the total. The saloon became the unofficial Irish center of activity in America, much as in Ireland. Few Irish became farmers, mainly because of their sociability and reluctance to face a life separated from others on a farm, but rather were urban dwellers. They raised the Catholic church to the largest in the nation, founded the Knights of Labor, one of the early organized labor unions. Over the years, the Irish rose from a despised position to a place of power and respectanility.

On 10 March 1980, we had a real treat in the persons of Chet and Mary Jane Trout from Lansing who spoke on their hobby, Tombstone Rubbing, and illustrated their talks with both color slides and examples of rubbings. They recommended rice paper or mulberry paper, which is tough and comes in many textures. They also said that the stone must be cleaned with a fiber bristle brush, NEVER a wire brush and that the stones must be treated with respect. The paper should be taped to the stone tightly, using masking tape for the normal job which takes about one hour. Use a heel ball of wax--shoemaker's wax or carpenter's crayons (which come in various colors) -- and rub lightly over the design. The children's crayons will not work well and tend to melt in hot weather. When finished, remove the masking tape. Many fine illustrations of New England scenes were used to explain the Puritan outlook in New England and their customs and housing, which was illustrated with slides of Plimoth Plantation. The symbols found on tombstones were the people's art due to common illiteracy at the time. They discussed various designs found and explained the symbolism, as well as sharing selected epitaphs. Chet and Mary Jane went over the history of various tombstone ornamentation and styles and noted that from their studies, they could quickly determine which carver was responsible for the stones, simply by studying the styles. All in all, one of the most delightful evenings in many a moon.
