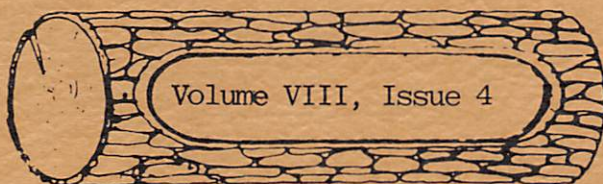

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This is my final report to you as out-going President of our Society on behalf of your Board of Directors. I'm proud to report on our stewardship during the past year.

In August of 1979, we had our annual planning session and adopted our goals for the year. Our activities and goals included the following:

1. Number 1 priority was to read and record all cemeteries in Saginaw County. Mission is approximately half completed. In September of 1979, Brant Cemetery was read and in June, 1980, St. Charles' Cemetery completed.
2. Second priority was to continue basic, advanced workshops. The Advanced was our largest ever with 37 persons in attendance.
3. The annual seminar attracted 165 persons this May. Evaluation sheets indicated members and guests pleased with quality of program and facilities.
4. Membership now at 194, a 13% increase over 1979. All-time high.
5. Purchase of bookplates for individual and group gifts to the Saginaw Public Library. Micro-filmed all city and county directories as a Society gift to the Library.
6. The Society continues to be in a strong financial position.

All of the above activities and goals were achieved because of the unselfish dedication of so many people.

I wish to thank publicly, all those who served in any capacity that made our year so successful and the Saginaw Public Libraries for their close cooperation.

I am grateful for the fellowship and new friends that this opportunity has afforded me. I shall always remember it.

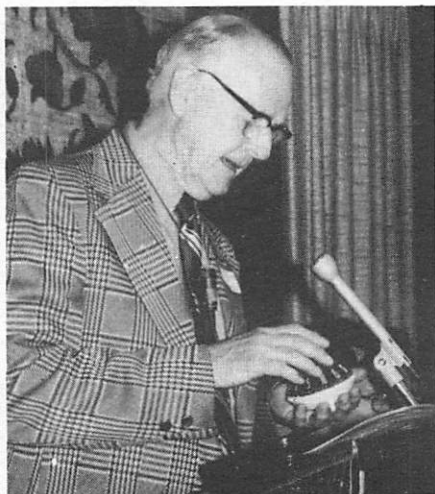

Morley Brothers were to furnish nails and spikes the ensuing year. Additional

Salary of S S ELLSWORTH, Foreman of Hose House #1 fixed at \$850 per year. John G OWEN, Lucia A OWEN, Addison P BREWER and Sarah S BREWER on 9 Apr 1874 executed deed to city conveying land to the city for opening and extending 1st st to river; council voted to accomplish this and to enter it on the city map. M L BURROUGHS asked for reduction of saloon license, no action taken.

Monday, 1 Jun 1874, p 64, ff

William WELLS and 9 others, residing on Charles St, asked for sidewalk between Washington Ave and Charles St; referred to committee. Benjamin PECK and 19 others asked for sidewalk on 6th St, from Washington to Wadsworth; referred to committee. John G EDELMANN, asked permission to deposit building material in front of Lot 7, block 88, Hoyt's plat; granted. L C WHITNEY and P McHALE said they had repaired their sidewalks on West side of Webster, between William and Millard, but the street commissioner refused to accept the repairs; referred to committee. James KENNEDY and 31 others, residents along Mackinaw st, between Center and Webster, complained of removal of dirt, stating it would be needed; tabled. Dr E FRENZ complained that he had been injured and his clothes damaged due to dilapidated condition of sidewalk in front of Germania school; asked that the walk be repaired, damage awarded him for pain and damaged clothing; referred to committee. Edward HARTIGAN and 25 others asked for removal of Albert BOHRINGER as poudmaster; referred to committee. Following appointments as firemen were recommended by George D WALCOTT, Chief Engineer: Hose Company #2, Franklin St, Foreman, A B BLOOMER; Members of Company: Alex. Simon COHEN, resident of the city for several years, complained that peddling license was too high, requested that it be reduced to \$50; his request was accompanied with petition signed by J SELIGMAN and 37 others; referred to a committee. W L WEBBER and H C POTTER, owners of property on Maple st, between Brewster St and another street, asked that Maple St be stumped, ditched and graded; referred to committee. Anton BECH and L SCHMIDT stated that in May 1873 certain property belonging to them was destroyed as being infected with small-pox and that they were needy and should be compensated for this property; referred to committee. Robert DUNLAP tendered his resignation as 2nd Asst Engr of fire dept. George A FLANDERS reported that Fred HUBERT had started the slaughtering of animals at the corner of Janes and 4th, creating nuisance and endangering the health of the neighborhood; referred to committee. William B SMITH, proprietor of Smith's Opera House had paid license fees of \$75 for 1872, 1873 and part of 1874, but that in 1871 the common council had fixed his fee at \$100 per annum but the council had taken no further action in the matter. William ZIEM's bid for lighting and taking care of the street lamps lately erected was the lowest; recommendation was received and filed. Isaiah DAVIDSON was low bidder for improvement of Genesee st, between Janes and Brewster; his bid was awarded the contract. Council decided to contract with John BROWN at \$15.50 per M for oak plank for Genesee St improvement or Thomas NESTOR at \$16.00 per M. L C WHITING (earlier given as WHITNEY) and P McHALE, whose sidewalk repairs were not accepted by the street commissioner, were given 60 days to make the necessary repairs. Mr & Mrs BLOEDON and Lawrence and Mena BEYERLEIN were residents on 14th st; it was desired to open 14th st from Johnson st to Wadsworth, council stated it was necessary that land be donated to city in order to extend any street. Complaints had been made that Mathias ROBLE on lot 5, block 74 had created a nuisance on his property; health officer was directed to visit and take steps to abate all nuisances found. Salary of John M WEAVER, groomsman of hose house #1 was fixed at \$750 for present year. Claim of A DRIGGS for damages sustained by a broken plank on a bridge at 4th and Janes, amounting to \$5.00 was presented.

We hereby Certify that the Congregation of Lutherans at Frankenlust in Saginaw County, State of Michigan, did on the 20th day of August A.D. 1852 assemble at the Meeting House where they stately meet for worship pursuant to public notice previously given at least 15 days according to law by Rev. F. Sievers, the minister of said Congregation, at the meeting house aforesaid and that being so assembled as aforesaid they did by a majority of their votes nominate the undersigned to preside at said Election. And thereupon by a plurality of votes elected the following persons as Trustees to take charge of the estate

and and property belonging to said Congregation and Society and to transact all affairs relative to the temporalities thereof, to wit - Johann Schmidt for three years, Albrecht Kuch for two years and Leonhard Hachtel for one year. That this Congregation so assembled did also determine that the said Trustees and their successors in Office should forever thereafter be known and called as follows: "Trustees of the Evangelical Lutheran St. Paul Congregation of Frankenlust."
