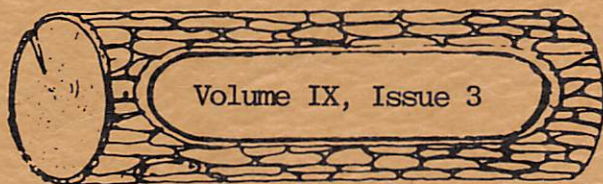


President's Message

NINTH ANNUAL SEMINAR SPEAKER ANNOUNCED

The Saginaw Genealogical Society is very proud and extremely pleased to announce that the speaker for the Ninth Annual Seminar will be Dr. Robert E. Ward, Ph. D, of Cleveland, Ohio. Dr. Ward is a direct descendant of French Huguenot and German stock and holds B. A., M.A., and Ph. D Degrees in German as well as a doctorate in law. He has taught German language and literature at various American colleges and universities from 1961 to 1973 and passed the Ohio Bar Examination in 1975, then began private law practice. Dr. Ward has served as editor of the *Journal of German-American Studies* since its inception in 1969; created and edited the *German-American Genealogist* and has served as an associate editor of the *Genealogical Journal* published in Utah.

Dr Ward is the author of numerous articles and books on German-American history, literature and culture, as well as genealogy. Some of his most recent articles include "Tracing Your German Ancestors," and the "City Directory: A Key to Family History," published in the magazine *Family History*; "Researching German Military Sources," and "German and German-American Genealogical Sources and Guides Since 1850," in the *Genealogical Journal*. His latest article on genealogical data on German guild records will appear in the next issue of the *Journal of German-American Studies*.

Dr. Ward served as the first president of the International Society for British Genealogy and Family History, the Society for German-American Studies. He is also a member of the Steuben Society of America and vice president of the Federation of German-American Societies of Greater Cleveland. He is also the donor of the extensive Ward Collection of Americana Germanica housed at the Western Reserve Historical Society, which contains periodicals, books and other items pertaining to German family history and genealogy. He is currently putting the finishing touches on a 1000-page book containing some 3000 biographical sketches of German-American authors.

THE PRESSES ARE RUNNING!

Yes, the presses are running and printing the *History of Frankenmuth*, compiled by T. J. Pollen about 1914. The Saginaw Genealogical Society is very happy to announce that this rare book has been retyped, an index compiled, a preface and list of illustrations added and a new title page and table of contents prepared and sent to the printers with a publication date of late April, 1981. This book, 5½ x 8½ inches in size, with hard cover, contains many recollections of Frankenmuth area events and history, collected by a man who lived in the area and knew many of the original settlers. Many of the events related in this book had been told to him by the participants in these events or by their descendants. The many facets of life in Frankenmuth are described, along with information on the Church in Frankenmuth, with which the evolution of the area was very closely intertwined. One of the most valuable sections in the *History of Frankenmuth* is that devoted to genealogy and biography. While the accuracy of the genealogical data may be open to some doubt, there is enough information to afford an insight into the families concerned. This book has long been out of print and the Saginaw Genealogical Society is proud to be able to make available a new printing of an old and rare book to a new generation of family historians. Many of the legends and facts given in this *History of Frankenmuth* can be found in no other volume of history and it is for that reason that we believe that this volume is so valuable to people of the Frankenmuth area, descendants of the early settlers or those who may have a connection or some interest in the nineteenth century history of Frankenmuth, a unique settlement in the then-wild area of Michigan. Coincidentally, this *History of Frankenmuth* is to be made available in time for the Society's Ninth Annual Seminar, to be held at the Bavarian Inn in Frankenmuth, April 25, 1981.

Programs in Review

Leland R. Watrous

Anna Mae Thompson was the featured speaker for our meeting of February 9, 1981. She gave details on the ancestor cards used at the Michigan State Library and passed out sample cards to be filled out. Ellen Haigh made available a display of the cards in the Eddy Room collection, compiled from the Ancestor Charts turned in by the membership, as well as the Ancestor Charts themselves, which are available for research in the library. The regular meeting of March 9, 1981 featured Mr Fel Brunett, the well-known archaeologist, who spoke on the use of copying machines to help in genealogy. He noted that the Xerox Company makes an archival bond paper for permanent copies and talked about the copy as a tool for genealogical records. Photos can be copied on the Xerox machines and on other types of machines, with fairly decent results. His recommendation is to copy directly from the photograph, not from another copy. He displayed a large map, which had been copied from the original and noted that he had used wallpaper paste to mount it to a large piece of cardboard, then used water color paint to tint areas for display purposes. Ambrotypes, an early type of photography, are merely a glass negative, mounted to a black background; the display case can be carefully taken apart and the glass negative used in an enlarger to make a very beautiful photographic print. Another fine thought was to draw up a family tree, have it printed at a local print shop, date the drawing and then pass it out to family members where it will become a cherished family heirloom.
