

Finally, with deserved pride in our past accomplishments, we will celebrate our Tenth Anniversary in September and will begin to look forward to many more years of continued service to Genealogy. Wednesday, August 25, 1869, p 1

Followup on earlier suicide: Emma Lightfoot, who committed suicide in this city last week, is the wife of the notorious Jim Lightfoot who was sentenced to state prison for 30 years.

p 4. Married-GROUT-BITHER-On the 23d of August 1869, at St John Church, in the city of Saginaw, by Rev. John Leach, Mr. Vallorous H. Grout to Miss Flora E. Bither, all of Saginaw. No cards.

Thursday, August 26, 1869, p 4

Died-NEWTON-in this city, on the 24th inst, Albert Read, only child of Edward S. & Amelia G. Newton, aged 19 weeks.

Friday, August 27, 1869, p 4

Died-ARNOLD-in this city on the 25th inst, Martha, wife of William Arnold, aged 72 years- funeral to take place on August 27.

Monday, August 30, 1869, p 1

According to the returns from towns and cities of this county received at the County Clerk's office, since October 1867, there have been 530 deaths in the county; 260 deaths between April 5 and December 31, 1868. Between October 1867 and August 1869, there were 1,327 births and 750 marriages.

p 4. Died-GUILD-on the eve of the 29th inst, at the residence of E. F. Guild, Z. Guild, aged 63 years.

Monday, September 6, 1869, p 1.

Drowned-A.R. Rose, colored, a whitewasher by profession, about 45 years of age, has wife and two children residing on 6th street...left home Wednesday morning.

Wednesday, September 8, 1869, p 1.

Barner, or Bernard Dermott of Carrollton, spending 30 days in Detroit House of Correction for habitual drunkenness, became ill and died there Monday morning.

p 4. Died-FERRIS, At St Louis, MO, August 25th of Typhoid fever, George W. Ferris, aged 34 years. George W. Ferris is the son of Alonzo Ferris of Jackson and brother of Heman B. Ferris of Saginaw; he resided in Flint.

Died. RILEY-in this city, September 8th (?), Alice, daughter of William and Elizabeth Riley, aged 1 year and four months.

Thursday, September 9, 1869, p 4.

Died-WALWORTH, on the 8th inst, at 3 o'clock pm at the residence of her daughter Wealthy FOX, Mrs. Mary Walworth, aged 93 years and 6 months; funeral at residence of Mrs. Wealthy Fox, at 10 am Friday.

Friday, September 10, 1869, p 1

On Tuesday, the body of a young man named DOYLE who had been missing since

Friday, was discovered floating in the river nearly opposite Paddock's dock, Bay City. Young Doyle was a nephew of Capt Cotton of the propeller *Pittsburgh* and had been employed on that vessel. A little boy, about nine years of age, son of the foreman of Shearer's Mill, was drowned on Monday evening near Bay City. Tuesday morning, the body of a man, 50 years of age, was found floating in a well on the corner of Third and Van Buren Streets, Bay City. It was taken out and found to be that of a Hollander by the name of Mulder or Van Horn. Mr & Mrs Newell Barnard of Saginaw City, were to give a reception the next Tuesday evening, the 14th inst, the occasion being their fifteenth wedding anniversary.

Some time last March, the death of Mr Carl FISHER, a teacher in the Germania School, occurred and he was buried in the cemetery.

p 4. Married-MAXWELL-O'BRIEN. At East Saginaw, September 7, 1869, by Rev. J. G. Cowles, Mr. John W. Maxwell to Miss Anna O'Brien, both of this city.

Died-WRIGHT-At East Saginaw, September 9th, Francis Wright, aged 39 years. Funeral to be held Saturday, September 11, 10 a.m.

Married-WITHAM-MINER-At the residence of the bride's father, in Bridgeport, August 28, 1869, by the Rev. A. E. Fuller, Mr. Edward M. Witham of Midland City to Miss Emma T. Miner of Bridgeport.

Monday, September 13, 1869, p 4

Died. MORLEY-On Saturday morning at 9 o'clock, September 11th, Sallie Morley, wife of Edward W. Morley, aged 26(?) years, 10 months and 2 days. Funeral at the house, Monday, at 12:30 p.m.

Tuesday, September 14, 1869, p 4

Died-ELLIS-Monday morning the 13th inst at 3 o'clock, Mrs. Marcia V. Ellis, daughter of Mrs. Matilda Chapin, aged 28 years. funeral to be held at the Baptist Church, Tuesday at 2 pm.

Wednesday, September 15, 1869, p 1.

Died-WEBBER-At Detroit, on Tuesday, September 14, 1869, Nick Webber, late of the firm of Nick Webber & Co., Stone Cutters at East Saginaw, aged 43 years.

Tuesday, September 21, 1869, p 1

Obituary. Died in this city on Saturday, September 18th, 1869, Cassius M. BUNDY, aged 20 years and 11 months.

Wednesday, September 22, 1869, p 1

Married-BRUSKE-FEIGE-Tuesday, September 21st by Rev Mr. Volz, at the bride's residence, Mr. Gustavus W. Bruske to Miss Caroline Feige. No cards.

EDDY-HALL-By Rev. J. G. W. Cowles, at the Congregational Church on Tuesday, September 21st, 1869, Selwyn Eddy to Cornelia Hall, both of this city.

Died-McPHERSON-At Carrollton on September 21st, Mrs. Helen McPherson, aged 70 years. Funeral will leave the house of Mr. James Ure for Bay City at 11 am this day.

Monday, September 27, 1869, p 1

An accident near Hemlock City-D. A. CONNELL was instantly killed by a tree falling on him while at work cutting logs for W. F. Glasby, between Hemlock City and St Louis in this county, one day last week. Deceased at one time printed the first newspaper ever published in Gratiot County.

Genealogical Experiences

S. O. S.
(Strayed or Stolen)

In August of 1979, Mr. Lenard Zorn of our Society, received a phone call which turned out to be a challenge to his ability as a researcher. It turned out to be a challenge to his wife, Ruth, as well. It seems that in the process of building a new home in the western part of Saginaw County, the person building the home found, to his amazement, a blue slate tombstone. The unusual thing about it was the inscription and date on it, which read:

Eunice, daughter of Mr. Stafford Horton and Mrs. Eunice, his wife, Died August 15, 1793, age 1 yr. 11 mo. 5. Where?

This is where Mr. Zorn put his many talents to work in cooperation with his wife. The only things they had to work with were the date and the material of which the stone was made. As 1793 was long before Michigan was settled and no slate known here, the place of burial as well as persons had to be found. First he and his wife checked Michigan Census. No Hortons were here before 1877; it was not of their family. Knowing that blue slate was used in New England, they commenced their search there. After diligent research and many letters written, the place of residence of Stafford and Eunice Horton was found. The grave of Stafford and Eunice is located in Carpenter Cemetery, Guilford, Vermont, as well as the graves of two sons. However, the place of the daughter, Eunice, was not found. After 1790, Mr. & Mrs. Horton moved over the line to New Hampshire. Further research found that said Horton was a Revolutionary War veteran, having served in Capt. David Stowell's company in 1777.

Through correspondence, the Zorns found that a new stone had been placed on the graves of the parents but the grave of Eunice remains unknown. There seems to be no interest being shown to have the stone returned so it will be deposited along with letters in the Saginaw Historical Museum.

This shows what a team of dedicated researchers can do with a piece of blue slate and a name and date. It is a tribute to their ability to put to use their knowledge of materials used and dates. As cemeteries have always been a challenge to Mr. Zorn, he was determined to find the source. He succeeded.

It shows that most of us, if we cannot find our material printed in a book or have some one send it to us, that we should not give up hope in tracing our ancestors. As Vermont is approximately 700 miles from Saginaw, the death in 1793, the material of the stone "Blue Slate", there is still hope that some where, some place, or some stone, will be found to fulfill our search.

This is written as a tribute to the research team of very dedicated genealogists Lenard and Ruth Zorn.

FORDNEY AVENUE BAPTIST CHURCH

formerly

Mackinaw Street Baptist Church

Our earliest history begins with the date of 1866, recorded by Rev. C. H.

(Fordney Ave. Baptist Church, continued)

Irvine, which begins "To write the history of any church is no small undertaking. To try to describe the wind, an earthquake, or flash of lightning seems easy in comparison to describing the spiritual history of a church." The actual history of the Macknaw Street Baptist Church commences many years before its actual organization. In the spring of 1866, a group of people living in this area, then called Salina, felt the need of Christian fellowship. They conceived the idea of securing the services of Rev. H. L. Morehouse, who was a pastor of the East Saginaw Baptist Church. He agreed to hold services on Sunday afternoons and the meetings were held in the Russell Hall. April 15, 1866 was the date of the first service and it was so encouraging that they resolved to organize a regular Baptist Church. On August 16, a meeting was held in the home of M. B. DeLand with Rev. Morehouse acting as moderator, and Mr. DeLand as clerk. Those having letters from regular Baptist Churches presented them. It was then resolved that such persons constituted a church to be known thereafter as The Baptist Church of Salina. For three years, Rev. Morehouse helped them. The people were very poor and there were many hardships to keep the church from progressing rapidly. It did increase in membership, even with the poverty of the church for a small fund was accumulated and laid aside for a building fund, and in a church letter to the association in 1875, it was stated that if the fund increased in the future as it had in the past, the church would be able in about 17 years to purchase a building or build a church suitable for their needs. In 1869, the Sunday School was organized with three teachers and 18 scholars.

Year by year, it grew in purpose and usefulness. In June of 1878, a new era of history began for the church. A lot with an old store building was offered to the church on terms they agreed to accept. It was purchased, giving their mortgage as part payment and fitted out for Sabbath School and church purposes. There was seating space for about one hundred persons and served for five years. In 1875, Rev. James Smith visited his father in East Saginaw and by invitation, he came to preach at Salina, continuing with meetings for two weeks. With the extreme poverty of the people, they managed to raise fifty dollars as a gift for Rev. Smith. The following June, he returned and held another series of meetings. The church membership grew and great blessings were felt. A few months later, Rev. Smith passed on to his reward on high. The Rev. J. L. Deland kindly offered to conduct services once each week on the Lord's day for an indefinite term. At the close of his services, it was advised to use all available funds to construct a church building. In April 1882, the present church edifice was started, which has stood nearly 100 years as a monument to earnest effort and self-denying labor of people who loved the Lord.

A parsonage was added in 1890. The years were filled with hard but loving work in the Lord's services. In 1908, with Rev. Walter A. Biss as pastor, the attendance increased to 250. In 1948, Rev. Spalding Wallace came and stayed for 13 years. In 1955, under his direction, quite a big remodeling program was completed. For some time afterwards, we were without a pastor. Guest speakers and laymen helped out so that with help from our own membership, Fordney Avenue Baptist Church continued to bring a message to South Saginaw.

Rev. Milton Walton and family came and stayed six years and the Fordney Avenue Baptist Church continues in service to the Lord.

HISTORICAL POINTS OF INTEREST

History of Calvary Baptist Church began in 1932. Mission of First Baptist Church was organized in 1940, known as the Ruckle Street Mission. This became the Calvary Baptist Church in 1952. The Fordney Avenue Baptist Church affiliated with Calvary when it was dissolved on May 30, 1979.
