## CHRONOLOGICAL HISTORY

## OF AREA NEWSPAPERS 1846 - 1957

February 5, 1846

The first newspaper in the Oregon Country began publication -- the Oregon Spectator of Oregon City.

June 30, 1860

Publication of Vancouver's first newspaper, the VANCOUVER CHRONICLE begun. L.E.V. Coon, editor.

April 25, 1861

H.G. Struve took over the publishing of the VANCOUVER CHRONICLE. Got into financial trouble and quit December 14, 1861. L.E.V. Coon the original publisher, abandoned the paper in March 1861: The ARGUS alleged Southern sympathy.

December 14, 1861

Urban E. Hicks took over the VANCOUVER CHRONICLE and changed its name to VANCOUVER TELEGRAPH. Publication ceased on May 2, 1862.

May 1862

The VANCOUVER TELEGRAPH newspaper is dead. Its equipment is offered for sale.

September 1865 \*

The VANCOUVER REGISTER began publication. (A microfilm copy of this newspaper from Vol 1, No 4, October 7, 1865 - 1869 is located at the Ft. Vancouver Regional Library).

March 1874

The VANCOUVER REGISTER resumed publication. Vancouver correspondent wrote "Most of our citizens are pleased."

July 1874

The VANCOUVER REGISTER was made the official organ for Cowlitz County as the Kalama BEACON had suspended publication.

September 4, 1875

First issue of the VANCOUVER INDEPENDENT. Editor, W. Byron Daniels.

March 1894

Reported that the LaCenter TRIBUNE, a weekly newspaper, had published "Vol 1, No 1" -- Vol 1, 4-4-94 "The LA CENTER TRIBUNE is a daily. Our old acquaintance, Charlie Herman, is putting in his best licks.

August 29, 1894

J.J. Peeson, publisher, and G.E. Beeson, local editor, jointly announced the sale of the VANCOUVER INDEPENDENT to E.F. Rands and Lloyd DuBois.



March 20, 1895

Reported from La Center that the Grangers were moving their goods to the store room of J. K. Gaither, while the TRIBUNE printing plant was moving upstairs there.

November 15, 1895

Lloyd DuBois and E.M. Rands dissolved partnership, Mr. DuBois taking over the sole ownership of the VANCCOVER INDEPENDENT.

September 8, 1897

The Eleventh annual session of the Washington State Press Assn. convened in Vancouver. At 3:30 the members were given a carriage ride to see the prune orchards and dryers. On the 10th they were the guests of the Regulator Line for a steamboat trip to Cascade Locks.

July 1898

The La Center TRIBUNE ceased publication. "Lack of Support."

March 1, 1906

Announced that a new county paper, the WASHOUGAL SUN, would begin publication on that date. Publisher, Kelley Lee.

January 20, 1908

The LA CAMAS POST was first issued. Editor, Kelley Loe. "La Camas has not had a paper for several years." There was an earlier paper THE TIMES.

October 19, 1908

The first issue of the VANCOUVER COLUMBIAN as a daily newspaper, the first in Clarke County.

February 25, 1909

Reported at Yacolt: A newspaper named the BULLETIN began publication. Clyde C. Hart, formerly with the COLUMBIAN, was owner and editor.

July 1910

The VANCCOVER INDEPENDENT was issued for the last time: it has been sold to Glenn N. Ranck, publisher of the VANCOUVER CHRONICLE, who took possession on August 2, 1910.

December 20, 1910

The special edition of the VANCOUVER DAILY COLUMBIAN of that date contains much valuable local information.

December 1916

John Miller Murphy, co-founder with L.E.V. Coon of the first Vancouver newspaper, THE VANCCOVER CHRONICLE in 1860, died at Olympia. He later founded and published for nearly fifty years the Washington Standard at Olympia.

September 1, 1918

George N. Hyland became owner and editor of the VANCCOVER COLUMBIAN, taking over from Elmer E. Beard, who had been editor for 14 years.

October 18, 1921

The VANCCOVER COLUMBIAN issued a 36-page special edition, which contains an excellent catalogue of business at that time in Vancouver and Clarke County.

April 14, 1928

The VANCOUVER COLUMBIAN began moving into new quarters at 10th and Broadway.

May 28, 1928

The VANCCUVER COLUMBIAN issued a 76-page "Progress Edition." It contained much local historical and then current information on industry, etc.

March 26, 1931

The VANCCUVER COLUMBIAN published a 20-page photogravure supplement which contains fine photographs of scenes in Vancouver and Clark County: also of leading personalities.

April 13, 1937

The VANCCUVER COLUMBIAN editorially announced that it was inaugurating the use of "Pictures by telegraph," the Associated Press wire picture service.

January 15, 1938

The three Portland dailies, the OREGONIAN, the NEWS-TELEGRAM, and the JOURNAL were closed down by a printers' strike.

August 6, 1938

The COLUMBIAN of Vancouver ceased publishing on Saturdays.

February 20, 1939

Herbert J. Campbell, publisher of the COLUMBIAN, was appointed by the new mayor of Vancouver, A. N. Stanley, to succeed John P. Kiggins, resigned, as chairman of the Fort Vancouver Restoration Committee.

August 21, 1939

The Portland NEWS-TELEGRAM suspended publication permanently, the Telegram was established in 1877 and combined with the Daily News in 1931.

May 29, 1941

Herbert Johnston Campbell, 58, publisher of the Vancouver COLUMBIAN for 20 years, died suddenly of a heart attack. He took over the COLUMBIAN on May 1, 1921.

August 30, 1947

The CLARK COUNTY SUN of Vancouver suspended publication permanently. It sold its subscription list to the COLUMBIAN. The Sun was founded in 1906.

April 18, 1950

The short-lived daily newspaper, the VANCOUVER TRIBUNE, began publication.

September 10, 1954

The CAMAS POST RECORD of Camas was hit by an early morning fire which did considerable damage.

November 3, 1954

Mrs. Ann Foyd Campbell turned over the first spadeful of earth inaugurating the construction of the new home of the Vancouver COLUMBIAN at West 8th and Grant Streets. Cost of the building, \$375,000.



August 22, 1955

The Vancouver COLUMBIAN opened for business at its new home, at 8th and Grant Streets, Vancouver.

November 2, 1955

The Vancouver COLUMBIAN for the first time used its newly installed "photo facsimile machine, plugged into 21,000 miles of leased wire," thus enabling it to illustrate the day's news with pictures taken the same day.

October 30, 1956

The Vancouver COLUMBIAN devoted much of its regular edition to lists of and detailed descriptions of the industries of Vancouver and Clark County. This is good for reference work.

September 26, 1957

The sale of the Camas POST-RECORD to Harold Zimmerman of Castle Rock was announced. The paper had been published under the name POST-RECCRD for 49 years and as the PCST prior to that.

Report from: "PROVENANCE, Newsletter of the Washington State Archives" Summer 1981

"In the last session of the Washington State Legislature a bill was submitted by Representative Shirley Galloway to open vital statistics records to genealogists. It was strongly supported by genealogical groups across the state, but nonetheless it was one of many bills which failed to pass.

The genealogists are a persistent group, however, and they have not given up. In a recent meeting with the State Registrar of Vital Records, the State Archivist and Rep. Galloway, the genealogists presented their concerns and won agreement from all interested parties that the indices to births, deaths and marriages should be microfilmed and that copies of the film should be placed in the State Archives and its regional depositories for public use.

Projects such as this take time to implement, but barring any unforeseen difficulties the indices should be available within the year. In addition to the microfilming project, a small group was formed to explore the possibilities of making other segments of the vital records more readily available to genealogists and other researchers."

"On July 1 the Washington State Division of Archives and Records Management was officially transferred from the Department of General Administration to the Office of the Secretary of State."

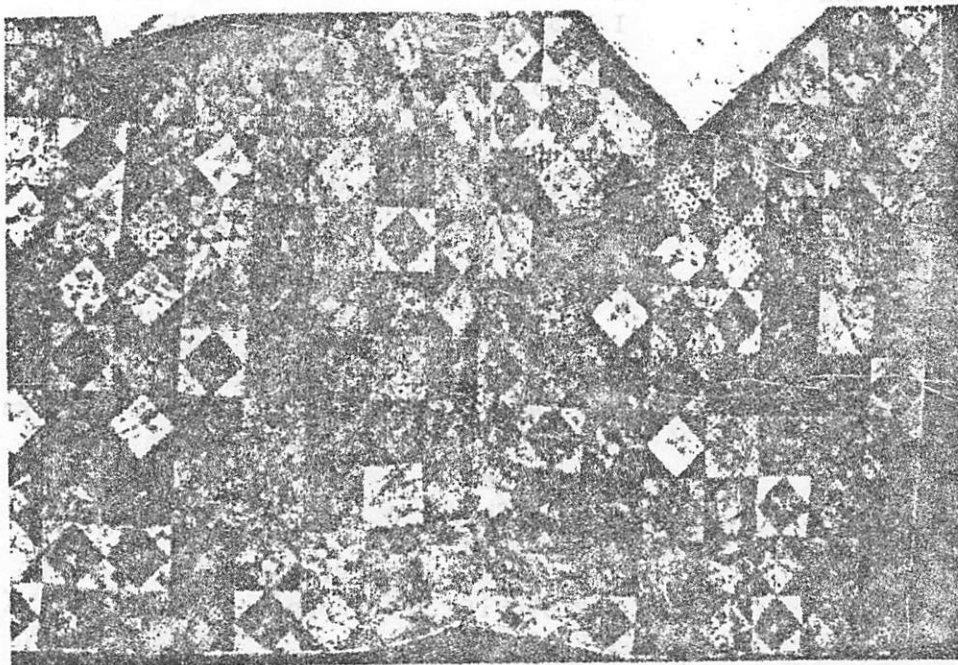

## FROM OLD SEWER RECORDS OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO

by Mildred Porter

I would like to dedicate this work to my niece, Vallerie Cartner, as she helped with the transcribing and can never see this in print. In appreciation to her and to others for their help I hope to have made this as interesting to our readers as it was for us when copying it.

These records were brought to me by my brother, Stanley McNeal, and as he and I believed they might be of interest to Genealogists and help to those who might have had people in San Diego County, California, we set about to copy and publish them.

They are from actual permits for sewer connections and were the only course, sometimes, of finding the old sewer lines first placed in the town of San Diego. The permits were for dwelling houses unless otherwise noted in [ ] brackets. This text was taken from Book 1 and 2, and runs from about the years of 1889 through 1900. In order to enable us to run this in an agreeable time limit, I have recorded the property owner, locations, and date of permit request, in the text, and am listing separately, more repetitious names from the permits.

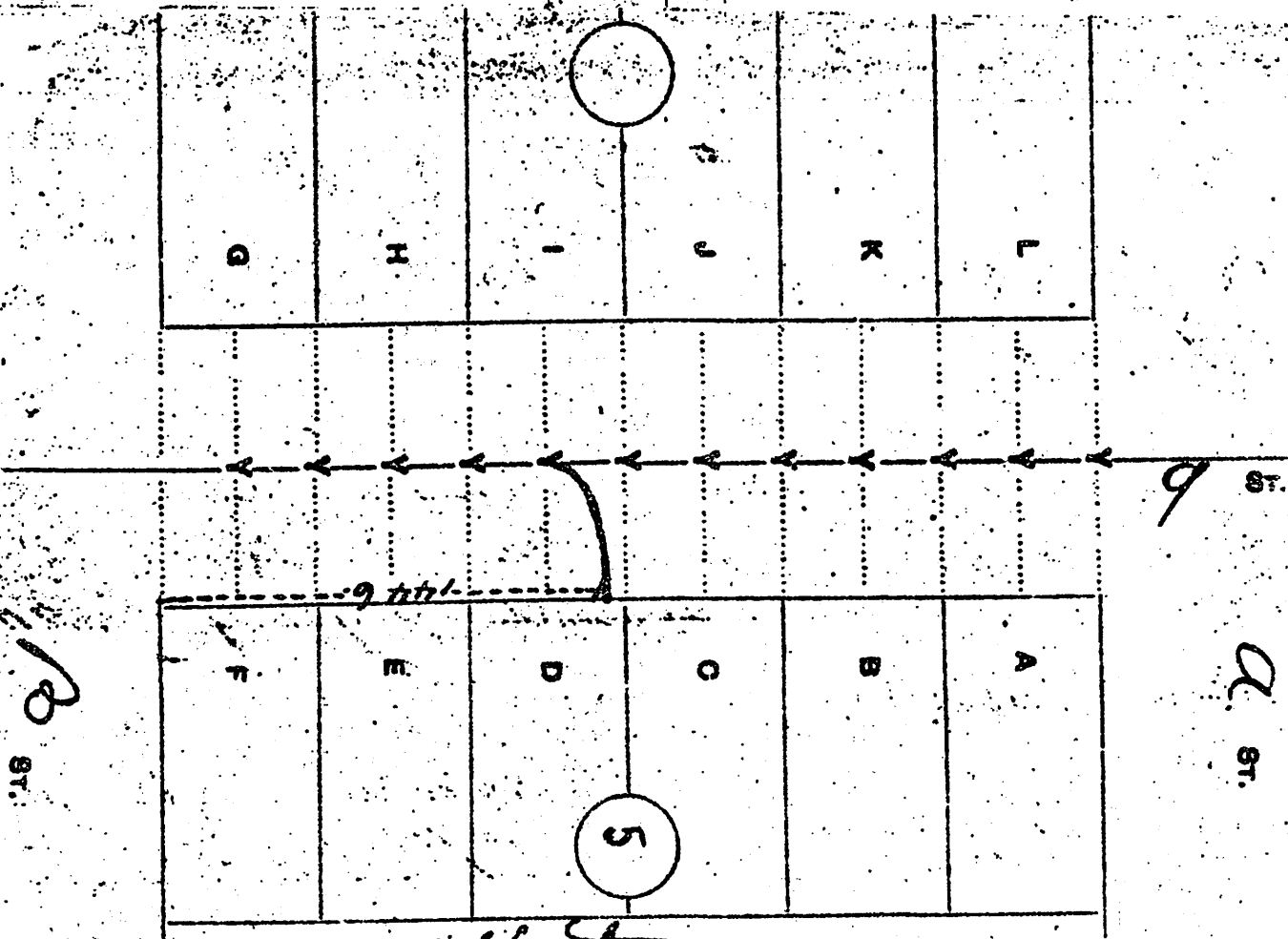

## LIBRARY UPDATE

Did you know . . . .

While glancing through a Vancouver City Directory I came across a listing for a "City Directory Library" located at the Greater Vancouver Chamber of Commerce. I called the Chamber of Commerce for further information and they assured me they did indeed have a directory library, including current directories for cities around the state as well as those for Oregon.

You may wish to check with your local Chamber of Commerce to see what they have available. This may be just the ticket for finding that elusive person you cannot find in the Telephone directories.

The results of our library survey are coming in and I'd like to share a few statistics with you. The six states that the membership has expressed the most interest in are Pennsylvania, New York, Ohio, Missouri, Illinois and Virginia. There is also strong interest in Indiana, Georgia, Michigan, Minnesota, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Washington and West Virginia.

Germany and Ireland are the leading foreign countries mentioned and they are followed closely by Canada, the combined Scandinavian countries and England.

"Everyone" has expressed a desire for more county histories on our library shelves. There is also a great deal of interest in Census, Passenger Lists, and the War and Pensions Records. (in that order)

The survey sheets will be very important to the Library Committee for future book buying. If you haven't already done so, be sure to return yours. We want to do our best to serve you.

Many publications give helpful information on Family Histories, Family Bible Records, Tax Rolls, Marriage Records, Naturalization Records, a name on a Census record - possibilities are endless. Study all Pedigree charts. You just never know when a 'number' (with name) could turn out to be a lead.

Very worthwhile scanning for anyone with the name MORGAN would be the ten issues of MORGAN MIGRATIONS from Texas presented to the CCGS Library by Francis Harris, encompassing the years 1979, 1980 and 1981. Thanks, Francis.

The Clark County Genealogical Society just made a recent exchange of TRAIL BREAKERS for three years of GENEALOGICAL GOLDMINE periodicals from Paradise, CA. They wished to have all the back issues published by CCGS before our exchange with them began. There is Volumes 6, 7 and 8, (four issues each) for the years 1973, 1974 and 1975. In each issue will be found information on a different State; a brief history, county records, Libraries and Societies, etc. The CCGS Library does not have the first five Volumes.

Bird, Isabella L. A Lady's Life in the Rocky Mountains. Sausalito, CA: Comstock Editions. 1960. Presented by Kitty Oman. Story of an English-woman crossing the Rockies on horseback in 1873, from letters written to her sister, originally published in 1878 as "Letters from the Rocky Mountains."

Church and Family Graveyards of Franklin County, Kentucky. Frankfort, KY: Kentucky Genealogical Society. 1976. Presented by Gloria Holverson. Over 100 graveyards have been read and recorded here. Indexed.

Clark County, Washington Blue Book, 1973-4. This is a comprehensive guide on all elective and appointive public offices, with names and addresses.

Clarke, Norman F. Logsleds to Snowmobiles, A Centennial History of Pine River, Minnesota, 1873-1973. Pine River, MN: Centennial Committee. 1979. Presented by June Rice Satre. "100 Years of Pine River" is a large book with history of the area and a chapter giving some data on about 300 families and many old photographs. Indexed.

Coe, Earl. Historical Highlights of Washington State. History of the state is told within the terms of office of the first fourteen governors up to 1950.

Compendium of History and Biography. Northern Minnesota. Chicago: George Ogle Publishers. 1902. Presented by June Rice Satre. This 1000 page book tells Minnesota history and biographies of about 1100 men.

Foster-Pettygrove Store Lists; Barlow Toll Road; History of Eagle Creek Community. Compiled by E. L Myers. Published by the Genealogical Forum of Portland, OR. 1972. Presented by Mr. and Mrs. John Finley. This contains a list of the first Americans to settle in Oregon; data about Samuel Barlow, Philip and Mary Foster, the Barlow road and toll gate, lists of students at Eagle Creek 1893-4-5.

Fritsch, William A. German Settlers and German Settlements in Indiana. Evansville, IN: Friends of Willard Library. 1979. Reprint from 1915. Presented by Marjorie Wilkes. Dr. Fritsch, believing that half the Indiana population was of German descent, wrote about early settlers, Germans in and after the Civil War, industry and pioneers. Indexed.

The Gopher Golden Jubilee. University of Minnesota. 1918. This 650 page book is full of photographs of students, faculty, and groups of the university in 1918.

Greene, Evarts Boutel. The Revolutionary Generation, 1763-1790. New York: Macmillan. 1943. Presented by Kitty Oman. This is a detailed history of American life of the period.



Hamilton, Edward P. The French and Indian Wars. New York: Doubleday. 1962.  
Presented by Kitty Oman.

The author, a historian with engineering background has been director of Fort Ticonderoga and has written an absorbing story of wilderness, forts, and weapons.

Johnson, Rebekah Baines. A Family Album. New York: McGraw-Hill. 1965. Presented by Kitty Oman.

This is a seven generation family tree of Lyndon Baines Johnson, done by his mother.

McDonald, Lucille. Washington's Yesterdays Before There Was A Territory, 1775-1853. Portland, OR: Binford & Mort.

A series of stories of the first white men and the struggle to found a territorial government. Illustrated.

Memorial and Biographical Record of Iowa. Two volumes. Chicago: Lewis Publishing Co. 1896; reproduced 1978, Pleasantville, Iowa: Merrill Anthony. Presented by: Rose Marie Jonas, Robert Rodgers, Doris Lewis, Maxine Inman, Irene French, Hazel Ketterling.

The two large volumes contain hundreds of biographical sketches from southern and central Iowa. The new index at the end of the second volume is more complete than the one starting volume one.

Schreiner-Yantis, Netti. Genealogical and Local History Books In Print. 3rd Edition. Springfield, VA: Genealogical Books In Print. 1981.

This 1000 page book lists general references, those on specific localities, and family genealogies, with vendor addresses.

Seattle Stake and North Seattle Stake Directory of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. 1959. Presented by Clifton Foreman.

Lists names and addresses of officers and members.

Stratton, Joanna L. Pioneer Women, Voices From the Kansas Frontier.

New York: Simon & Schuster. 1981. Presented by Kitty Oman.

An unusual story of the frontier comes from personal stories of 800 women who came to Kansas between 1854 and 1890. Indexed and illustrated.

Tetherow Wagon Train Constitution. 1845. Published by Willamette Valley Genealogical Society, Salem, OR. Presented by June Andrews.

In 1845 in Elizabethtown, Missouri, this constitution was adopted by a group of people who wanted to emigrate to Oregon. Included are names of heads of families with numbers of persons, wagons, certain supplies. Also given are names of cattle drivers and of armed men.

Upham, Warren. Minnesota Geographic Names; Their Origin and Historic Significance.

St. Paul: Minnesota Historical Society. 1920. Presented by June Rice Satre. 600 pages of names and historical background. Indexed.

Vancouver, Washington, City Directory. 1976. Presented by Clark County Historical Society.

Gives names, addresses, occupations of residents listed alphabetically, also by street and by telephone, plus buyers guide and business directory.
