

## FORT VANCOUVER SURVEY

### Letter from the War Department

Submitted by June Andrews, who is doing research on the Early Land Records of Clark County, Washington located at the Bureau of Land Management in Portland, Oregon. The Bureau is the repository of records for Oregon, Washington and Idaho. They cover a period approximately 1853 to 1923. This letter (a copy) was found among these records.

I have the honor to submit the following statement and recommendation respecting the U. S. Military Reservation at the Post of Fort Vancouver, Wash.

Territory.

The Post was established May 15, 1849 and was first designated Columbia
Barracks, Oregon Territory, the name was changed to Fort Vancouver July 13, 1853.

On the 1st of Oct. 1850, Brevet Colonel W. W. Loring, Lieutenant Colonel Regiment Mounted Rifleman commanding the 11th Military Dept. declared a military reservation at the post of above

miles square, map and description of which are herewith marked A and A 1.

To meet the provisions of the Act of Congress approved, Feb. 14, 1853 the reservation was reduced - under instructions of the Secretary of War to the commanding General Division of the Pacific, dated October 29, 1853 to an area of six hundred forty (640) acres. A map and description of the survey made in accordance with the Secretary's instructions, being forwarded to this Department by General Wool, commanding Dept of the Pacific in letter of March 15, 1854. The reservation as reduced was also announced via order from Post Headquarters aide Map and papers enclosed Mark B and B 1.

Another survey of the reservation was made in 1859 by officers of Engineers, under direction of General Harvey and plat thereof filed in the Engineers Dept. - copy of which is

enclosed mark C. It further appears that still another survey was made by officers of the General Land Office in 1860.

In 1874 a careful survey of the reserve was made by Leut. Ward, 1st Cavalry under direction of General Davis, the Department Commander and as the other surveys differ in some respect from each other, and from Leut. Ward's survey, the latter was after due consideration adopted by the Department, July 15, 1875 as establishing the boundaries of the reservation. Map and Description according to Lieut. Ward's survey are herewith, marked D and D 1.

It is respectfully recommended that the action here in recited be confirmed by the Executive and the existing reservation at Fort Vancouver according to the survey of Lieut. Ward, duly declared as set apart for military purposes to the end that Page 4.

proper note may be made in the General Land Office.

- Indiana County, Pennsylvania Map. Published by William Barker. Presented by Holly Goracke. This large map, about 1850, shows townships, communities, and names of pioneer farmers. Some town plans are enlarged and show building locations.

- Jaussi, Laureen Richardson and Gloria Duncan Chaston. Genealogical Records of Utah. Salt Lake City: Deseret Book Co. 1974. Presented by Holly Goracke. A Guide to genealogical sources in Utah, this book should be a real help to searchers.

Microfilm numbers for 4000 family group records are given as well as geographical and alphabetical listings of branches, wards, districts, and missions.
- Johnson, Alvin. <u>Pioneers' Progress</u>. University of Nebraska Press. 1960. An autobiography, he tells of Danish heritage, his father born in 1827 in Denmark, emigrating to Nebraska, where the author was born in 1874. An economist, a university professor, he also tells of war years. Indexed.
- Klickitat, Yakima, and Kittitas Counties, An Illustrated History, with an Outline of the Early History of the State of Washington. Yakima, WA: Yakima Valley Genealogical Society reprinted this 1904 book. Presented in honor of E. June Andrews, President of CCGS 1980-81. Four decades of history from exploration to fur trade to settlement with early roads and coming of the railroad give details about episodes, town, and people. The last half of this 941 page book is biographical concerning over 1000 men. Indexed.

### HOWARD BURRELL

Howard Burrell of Camas, Washington has made a 100-page genealogical record for his granddaughter, Dana. He had a small trunk filled with old family photographs from small tintypes to parlor photographs in ornate frames. The trunk also contained information on the family ancestry. Being an experienced amateur photographer, he made copy negatives so he could make phoptgraphs of uniform size. With typewritten labels he composed an 80-page album. He followed this with narrative stories of several family branches and a foldout chart to show how they all fit together. He indexed it all.

Lines go back to GEORGE BURRELL, born 1795, England, then Illinois; ABRAHAM BROWN, born 1806, lived in Iowa; JOHN BURK, in Iowa in the 1850s; THOMAS TUCKER, born 1810 in Kentucky; ANDREW ZUMWALT, who came to Maryland from Germany in 1737; HIRAM JACKSON, who crossed the plains in 1862 from Illinois to Drain, Oregon; MARTIN MILLER, who came to Lebanon, Oregon from Illinois by wagon train in 1862; GEORGE ZINSERLING, born 1851 in Germany; BARTHOLEMEW SCHECHLA, born 1847 in Prussia; JOSEPH KISMALSKI born 1849 in Poland.

Mr. Burrell loaned his compilation to the LDS Genealogical Library in Salt Lake City, and is now available there on microfilm.

### BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

John Killingsworth, who died at his home in Dayton, Washington, Jan 25, 1890, was born Nov 1, 1818, in Knox County, Tennessee. From 1843 to 1853, he lived in Greene County, Missouri, where he married his first wife, Miss Eliza Shields, who accompanied him to Lane County, Oregon, in 1853. Here he spent twenty-eight years of his life, during which time he lost the wife of his youth, and in 1875, he married Mrs. J. A. Nedry, who is left at an advanced age - a widow indeed - to mourn her loss.

In 1881, he moved to Whitman County, Washington Territory, and in 1884, made his last change, locating in Dayton.

In faith and life, a Christian from almost his youth, he has been a quiet, honorable, worthy man. Indeed, love and peace was his most marked characteristic. His only son, William Killingsworth, of Portland, informed the writer that he never saw his father exhibit violent temper in his life.

The aged couple had each three children by former marriages, all of whom remain worthy members of society, and tenderly attached to each other.

Funeral services were held at the Christian Church, and his remains were borne by the tender hands of his brethen and associate officers, with whom he has been active in Christian work for the past eight years. He rests in peace.

### JOHNSON LETTERS

These letters are continued from previous editions of the Trail Breaker. The spelling and punctuation are taken just as they are written in the originals.

(The following letter is without an envelope)

Oliver Ind Feb. 19, 1900

Dear Cousing Bert,

Will now try to answer your letter I recieved last Saturday, and was very glad to hear from you and to know that you want \_\_\_\_\_(this line is on the fold of the paper, now worn and unreadable) No I am not going to school any this winter on account of I don't like our teacher we came near having a scrap last winter and I thought I would not go any this year. You asked me who was my girl why didn't you tell me your girls name. mine is name Pitcher her father was killed by lightning last July the 29th day. I have been going with her some over three months and I like her all O.K. I have gone with her longer than I ever did a girl before in my life. Have you people got any Small Pox out where you are. we have had it out here and they still have it in Mt. Vernon. one of my cousins has had it but he is well now. I was vaccinated and did not take the Small Pox, but I sure had an awful sore arm. No I did not go to the Philipines, but I am going to the Regulars this fall and if I can't get in there then I am going to Oregon. Chas. Hayes has just returned home from Ore. he has purchased a farm of 90 acres out there. he got into trouble with a girl out here and she swore a kid to him, and he will have his trial the 26 of this month. That is pretty tough for a preacher isnt it. I was 18 years old the 5 day of this month. the day I was 18 years old I weighted 158 lbs. and am 5-9 high.

Mamma burned her hand this eve with hot water and she says it hurts her awful bad too. Say Bert you must have your picture made with your uniform on and send me one of them and when I get in the Army I will have some made and send you one or maby before I go. we have had one snow this year and it is just now going away Our folks are all well at present.

Well I will close hopeing to hear from you soon and often I remain your Cousin Bert Willis to Mr. Bert Hughes

I wishiyou success in your school studies, Good Bye From Bert to Bert.

Telephone No 78..Tenants secured for non-residents, rents collected and estates managed....I buy and sell farms. Northern Iowa leads in corn, oats, timothy, clover, hogs, cattle)

Augst 7th 1912.

Mr. James L. Johnson Manson Iowa

Dear Sir;

Your letter Rec'd Now Mr. Johnson I am telling you off very easy. When I only am asking you my expence of \$34.00 to(?) Ills(?). Now I will Tell you you have knocked me out of my commissions of selling this farm. I had a buyer for this place when you were carrying those contracts around, and even after they were

signed up I gave you 2 days. Just to be fare with you, the other man went away and went elsewhere. the farm has since been sold by other parties. and through your Backing out after a fare bargain had been made. I have only asked you for my Expences while I ought to ask you for the commission also which I have lost through you. Now pleas dont delay in this matter. If you wish to get out for \$34.00, If your son comes up pretty soon I can give him a good bargain on a farm to Rent but must act at once.

Weldon, Illinois Dec. 10, 1916

Jim: I recieved your letter of the 2nd inst. with notice of increase of apportion-ment enclosed and while I was very glad to hear for <u>you</u>, I certainly was sorely disappointed to learn that I am again to be bled for another \$100. It seems that it is utterly impossible for me to save enough money to keep up the expenses on that place. It certainly has been a sad business for me. Nothing but a place to spend my money and to get no returns.

Now Jim the law under which our Township High: School was operating has been declared unconstitutional by the supreme court of Ill. and I have not collected one cent of pay as yet this year. I have now \$16 in the bank to keep my family on until March and it may be that I shall be unable to collect it then. I think that you can plainly see my condition.

Now when our rent falls due on the 1st of Jan. you collect all of it, take out \$100 of my \$250 for yourself to repay you what you paid for me on the increased assessment, and keep the other \$150 until the 1st of March and if you will then pay our interest which is \$500 I shall send you the \$100 together with my half of the taxes as soon after the 1st of March as I can get it together. It it should so happen that I am beaten out of my salary, I shall try to borrow enough to repay you and ask you to sell the place jsut as soon as possible.

I received a bill last eve. from Renter for lumber etc for the door the darn fool bot a glass door for that old house. I shall not pay them before the 1st of March, if he gets the money before that he will probably let me know. Did you ever hear any more from your buyers for the place and if so what did they say about \$100 per A.?

I was glad to learn that you had a good crop of corn.

The producer is certainly in the swim now but the salaried man is about to starve to death and things look worse.

The great opportunity for the farmer is at hand while the war lasts.


