COPYING PICTURES

There are many reasons for wanting reproductions of pictorial materials: to increase or decrease size; to save wear and tear on the original; to preserve an image before the original becomes too faded or too dark to see; to obtain multiple copies for other people; to extract and reproduce a portion of the original (taking one person out of a group, or eliminating undesiragle portions of the original); to, if possible, improve the quality of the image.

First, let us recognize that there are two general types of pictorial material that we might want to reproduce. (1) Those that are called "line" and were originally made by drawing with a pen, pencil, or some device that produces the image in the form of lines. The Xerox type of reproducer is the easiest and usually the best method in those cases. Some such machines will enlarge or reduce. If it is desired to do this copying with camera and film it is necessary to use a high contrast film such as Kodalith to eliminate a gray tone in the background. (2) Continuous tone originals such as photographs, paintings, newspaper pictures etc., in which it is important to retain the tones and shades of the original, can best be reproduced by photographing the original with a camera and film.

Whereas this activity can be done in the home by anyone with a modicom of photography savvy, let this be understood: it is unlikly that satisfactory results can be obtained with a camera using smaller than 35mm film, with a non-focusing camera, with the Instamatic type of camera, with a straight-through or "optical viewfinder" type of camera, or with a camera that will not accommodate auxiliary lenses! That leaves the single-lens-reflex (SLR) camera. MOst SLR cameras will focus an object as close as eighteen inches to two feet. Unfortunately this is not close enough for most picture copying. The image on the negative is too small to permit the making of good prints. It is important to get close enough to the object (picture being copied) to fill up the film (negative) to insure satisfactory results. Most SLRs can be adapted to do this in three ways: (1) by the use of auxilliary or add-on close-up lenses. These come in strengths 1, 2, or 4 and enable the camera to be closer to the picture being copied and remain in focus. the use of "extension tubes" that are inserted between the camera body and the lens. This permits getting closer to the picture being copied. (3) By the use of a substitute close-focus lens. This is a more expensive, but generally more satisfactory method. The investment in an elevator type tripod with a tilt head will remove some of the headaches when trying to center on the object and a cable release will help in keeping the camera motionless when making what are sometimes relatively long exposures.

Now for the method: the writer uses a west window to supply the illumination for the picture taking. It should always be done when the sun is not shining through the window. The light from the sky gives the best illumination. Even on a cloudy day. Set the camera up so that it is aiming away from the window, into the room, and set the picture up so that the light from the window is falling evenly on it. A quite satisfactory way of supporting the picture being copied is to use a 12" x 12" cardboard box set on another somewhat larger box on a table. The picture is fastened in the center of the top box with double-stick tape. Usually a ½" piece will do. The camera is then placed in front of it with the center of the lens exactly at the height of the center of the picture and with the



to touch the edge of your negative.

plane of the camera being exactly perpendicular to the plane of the picture. Move the box with the attached picture closer to or further away from the camera to bring it into focus and to form an image that fills up the viewfinder. If the image is filling up the viewfinder an exposure can be determined by the built-in meter system in the camera. CAUTION #1: use a mid-range f stop such as 5.6 or 8 since most close-up lenses are not sharp to their outside edges. CAUTION #2: this will probably require you to use a slow shutter speed and therefore a cable release should be used. CAUTION #3: be sure that you are not casting a shadow on the picture. CAUTION #4: Commercial photo finishers crop a little bit from the sides, top, and bottom of the negative when printing. Therefore in copy making do not allow important parts Heads and arms are lost that way.

HINT #1: cover the pictureside of your movable box with a medium gray paper to help you get a correct exposure when your image is too small to fill the view-finder and draw corner to corner lines to help center your picture. HINT #2: Use Kodak Plus X film. It's fine grained and medium speed.

It is possible to extract portions of pictures. It takes some experimentation, and may prove very satisfactory. Cut a hole roughly the shape of the area you wish to extract in a piece of black heavy paper. The hole must be smaller than the area on the picture. Hold it between the camera lens and the picture so that the edges are out of focus. If you can devise a method to fasten it in place so that you can move your picture close to or farther away it is the best. It is likely this will require an increase in exposure. Another method is to use a piece of glass between the camera and picture. Smear vasloine, cold cream, or some translucent material liberally and unevenly on the glass except for a small area through which you will make the exposure. Again, experiment with distances. You viewfinder will show you what the results are. It is likely that with this system you need not alter the exposure.

Most commercial studios have become quite expert at making good photo copies. With retouching, airbrushing, and repeat copying techniques they can often improve a picture. If the picture you wish to copy is badly faded, is damaged, is spotted or is very fragile, it is likely that a few dollars spent having the professionals do it will prove very worthwhile. And it's kinder to your blood pressure!

Nichols would never have been on the place as you are. But that is past, he got on there some way and you say that he has us beat to a fairnwell and you ought to know. I couldn't do as much as you toward settling matters if I were there. We rented the place to Mr. Ritter and if you will do all that you can we will give him a square deal. If it is necessary to rent him a place you can do it far better than I. If we have to pay Nichols you could do it just as well as I. I wanted you to take a few hours off and go up to Pocahontas & have a talk with our lawyers which we have employed there. Of course Mr. Nichols & his lawyer would tell you what they did. But you know and anybody knows that we are in a partnership on that farm & any deal made with either of us in reguards to the farm both are fully responsible for. You should have informed them to the effect that you were into the deal whether you were known or not.

Our lawyers at Poca. are trying to make a settlement with Nichols & they would be glad to have a talk with one of us. But I can't possibly get away & besides I only have \$15 in the bank and am having all I can do to hold my school. It will mean a great deal to both of us if you will go up to Poca & have a talk with our lawyers. They have been waiting for the Lease which I sent you and asked you to take or sent it to them.

Hoping that we can work together on this deal I am as ever

your brother Roy

If there ever will come a time when we should stick to gether it is now. I agreed to rent the place to Mr. Ritter because you advised me to & I have taken your advise from the very first & have had all the confidence in you that one brother could possibly have in another. I bought the place with you because I believed in you & I can't believe that you will ever desert me entirely.

I received your letter today and was glad to hear from you but I am sorry to say that there is some missunderstanding in the last letter I wrote to you. I am

not satisfied with the abstract. Just as it was when I Send it back to you. I think if you will read my last letter over again you will learn that I asked you to bring the abstract up to date showing the ditch tax payed. and land tax payed and save me the recpt fore the intrest that will soon be due on the \$10,000 mortgage. I am satisfied with the abstract you send but I want it finished. I want the abstract to show that ditch tax is payed and that the land tax is payed showing everything payed except the \$10,000 mortgage which I assume and agree to pay. I think the best way would be if you would take the check fore \$1073.58 and go to Pocahontas to the courthouse and have the Auditor bring his book up to date so it will show that the ditch tax is payed and pay the land tax and then leave the abstract at Pocahontas and have those two statements added on the abstract. I think the county officers neglected to give you credit fore the ditch tax so that will have to be looked after and the sooner the better. I remember when I was a boy my uncle payed his land tax. and later on his neighbor told him his farm was for sail for tax. my uncle had a tax receipt but there was a mistake made some place Well I hope you will have no trouble to get this matter fixed up. and that it will be satisfactory to you as well as to my self.

The victim of the attack was left unconscious, with a fractured skull.

Sheriff Winegarden of Pocahontas came here and took De Vaul in custody.




