COPYING PICTURES

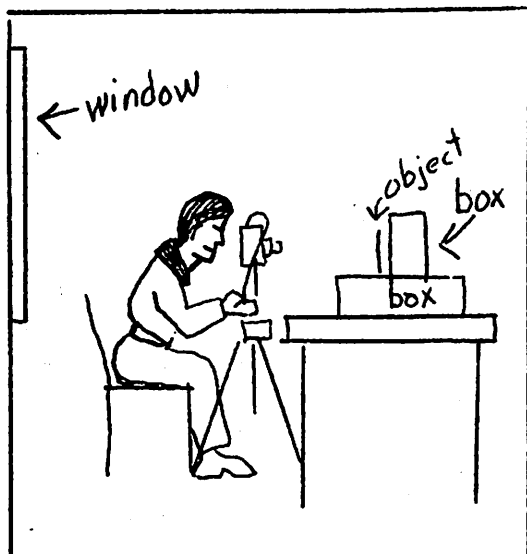

There are many reasons for wanting reproductions of pictorial materials: to increase or decrease size; to save wear and tear on the original; to preserve an image before the original becomes too faded or too dark to see; to obtain multiple copies for other people; to extract and reproduce a portion of the original (taking one person out of a group, or eliminating undesirable portions of the original); to, if possible, improve the quality of the image.

First, let us recognize that there are two general types of pictorial material that we might want to reproduce. (1) Those that are called "line" and were originally made by drawing with a pen, pencil, or some device that produces the image in the form of lines. The Xerox type of reproducer is the easiest and usually the best method in those cases. Some such machines will enlarge or reduce. If it is desired to do this copying with camera and film it is necessary to use a high contrast film such as Kodalith to eliminate a gray tone in the background. (2) Continuous tone originals such as photographs, paintings, newspaper pictures etc., in which it is important to retain the tones and shades of the original, can best be reproduced by photographing the original with a camera and film.

Whereas this activity can be done in the home by anyone with a modicum of photography savvy, let this be understood: it is unlikely that satisfactory results can be obtained with a camera using smaller than 35mm film, with a non-focusing camera, with the Instamatic type of camera, with a straight-through or "optical viewfinder" type of camera, or with a camera that will not accommodate auxiliary lenses! That leaves the single-lens-reflex (SLR) camera. Most SLR cameras will focus an object as close as eighteen inches to two feet. Unfortunately this is not close enough for most picture copying. The image on the negative is too small to permit the making of good prints. It is important to get close enough to the object (picture being copied) to fill up the film (negative) to insure satisfactory results. Most SLRs can be adapted to do this in three ways: (1) by the use of auxiliary or add-on close-up lenses. These come in strengths 1, 2, or 4 and enable the camera to be closer to the picture being copied and remain in focus. (2) By the use of "extension tubes" that are inserted between the camera body and the lens. This permits getting closer to the picture being copied. (3) By the use of a substitute close-focus lens. This is a more expensive, but generally more satisfactory method. The investment in an elevator type tripod with a tilt head will remove some of the headaches when trying to center on the object and a cable release will help in keeping the camera motionless when making what are sometimes relatively long exposures.

Now for the method: the writer uses a west window to supply the illumination for the picture taking. It should always be done when the sun is not shining through the window. The light from the sky gives the best illumination. Even on a cloudy day. Set the camera up so that it is aiming away from the window, into the room, and set the picture up so that the light from the window is falling evenly on it. A quite satisfactory way of supporting the picture being copied is to use a 12" x 12" cardboard box set on another somewhat larger box on a table. The picture is fastened in the center of the top box with double-stick tape. Usually a 1/2" piece will do. The camera is then placed in front of it with the center of the lens exactly at the height of the center of the picture and with the



plane of the camera being exactly perpendicular to the plane of the picture. Move the box with the attached picture closer to or further away from the camera to bring it into focus and to form an image that fills up the viewfinder. If the image is filling up the viewfinder an exposure can be determined by the built-in meter system in the camera.

CAUTION #1: use a mid-range f stop such as 5.6 or 8 since most close-up lenses are not sharp to their outside edges. CAUTION #2: this will probably require you to use a slow shutter speed and therefore a cable release should be used. CAUTION #3: be sure that you are not casting a shadow on the picture. CAUTION #4: Commercial photo finishers crop a little bit from the sides, top, and bottom of the negative when printing. Therefore in copy making do not allow important parts

to touch the edge of your negative. Heads and arms are lost that way.

HINT #1: cover the pictureside of your movable box with a medium gray paper to help you get a correct exposure when your image is too small to fill the viewfinder and draw corner to corner lines to help center your picture. HINT #2: Use Kodak Plus X film. It's fine grained and medium speed.

It is possible to extract portions of pictures. It takes some experimentation, and may prove very satisfactory. Cut a hole roughly the shape of the area you wish to extract in a piece of black heavy paper. The hole must be smaller than the area on the picture. Hold it between the camera lens and the picture so that the edges are out of focus. If you can devise a method to fasten it in place so that you can move your picture close to or farther away it is the best. It is likely this will require an increase in exposure. Another method is to use a piece of glass between the camera and picture. Smear vasoline, cold cream, or some translucent material liberally and unevenly on the glass except for a small area through which you will make the exposure. Again, experiment with distances. Your viewfinder will show you what the results are. It is likely that with this system you need not alter the exposure.

Most commercial studios have become quite expert at making good photo copies. With retouching, airbrushing, and repeat copying techniques they can often improve a picture. If the picture you wish to copy is badly faded, is damaged, is spotted or is very fragile, it is likely that a few dollars spent having the professionals do it will prove very worthwhile. And it's kinder to your blood pressure!

These new acquisitions will not be on loan while on the "new" shelf but can be used for reference when our library is open. Later they will be placed among others on the shelves. Some will continue to be reference only while others can be checked out by members for a two week period.

Barr, Theophilus Henderson. History of T. H. Barr and Family. Vertical file. The author's grandfathers were Thomas Barr of Burgetstown, PA and Hugh Patton. The author's father, Hugh Patton Barr, one of triplets, was reared by his grandfather when his mother died. They lived in Ohio. T. H. Barr was active in the Civil war. In later life he lived in Illinois. He died in 1908 at the age of 80. This family story was given to CCGS by Emil Barr of Vancouver, WA who is a grandson of the second Hugh Patton Barr of the story.

Benham, Jack. Ouray. Ouray, Co: Bear Creek Pub. Co. 1976. Presented by Evelyn Maloney. An illustrated history written by a mining geologist.

Books in Print 1980-81. New York: RR Bowker Co. Six big volumes have been given to CCGS by Robert Rodgers, listing available books new and old with full ordering information. Vols. I and II are indexed by author; III and IV by titles; V and VI by subject.

Burrell, Dana. Nine generation chart of her ancestry including surnames: Tucker, Brown, Zumwalt, Jackson, Miller, Zinserling, Schechla, Kommalski. Presented by Howard Burrell. Vertical file.

Chandler Connections. Presented by Judy Worthington. Lists Chandler names, marriages, some family history. Vertical File.

Compendium of American Genealogy. Standard Genealogical Encyclopedia of the First Families of America. Edited by Frederick Adams Virkus. Volume VI. 1937. Chicago: Institute of American Genealogy. Contains 8000 lineages. Contains a section on Immigrant Ancestors. Indexed.

Dieterle, Diane. Computerized Surname Magazine. December 1981. Atlanta, GA: Genealogical Center Library. Presented by Rose Marie Harshman. Essentially this is a book of queries because it includes dates, place, spouse name, with a code leading you to the seeker.

Everton, George B. Handy Book For Genealogists. 7th Edition. Logan, Utah: Everton Publishers. 1981. Organized by states, it has maps showing counties and lists sources with addresses. Revised, enlarged.

Family History of James Monroe Bailey and Sydonia Elizabeth Smith presented and compiled by C. Glenn Jorgenson. 1982. Both with heritage from Virginia, they were married in 1887 in Missouri, homesteaded in North Dakota, moved to Saskatchewan, California, Oregon.

Glatfelter, Charles H. Pastors and People, German Lutheran and Reformed Churches in the Pennsylvania Field, 1717-1793. Vol. II The History. Breinigsville, PA: Pennsylvania German Society. 1981. Illustrated and indexed.

History of Parsonfield, Maine. 1771-1888. Reprinted by Ancient Landmarks Society, Hampton, NH. Presented by E. June Andrews. Besides town history some personal sketches, genealogies, and portraits are included. Indexed.

Index to Westmoreland Co., PA Wills 1773-1896. Apollo, PA 15613: Bob and Mary Closson. 1979. Presented by Barbara Baker. Indexes 5600 wills giving volume, page, date.

Kentucky Families, Genealogies of. From the Register of the Kentucky Historical Society. Baltimore: Genealogical Pub. Co. 1981. Three volumes. Presented by Kitty Oman, Evelyn Maloney, Rose Marie Harshman, Shirley Rask, E. June Andrews, Jo Landers, Bess Prill, Evelyn Duvall, Mary Barnard, Margo Sanders. Volumes I and II contain alphabetical family genealogies excerpted from articles in the Register of the Kentucky Historical Society. Vol. III contains family history articles from the Filson Club History Quarterly. Each volume indexed.

Ketterling, Hazel. Descendants of Andrew and Johanna (Gimble) Moos. 1982. Presented by the compiler, one of our CCGS members! Andrew Moos, born in 1876 in South Russia, in 1902 married Johanna Gimble from Odessa. They came to North Dakota where they raised eleven children.

McDermott, William P. Dutchess County Historical Society Yearbook 1981. Poughkeepsie, NY. Besides historical articles on events of this New York county, this issue includes a cumulative index of issues from 1976 and a subject index for earlier years.

Missouri Census of 1840, Macon County. Riverside, CA 92509. 1977. Frances Nelson and Gwen Brouse. Historical introduction plus census. Indexed.

Missouri Historical Review. Nine issues from July 1978 to Apr. 1981. Columbia, MO: State Historical Society. July issue contains yearly index.

Nebraska, Douglas County Cemeteries. Greater Omaha Genealogical Society. 1981. Presented by E. June Andrews. A recording of all rural cemeteries in the county with a guide to all cemeteries in the county with historical notes.

Person, Dorothy Wooldridge. Leaves from a Family Tree. Presented by the author, 615 NW 78th St., Vancouver, WA 98665. 1978. Here's another fine book by a CCGS member! The family of William and Harriet Wooldridge made an arduous journey from Wisconsin to Oregon in 1856. This history concentrates on the Milton Wooldridge branch; he married Margaret Miller in 1884 in California. Well illustrated with interesting narrative.

Peterson, Jean. From Norway to North America; Olaf and Caroline Pederson. Six Generations in Canada and the USA. Peterson, Olson, Wegley, Curry, Braaten. 1981. Presented by the author, 2900 Brunswick St., Dubuque, IA 52001. She published an Erickson-Haagenstad book a year earlier. Olaf Pederson came

from Norway to Canada in 1869, lived in Saskatchewan and then North Dakota where he died in Cavalier Co. in 1924. Besides genealogical charts this book has narratives of old time memories and many pictures. Over 1000 names are indexed.

Reed, Paul L. The Andrew Zumwalt Family. Vol. I. The First Four Generations of Zumwalts in America. Baltimore: Deford Co. 1964. Presented by Howard Burrell, Camas. Andrew Zumwalt came from Rotterdam to Baltimore in 1737. He married Mary and (2) Ann Regina and had twelve children. Descendants moved to Kentucky, Missouri, and beyond. Illustrated, indexed.

Romer, Karl. Facts About Germany. Govt. of Federal Republic of German. 1979. Presented by Mrs. Floyd Prill. Contains charts, maps, illustrations and detailed information about Germany.

San Diego County California Census Index. 1900. Evelyn Jean White, Editor. 1981. Presented by Carlsbad Library and Genealogical Society. The index gives heads of households and other surnames with page numbers.

Dear Jim:-I received your letter with lease inclosed last eve. I am certainly

sorry Jim that we have things mussed like they are. I have always done everything that I could to make things go along. I have tried to rent the place the best that I could under the circumstances. Nichols would never have been on the place as you are. But that is past, he got on there some way and you say that he has us beat to a fairnwell and you ought to know. I couldn't do as much as you toward settling matters if I were there. We rented the place to Mr. Ritter and if you will do all that you can we will give him a square deal. If it is necessary to rent him a place you can do it far better than I. If we have to pay Nichols you could do it just as well as I. I wanted you to take a few hours off and go up to Pocahontas & have a talk with our lawyers which we have employed there. Of course Mr. Nichols & his lawyer would tell you what they did. But you know and anybody knows that we are in a partnership on that farm & any deal made with either of us in regards to the farm both are fully responsible for. You should have informed them to the effect that you were into the deal whether you were known or not.

Our lawyers at Poca. are trying to make a settlement with Nichols & they would be glad to have a talk with one of us. But I can't possibly get away & besides I only have \$15 in the bank and am having all I can do to hold my school. It will mean a great deal to both of us if you will go up to Poca & have a talk with our lawyers. They have been waiting for the lease which I sent you and asked you to take or sent it to them.

Hoping that we can work together on this deal I am as ever

If there ever will come a time when we should stick to gether it is now. Wright my name G. F. Schreyer.

and wat about that four thousand dollar seckond mortgage will it be allright if I take my wife to Varina and have the banker write it according to our contract or will my wife have to come to Manson. please have the tax and intrist uraxt [receipt?] fore me. And Obliged G. F. Schreyer

I received your letter today and was glad to hear from you but I am sorry to say that there is some missunderstanding in the last letter I wrote to you. I am

not satisfied with the abstract. Just as it was when I Send it back to you. I think if you will read my last letter over again you will learn that I asked you to bring the abstract up to date showing the ditch tax payed. and land tax payed and save me the recpt fore the intrest that will soon be due on the \$10,000 mortgage. I am satisfied with the abstract you send but I want it finished. I want the abstract to show that ditch tax is payed and that the land tax is payed showing everything payed except the \$10,000 mortgage which I assume and agree to pay. I think the best way would be if you would take the check fore \$1073.58 and go to Pocahontas to the courthouse and have the Auditor bring his book up to date so it will show that the ditch tax is payed and pay the land tax and then leave the abstract at Pocahontas and have those two statements added on the abstract. I think the county officers neglected to give you credit fore the ditch tax so that will have to be looked after and the sooner the better. I remember when I was a boy my uncle payed his land tax. and later on his neighbor told him his farm was for sail for tax. my uncle had a tax receipt but there was a mistake made some place Well I hope you will have no trouble to get this matter fixed up. and that it will be satisfactory to you as well as to my self.

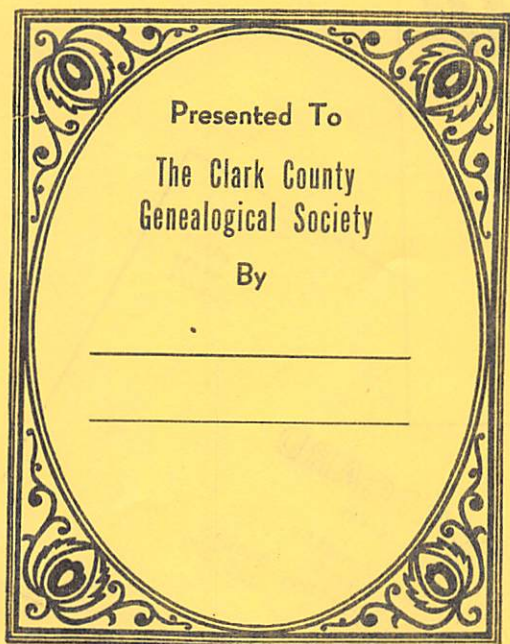

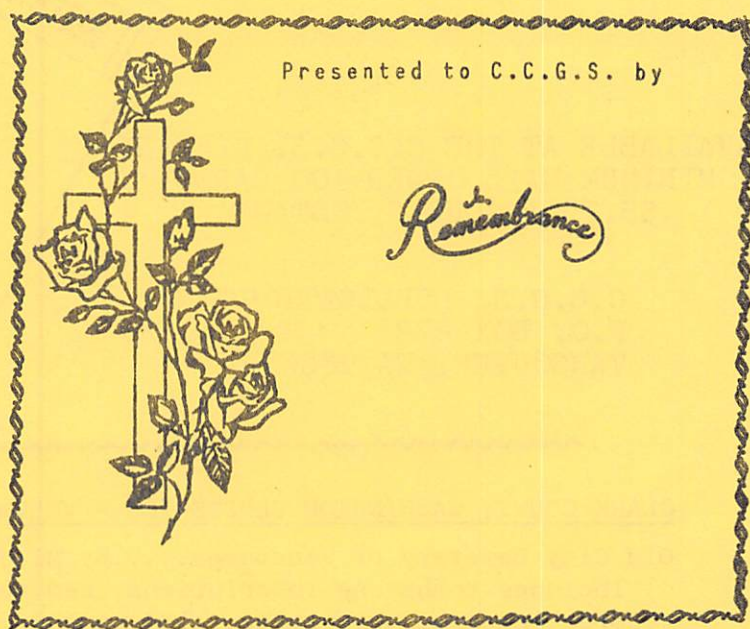


When donations are made to the Clark County Genealogical Society Library to be applied toward books, these book plates are used in each with the name of the donor(s).
