Barbie Baker Editor GUIDE TO GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH IN THE UNITED STATES



WASHINGTON

The records of Washington are available in various courthouses and in the Washington Archives. Some records have been published. The Genealogical Society of Utah has microfilmed some of the state and county records.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The first American settlement in the Washington area began in 1811 with the establishment of John Jacob Astor's Pacific Fur Company near the present city of Spokane; however, larger numbers of settlers did not begin arriving until the late 1830s and 1840s. Washington later became an individual territory in 1853 and was reduced to its present dimensions in 1889, when it became the 42nd state in the Union. Washington was primarily settled by former residents of Wisconsin, Minnesota, and other western states as well as newcomers from Canada and Europe.

VITAL STATISTICS

State vital registration of births and deaths began in July 1907, but some births have been recorded in various counties since statehood. Marriage records for Washington are available since 1 January 1968. Some death and marriage records were also kept on a county basis before 1907. For state registration of births, deaths, and marriages, write:

Since some counties kept vital records previous to state requirements, it may be helpful to consult The Handy Book for Genealogists, by Everton publishers, to find when a county was organized and when it began keeping vital records.

Divorce records form a part of the civil case files of the Superior Court, and summary data concerning divorces is found in the dockets and judgement books of those courts. These records are maintained by the county clerk. During the early years of the Washington Territory, divorces were granted only by an act of the territorial legislature. Divorces issued by act of the territorial legislature are on file in the State Archives. Since 1967, divorce decrees are also filed with the Vital Statistics Bureau of the State Department of Social and Health Services. Divorce records show names of parties affected, names and ages of children, date of divorce decrees, residences, occupations and the causes of divorce.

CHURCH RECORDS

Generally, church records in the state of Washington are kept by the individual churches. To find a church records, write to the local church or to the area Chamber of Commerce for church listings.

CENSUS RECORDS

United States census schedules for Washington Territory are available for 1850, 1860, 1870, and 1880. Census records are available on microfilm at the State Library and the Genealogical Department Library. The originals are at the National Archives in Washington, D.C.

Washington Territorial census records are also available at the State Library, both on film and in the original form. These records were collected by the territorial auditor, but compiled by the county assessors. These records are available for different counties.

PROBATE RECORDS

Probate files constitute a part of the Superior Court case records filed with the Clerk of the County Superior Court. Probate records establish relationship of family members and provide a record of the estate. Guardianships are part of the probate proceedings and list the names and ages of minor children. Court orders regarding wills should also be checked. Probate files for some counties are on file in the State Archives.

LAND RECORDS

Federal land records: Early settlers may have received grants from the United States Government, known as Donation Land Claims. These and other land grant records such as homestead filings may be searched through the Bureau of Land Management of the United States Department of the Interior. These records may provide names, date of birth, date and place of marriage, citizenship, record of migration, and other data.

Private Land Records: Once land was transferred from the government by sale or grant to private hands it may be sold again, inherited, lost by foreclosure of a mortgage or distributed through a divorce. These transactions are recorded by the county auditor in the form of deeds and mortgages.

WATER RIGHTS RECORDS

Water in Washington State is as important as land. Hence, water rights are as important a legal document as land deeds. Water rights applications, permits and certificates as issued by the State Department of Ecology are usually recorded with the county auditor. Water rights records issued by the state begin in 1917 and may be found either in the Department of Ecology or the State Archives. They show the same kinds of information, generally, as do land records.

COURT RECORDS

Superior Court case records other than probate and divorce are primarily of two kinds. civil and criminal. These records are in the custody of the County Clerk of the Superior Court. In some counties these records date back to the 1850s and were originally part of the District Court records. Superior Court case records from some counties have been transferred to the State Archives either in film or original form.

MILITARY RECORDS

Veterans of World War I and II could apply for a state bonus. These applications, and supporting papers, originally filed with the state auditor, are now deposited in the State Archives. They include residence, occupation, kinships, parents, age, place of birth, and enlistment. Also in the State Archives are the National Guard Statements of Service Cards for members who participated in the last two world wars. These cards show the name of servicemen, last residence, date enlisted and where, date and place of birth, years of service, military organization attachment, grade or rank, and engagements. All Washington State National Guard General and Special Orders and Circular letters are also on file in the Archives, but are not as easily referenced as the statements of service. Earlier military records of genealogical value in the State Archives relate to service in the Indian Wars, and include voucher records and muster rolls.

PERIODICALS Periodicals and more periodicals from the areas not yet represented on the Library Shelf will be the direction taken the coming year. Any suggestions? An endeavor will be made to obtain an exchange for "your" area.

Exchange Periodicals/Quarterlies/Bulletins received means the TRAIL BREAKERS gives a wide circulation to queries - a very good way of reaching other areas. Send in your queries! Take a look at the current exchange publications. Someone you are hunting for might be listed or have a query for you to answer. You will find Genealogical and Historical Societies helpful from the States and/or Counties your ancestors resided one, two or even three generations ago. Information found in periodicals will give border changes as well as the moving of county seats and capitals of the states and in what time period. Also listed could be births, deaths, cemetery records, etc.

City Directories are a valuable key to the family history. Details of where and how your ancestors lived may be contained in these directories. Note changes in street addresses, and note the calendar year in which the Directory was published. Not all the misspelling of names is typographical so explore all spellings.

Members' files of residents of the State Soldiers Home and the State Veterans Home also are available in the Archives up to the mid 1930s. These records are excellent sources and lead directly to service and veteran pension records on file in the National Archives. For these Military pension records send to Military Service Records, National Archives, Washington, D.C. 20408. Some of their indexes and records are also available on film in the Genealogical Library.

NATURALIZATION

Your ancestor may have filed a declaration of intention and a petition to become a naturalized citizen. For records before 1906, write to the county clerk. Records after 1906 are available through the Immigration and Naturalization Service at the nearest Federal Building.

NEWSPAPERS

Newspapers contain obituaries, descriptions of weddings, birth announcements, accounts of major events, and social items. Unfortunately, newspapers are hard to use without knowing the exact date of the event. The Washington State Library is in charge of the Washington State Newspaper Microfilm Project and maintains a complete file of newspapers on film. Many microfilmed copies of newspapers are available on interlibrary loan from the public library system.

PRAIRIE PIONEER CERTIFICATES

The Illinois State Genealogical Society is now offering Prairie Pioneer Certificates to those who qualify. Certificates will cost \$5.00 each and will be issued only after applicant has submitted proof of direct descent from that person for who the certificate is to be issued. Many of these pioneers have gone unnoticed in history, so this is a way to gather information about them. Eventually the information submitted will be published in book form. In addition to receiving a Prairie Pioneer Certificate, applicants will be helping to preserve the history of ancestral pioneer.

To qualify for a Prairie Pioneer Certificate, applicants must be a direct descendant of an ancestor who settled in Illinois prior to 1880. Certificates will be issued in three catagories; prior to statehood (December 3, 1818), 1819-1850, and 1851-1880. The applicant need not be a resident of Illinois, nor have ever lived in Illinois. Anyone may apply. The certificate will be mailed after eligibility has been determined. A separate certificate will be issued for each ancestor properly submitted.

The certificate features an outline of the State of Illinois with a drawing of a log and split rail fence. Also included in the drawing are the following state symbols; white oak tree, violets, white-tailed deer, cardinal bird, and monarch butterfly. A more detailed description appears with the certificate.
