DOWN THROUGH THE YEARS WITH CAPE HORN GRANGE #70

(1884 - 1965)

English fur traders in traveling the Columbia River met with rough water where a rocky wall jets out into the river reminding them of rounding the Horn. So they gave the name Cape Horn to the spot and the settlement that grew up in the vicinity bears the name. In that community Cape Horn Grange was born in April of 1884 in the log cabin of C. O. Hanlon. Twenty seven charter members were organized as Cape Horn Grange #194 under Oregon State Grange by deputy Yeomans. The twenty-seven were:

and: Peter and Mrs. Klinick; George Lsncraff; A. Rupkie; J. A. Hobchinson; P. McCarty; James and Bernard Haffey; Christian and Mrs. Christian Buslach; Wm. Floyd; Peter McCue; and fourteen year old Miss Maggie Hanlon.

These first members were enterprising, inspiring people when one looks back on their work. James Nevin the first Master was a tireless Grange builder. He was elected first State Lecturer when Washinton State Grange was organized and he served for six years. He then became a deputy. His daughter Eliza joined the grange in 1890 and was elected State L.A.S. in 1895. These two traveled together over the state organizing granges and boosting grange work for many years. Eliza lived to receive her Golden Sheaf and 60 year jewel and was present at the 70th anniversary celebration of Cape Horn Grange.

Irish James Walker, the first Overseer, and Pennsylvania Dutch, Mrs. Walker were parents of our late member Elmer Walker. R. H. Loomis first Lecturer, was related to our late Golden Sheaf member, Emery Stevenson.

The two Haffeys are relatives of the late Jack Haffey whom we all knew as Demoncratic Chairman. One was in the state legislature.

Mr. & Mrs. P. O. Breslin were the parents of our late member George Breslin a past County Commissioner. Mrs. Breslin was a tall, dignified, stately woman among the best dressed of her day, a very fitting choice for Ceres it would seem. They had a store at Cape Horn.

L. Wright, first Chaplain, owned what was later the Elliot place near Emery Stevenson's. His daughter married a Barrett and the place became known as the Barrett place.

C. O. Hanlon, first treasurer was father of Mary, first Pomona, and Maggie who became our first Golden Sheaf member. Mary became Mrs. James Haffey, and died in 1894 leaving three children who were lovingly brought up by Maggie and her father.

Dr. Candiano, first Secretary was reputedly an Italian of noble birth who doctored these early settlers. He built a factory on the flats and manufactured starch and syrup from potatoes. Possibly this became a moonshining enterprise. He later brought in a colony of Italians trades people. He moved away later and eventually practiced his profession in Portland, Oregon, where he served as Italian consulate for years. There was a rumor of a romance between him and Lillie Guenther an early influential granger, but it evidently came to nothing.

Christian Buslach's niece has been an active member of Mt. Pleasant Grange for years. Peter McCue was born in Ireland and lived in Pennsylvania before he came west with the Daugherty's. The Hanlon's, too, were from Pennsylvania and friends of the McCue's. So eventually both McCue's and Daugherty's joined Hanlon at Cape Horn. A McCue's girl married a Daugherty and their daughter Margaret Daugherty Shields.

The grange waved and waned in those days as now. At one period seven loyal members, among them Maggie Hanlon, paid the state Grange dues to keep Cape Horn Grange in good standing.

At Skamania in 1911, Sylvan Grange #474 was organized by Deputy Wing with 58 charter members. They were:

These people built the hall at Skamania in 1912 on land donated with donated labor. And in it they gave many dances and dinners to raise funds and provide community social life. For many years the school Halloween programs and Christmas programs were held in the Grange Hall with all the community gathered.

This Sylvan Grange, too, waxed and waned until both Cape Horn, which in the meantime had been numbered #70 by the Washington State Grange, and Sylvan were alive only by the determination of a handfull of fathfuls, Bro. Marble and Sister Covert and one or two others of Sylvan Grange who came out on many a meeting night when no quorum turned up.

Smith, Master in consideration of One and no/100 dollars, (\$1.00) paid to them by Cape Horn Grange #70 have bargained and sold all property of Sylvan Grange to the Cape Horn Grange...#70, their heirs and assigns. dated 9/11/31

Finally, in 1932 the two granges united, Sylvan surrended it's charter to take the name and number of Cape Horn Grange #70 and inherit it's valiant history. Rebirth came slowly. The first big class of candidates in April 1935. Much is due Sister Evie Covert who served as Secretary from 1936-46 until she went to Alabama. She contributed in a very large measure to the growth and prosperity of the grange in those years.

About 1936 another large class of candidates was taken in and degree teams from Fern Prairie Grange in Clark County exemplified the degrees, the first real degree teams and work done in the hall. This inspired the members to form degree teams of our own and Mae Scrugall and Will Scrugall of Fern Prairie gave generous and valuable assistance to Arch and Dorothy Sams who helped organize teams for all degrees which were soon active.

Shortly a fifth degree team was organized and has continued a yearly preformance with the exception of two years. It was not given in 1982 because it could be taken in Clark County and at State Grange that met in Vancouver that year.

In 1938, four years later, a Golden Sheaf was presented to Maggie Hanlon. In 1944 a 60 year jewel was presented to her. Earl Marble received his Golden Sheaf in 1948 and 60 year jewel in 1958. Emery Stevenson his Golden Sheaf in 1955. Cape Horn's silver star members were:



FALLEN LEAF LAKE/DEAD LAKE CEMETERY

From The Camas-Washougal Post Record Tuesday, October 18, 1983 - The article stated a Catholic Cemetery called Fallen Leaf Lake Cemetery, also known as Dead Lake Cemetery, in Camas, WA, has become overgrown with trees and brush and many graves have been removed and placed in other cemeteries, where they will be cared for. There are eight remaining graves and Father Ron Belisle of St. Thomas is trying to locate the next of kin of Joe Necretto (1868-1921), John Isaac Banfield, Avis Banfield, Joseph Rubens, Martin Marren (d. May 10, 1899), Maria Marren, Maggie Marren and Elizabeth Hood. He needs permission to move these graves to new homes, so the old cemetery can be closed. These eight people probably died before 1924 as the cemetery no longer took in burials after that time. It is on 1.7 acres donated to the Catholic church by the DeLeat family and has been run by the first Catholic church in Camas, origin 1870, and now in the hands of St. Thomas Catholic church.

LIBRARY UPDATE

USE THE LIBRARY!!! Although you may not always find definite information on your family in the Clark County Genealogical Society Library, there are other advantages to making frequent visits to the library. It is very possible to make acquaintance with other members who, by chance, may be researching the same surnames as you are. It is not at all uncommon in the library to overhear a conversation between two people whereupon they have discovered they have the same ancestors. With comparison of their records, they are able to be of great assistance to one another by exchanging information and sources. From my own personal experience I have, by accident, been the recipient of valuable information received by my contact with other members of our Society. A friend acquired through my activities in the Society was able to direct me to a member of my family whom I did not previously know. My friend called the relative with whom she was well acquainted, told the relative of my existence and that I was researching the family. This paved the way for my contact with the relative who was a complete stranger to me. I was joyous at the information I received--newspaper clippings, photographs, an old letter written by an elderly aunt, and the acquisition of a family history book. Take the time to visit often and settle down to browsing through the periodicals and books. You may not only receive helpful suggestions from other members who are occupied in the same manner but may make some lasting friendships! Turn in your pedigree charts to the Ancestor Chart chairman. When your chart is published in the Trail Breakers, who knows, you may find a relative who is also a member of Clark County Genealogical Society. I know, I did!

PERIODICALS!!! Don't give up on periodicals! For the areas of your ancestor researching go over the Table of Contents for Family Association NEWSLETTERS containing your surnames and carefully read the Book Reviews for published sources that could contain 'clues' for collateral relatives: neighbors, fellow church members, fellow immigrants, witnesses to legal documents, guardians and administrators. These possibilities are endless, especially for a 'new' found surname. Back issues of periodicals on the 'check-out' shelf could be very helpful.

WPA Indexes: One of the more ambitious programs of the late 1930's was an attempt by the Works Project Administration to index Vital Records. Indexes were compiled for three basic record groups, births, marriages and deaths. In addition in some states such records as marriage applications, voter's registers and the 1880 Federal Census were compiled. The time frame covered was generally from 1882 to 1920. As with many such compilations some are quite free of errors and others were less carefully done. An area not to be overlooked!

RESEARCHING SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS

The following article is by George I. Gird, from the Midwest Historical and Genealogical Register, Vol. 18 No. 1.

One set of records that may not have occurred to searchers to be of any genealogical value is the Social Security files. The Social Security Account Number (SSAN) is divided into three sets of figures. The three digits in the first group show the state where the number was issued ("Issued" not necessarily where the applicant was living at the time of application). The second group of numbers contains two digits, used to define people within that state. The third group, containing four digits, is a listing in numerical sequence, to determine the total number of applicants. An applicant listed where he was living when he applied; his date and place of birth; his father's name and his mother's maiden name. A call to the local Social Security office confirms that it is possible to obtain copies of the applications; they will outline the procedure for you. PETITION OR APPLICATION FOR PROBATE

by Mary S. Wilkins

Most of us are aware of the value of the probate package but in the last few years another document has been brought to my attention, the "petition or application for probate". This is probably the most valuable document, after the will, to be found at the county courthouse because the probate laws in most states required that this document include the names, ages, addresses and relationship to the deceased of all heirs whether mentioned in the will or not.

The Researchers Guide to American Genealogy by Val D. Greenwood, pages 227 and 245, puts it this way: "The will is ordinarily brought before the Court of proper jurisdiction to be probated by the filing of a written application or petition for probate. In more recent years, in the states which require them, these applications have proven to be invaluable genealogical documents as they must include names of all next-of-kin of the testator, relationship or degree of relationship to him (with ages of minors) and post office addresses".

If an individual dies intestate, the requirements are much the same: "No court can acquire jurisdiction unless there is proof of death. Probate proceedings are usually set in motion by a petition. . . . the amount of property. . . . and, in more recent years, the names and relationships of those persons who may be entitled to share in that property. . . ."

What a genealogical gold mine these applications for probate can be!

USEFUL GENEALOGICAL DEFINITIONS

CERTIFIED COPY - an exact copy of a Bible, tombstone, baptismal or other record that has been attested by a notary public, as being a correct copy.

HOLOGRAPHIC WILL - a will made in the handwritting of the testator.

NUNCUPATIVE WILL - an unwritten will, have been declared or dictated by the testator in his last sickness, before a sufficient number of witnesses, and afterwards reduced to writing.

A letter written by (May) Mary Sturgess to her sister, Mabel Sturgess, about 95 years ago.

Sunday, July 22, 1888 Kelso

Dear Mabel:

I recieved your letter this morning. I thought you was not going to answer it; it seemed a long time since I wrote you. It has rained here agood deal but for more than a week it has been very hot last Tuesday I thought I would melt most every afternoon and evening there is a nice breeze but that day it did not blow a bit and Clarence went to Vac that day to and I was so lonesome I guess it seemed warmer to; he was gone to nights and I and Sadie stayed a lone all the time I would have give a bitt to had you for company I got so lonesome I cryed and Sadie did not know what to make of it; he is going to Portland again in about a week I expect I will go crazy. I wish I had some of your garden truck it is hard to get here everybody have lovely gardens but dont sell any of it next year we will have one of our own if we all live to need garden's every thing grown fine here makes me anxious to have a garden I expect I will be planting it this winter I want you to save me some flower seeds any kind.

Well I said I would tell you about the town this time I dont know what to tell there are two stores the Post Office is in one the other one is quite large with a Hall over it yet there was a concert and Magic Lantern Show last night we did not go Clarence was to tired and Sadie was not well she was sick all night but is better to day. there are two Butcher shops a bakery and Candy and tobacco store together they do not bake their own bread but get it from Portland on the train I wish you children could see the trains you would like to watch them sometimes seven or eight in one day once I counted 38 cars in one train I like to watch them at first but have got tired of them now saw so many thetrack is about 3 blocks from the house the station is quite a little ways below thetown. I dont know how houses there are here there are 3 or 4 hundred people I suppose Parker has told you all about the Church it is on the hill back of our house the school house is just one block from us. they are talking of building a seminary here they have a good school here 75 scholars they had school this year from last September till a bout the middle of June I am going to ask dave to let you or Asa one come down and go to school next year it commences in September again Mr. Pratt that use to be down to La Center teaches he lives here. I wish you children were here we would climb on top of the big rock has Parker told you about it; it is just a block from us to, just by the school house it nearly covers a block and 50 ft. high. one side is nearly straight up and one side slopes so any one could climb up, there is a Hotel and another being built. how are you getting a long with your music you must practice lots to keep a head of Laura M dont let her beat and and play for Dave he likes to hear you so well you remember what he said that time to Muligan

I emigrated to the United States of America from Byron, Germany on the vessel Rein; my last foreign residence was Drochenan, Byron, Germany.
