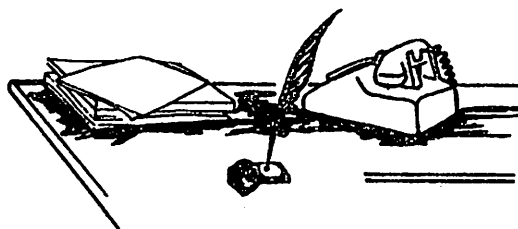

## THE SAGE OF CYRUS SHEPARD: HIS OREGON TRIP AND LIFE

Cyrus Shepard, son of Stephen and Prudence (Adams) Shepard, was born August 14, 1798 in Gerry (re-named Phillipston about 1814), Worcester County, Mass. His parents had moved from Acton, Mass. on May 16, 1798 with their family (all born in Acton):

Betsey born June 24, 1787.

Serina born October 29, 1788.

Stephen born February 4, 1793.

John born December 2, 1794.

Cyrus was described as a "tall, and fine looking, yet of a scrophalous tendency and feeble health." He was of a studious disposition and for several years had been a teacher in the Sabbath School at Lynn, Mass. He was "devoted to religion and a missionary at heart." His co-laborer, Susan Downing of Lynn, became his fiancée before Cyrus left for Oregon.

Jason Lee, a Methodist clergyman, was organizing a missionary expedition to carry the gospel to the Flathead Indians in Oregon. Cyrus became interested in the enterprise and joined the expedition.

In his last letter to his brother John before starting for the West written January 18, 1834 from Weston, MA on the outskirts of Cambridge, he says he shall be there another 5 or 6 weeks. "Please to present my hearty congratulations and best wishes to Sister Lucy," John having just married Lucy Addison the previous December. "When my things come you will have a chance at my library as I shall carry only a part of my books with me."

It is related that Cyrus visited brother John and family at the Phillipston farm home before leaving his 77 year old mother, Prudence. She was widowed less than three years earlier. In his diary (journal) Cyrus wrote on Tuesday the 4th of March 1834: "Took leave of my aged mother, brother and friends, the place of my birth and youthful sportiveness, the grave of my Father & all those scenes rendered sacred by the recollections of days gone by, and accompanied by my brother rode to Templeton to take a seat on the mail stage for Springfield on way to New York."

5th March - "Arrived City of NY where all is alive, all hurry and bustle - Had my luggage conveyed to the Philadelphia Steam-boat office & bespoke a passage to take place tomorrow morning at seven o'clock on the Steamer Independence."

7th March - "Loosed from the wharf at seven and arrived at Amboy at ½ past 9 o'clock a.m. Landed and took our seats in the railroad cars from Borden town distant 35 miles where we arrived in three hours. The cars are attached one to another and I think twelve in number propelled forward by the action of steam. Each one is capable of containing 6 persons." (A new experience on a regularly scheduled passenger train for which tickets were first sold in Baltimore May 24, 1830. This was Cyrus' first and only travel by rail.) "Left the cars at Bordentown and embarked on board the steamboat Burlington in the Delaware river & bound for Philadelphia where by the good Providence of God we arrived safely at ½ past 4 o'clock P.M. - Had my luggage carried to the stage office and bespoke passage to Pittsburgh in the Mail stage."



13 March - "Spent the day at Pittsburgh.....with my Brother." "Brother Stephen shows me all possible attention and truly acts the part of a kind and affectionate brother."

Friday March 14th 1834 - "Took leave of Brother's family after breakfast and accompanied him to the boat where we took leave and parted." "Went aboard the Planter lying at the wharf in the Monogahela."

16th March - "arrived at Cincinnati between seven & eight o'clock in the evening." Here Cyrus joined Jason Lee.

21st March - Left Cincinnati aboard the steamer Wyoming for Louisville.

26th March - "Have bespoken a passage in the Steamer Robert Fulton." This steamer did not leave that day, not until the next day.

Monday 31st March 1834 - "This morning found the boat lying at St. Louis."

Friday 4th April - "Left St. Louis at 10 o'clock in the steamboat Ioway for Independence." This was 300 to 400 miles up the Missouri River. Here the missionaries joined Capt. Nathaniel Wyeth's expedition to the Pacific Northwest. Naturalists Townsend (ornithologist) from Philadelphia and Nuttall, Harvard professor of botany, accompanied the group.

Cyrus was often ill on the trip. He wrote while at Independence: "Tuesday & Wednesday 15th & 16th April 1834. Very much unwell & weak in body, having for several days been sorely affected with bowel complaint, but now I trust, through the mercy of Jehovah getting better....."

Following the "Oregon Trail," the expedition crossed the northeast corner of present Kansas to near Fort Kearny on the south side of the Platte River (Nebraska), then up the North Fork of the Platte to Fort Laramie in present Wyoming, then over the Rocky Mountains. "The caravan consisted of 70 men and 250 horses, mules and cattle led by Capt. Wyeth, Milton Sublette, Captain Thing bringing up the rear."

One of Cyrus' letters was written from "Ham's Fork a branch of the Colorado June 22, 1834" (Green River a tributary of the Colorado). From there they reached the Snake River July 14th at Fort Hall near present Pocatello, Idaho, and September 1st Fort Walla Walla on the Columbia River. The missionaries arrived at Fort Vancouver, near present Portland, September 15th.

Cyrus' illness detained him at Fort Vancouver while the rest of the party inspected the lower Willamette Valley and chose a site for the mission on the east side of the river about 10 miles northwest of present Salem.

"Shepard began, on March 7, 1835, a remarkable career which was terminated by his untimely death on January 1, 1840. The history of his life during that five-year period is the history of the first Oregon Indian Mission School. Shepard was exceptionally qualified for his task and was undoubtedly the most successful and consecrated of all workers associated with Lee's missionary enterprise in Oregon..... The five years of service which Cyrus Shepard gave to the Indian Mission School entitle him to the distinction of being Oregon's first great teacher." Note: Quoted from "Jason Lee - Prophet of the New Oregon," by Cornelius J. Brosnan, published in 1932, by the McMillan Co., as are also some of following selected notes.)

Women were needed to make permanent the mission settlement. As a result Susan Dowling of Lynn, Mass., fiancée of Cyrus, sailed July 2, 1836 from Boston on the ship Hamilton with other reenforcements for the mission. The party stopped at the Sandwich Islands where Joseph Whitcomb joined it. The trip was resumed on the Diana to reach Astoria. It arrived at Fort Vancouver May 28, 1837 and was taken "by canoe and on horseback to the Willamette station. Cyrus and Susan were married at 11 o'clock Sunday services on July 16, 1837 at the mission." "Mrs. Shepard, a young woman of attractive appearance and pleasant disposition, was well satisfied with her life in the far west."

Cyrus was involved in establishing and building cattle herds purchased in California and brought to the mission, Cattle transactions in 1838 reported in the Quarterly of the Oregon Historical Society (vol. 21, p. 245, 1920) showed 20 head belonging jointly to David Lee and Cyrus Shepard.

So long as Cyrus Shepard had special care of the children, the school was successful. However, Shepard, never physically strong, was the victim of a scrofulous infection which necessitated the amputation of his leg. He did not long survive the operation. He died January 1, 1840. Cyrus Shepard was buried near the "Old Mission" but his remains were later moved to the Jason Lee cemetery lot in Salem.

The year following Cyrus' death, Jason Lee removed the mission center from its original site ("Old Mission") to Chemeheta, about ten miles south. Here it became the Indian Manual Labor Training School. After nearly a decade, it was absorbed by the "Oregon Institute" (Willamette University). Today the State Capitol grounds are located on the Old Indian Mission School land claim and across from the University. A plaque memorializing the Mission's final location is located near the University Library.

Cyrus' mother Prudence Shepard, died January 5, 1847 (aged 89y 5m 14d) at Phillipston, Mass. She had resided at her son's farm. Her grave is alongside that of husband Stephen who died in 1831. The graves are in the family burying ground lying at the far side of the farm pasture. Prudence's gravestone is of white marble, the lower half inscribed as a memorial to Cyrus Shepard.

A daughter was born to Cyrus and Susan Shepard on August 21, 1838, the first white child to survive in present Oregon. She was named Ann Maria Lee Shepard after Mrs. Ann Maria Pitman Lee who had recently died in childbirth.

The following is a list of white children born in Oregon from 1837-38. (not all these dates checked).

1. Alice Clarissa Whitman, born March 4, 1837 at Walilatpu and drowned in Walla Walla River June 22, 1838.
2. Jason Lee White, born July 1837 (1838?) and drowned in a second canoe accident at the age of 11 months.
3. Joseph Beers, son of the blacksmith at Lee Mission, born September 1837 (?) and still living in 1882, the oldest white native of Oregon.
4. Eliza Spaulding, born November 15, 1837 at Lapwi. Victim of massacre of Whitman family November 29, 1848.
5. Son of Jason Lee born June 5, 1838 who died soon after.
6. Anna Marie Lee Shepard born August 2, 1838.  
(also a son to Mr. and Mrs. Perkins at about the same time.)

A second daughter Alice Adams Shepard was born January 24, 1840, less than a month after Cyrus' death. Alice died November 16, 1904 without marrying, presumably in Eugene, Oregon.



Mr. Whitcomb, superintendent of the mission farms, married Cyrus' widow Susan. Because of his ill health they returned East in September 1842 with Cyrus' two daughters. He died soon after arrival. In June 1860 the daughter Anna married Rev. Josiah H. Newhall. Clara Susan Newhall was born May 23, 1863 in Augusta, Maine. Clara lived with her grandmother after the early death of both her parents. She went west to Eugene in 1892 with her aunt Alice and in November 23 married Alonzo Traxler who died in 1910. Clara died in Eugene June 20, 1957 at the age of 94. Several children survived her.

Following is quoted from letter to Oregon Historical Society, Sept. 7, 1959 from Sarah M. Hazeltine, member of Lynn (MA) Historical Society:

"On Locust Avenue in Pine Grove Cemetery, Lynn, Massachusetts is an old granite monument on the lot of Thomas Newhall. His son Thomas was born in 1830, the first white child born in Lynn." "On this same lot is a headstone for Ann Maria Lee Shepard, on which is noted that she was the first white child born in Oregon. Born in 1838 and died July 14, 1867 aged 28 years 11 months. She was the wife of Rev. Josiah Henry Newhall." "Pine Grove Cemetery is on Boston Street in Lynn."

Because of fear of possible fire loss of the Cyrus Shepard letters if they were kept together at the Phillipston farm, John's grandson divided the six letters amongst his one brother and three sisters with two remaining at the farm. The writer, John's great grandson, tried to gather them all for permanent safekeeping at the Library of Congress. Unfortunately mislaying single letters was a greater hazard actually than fire. So only the three letters spared were finally deposited at the Library. Of the list of Cyrus Shepard letters received by the Shepard family at Phillipston farm, letters 1, 2, and 5 were deposited at the Library of Congress; letter 4 was copied in part by the writer before it 'turned up missing.'

1. To "Dear Brother," from Weston, MA, Jan. 8, 1834, postage 10 cents.
2. To "Dearest earthly friends," from "Ham's Fork, a branch of the Colorado of the West," 3½ sheets to John Shepard, postage 23 cents.
3. To his brother John, Sept. 24, 1835.
4. To his brother John, Oct. 29, 1836.
5. To "Dear Mother, Brother & Sister" from the Mission house, Nov. 2, 1837.
6. To his mother, March 23, 1838.

Some correspondence of Cyrus Shepard was quoted in "The Missionary Teacher: A Memoir of Cyrus Shepard, embracing a brief sketch of the early history of the Oregon Mission," by Rev. Z. A. Mudge, 1848.

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Gerry Gilman has donated a handwritten copy of the Cyrus Shepard diary, which is now available at the C.C.G.S. Library. A typewritten copy of the diary will be available soon.

One interesting note: The Columbian newspaper recently ran an article telling about the first Japanese students at the Fort taught by Cyrus Shepard. Shepard mentions them briefly in his diary. "Wednesday 24th Sept. 1834 - Three Japanese who have been rescued from slavery among the Indians by Esq. (Dr.) McLaughlin have entered the school and are under my instruction. They fell into the hands of the Indians by being wrecked on the coast. The remainder of the crew perished."

**"UMPQUA PIONEER"****John H. Mires**

The subject of this biography, John Harris Mires, was born near Newark, Licking County, Ohio, 8 Jan. 1823. His father was Solomon C. Mires and his mother Mary Bates Mires, a relative of Edward Bates of Missouri.

The earliest of his ancestors of whom we have record were Peter Mires and his wife whose maiden name was Catharine Cought. They lived in Pennsylvania before the Revolutionary War. They were both of French Huguenot descent and both names, Mires and Cought, are French. Among their sons was one named Andrew Mires, born in 1766. He married Susanna Livingston, born in 1769. She was of a noted Colonial family.

Mary Bates Mires died in Feb. 1834 and Solomon C. Mires married Mrs. Slaughter (Mary Neel), a widow, Feb 15, 1835 and they had three children as follows:

All of the children of Solomon C. Mires were born in the same house on the old farm in Licking County, Ohio.

Solomon C. was a farmer all his life and his father and granfathers as far back as can be ascertained followed the same vacation. He moved from Virginia to Ohio in 1803 and lived there until he was a very old man when he moved to California where he died July 16, 1870. He was a man of robust constitution, about 5'11" in height, straight and athletic and of strong character. He served in the Indian Wars of those early days and fought under William Henry Harrison at the Battle of Tippecanoe.

John H. Mires was reared on the old Ohio farm until he was 21 years of age when he left home and struck out for himself. He worked on the Mississippi River steam-boating for six years - doing the hardest kind of work. For a portion of the time toward the last he acted as a pilot. He paid a visit to his hld home in the year



1850 and from there went to Iowa where his brother Sanford was living. There on March 27, 1851, he was married to Mrs. Flemming Byars whose maiden name was Anna Deardorff. She had been married to Mr. Byars Sep 13, 1838 and he died Mar 30, 1848.

On March 27, 1853, John H. Mires with his family consisting of his wife and four step-children: William H. Byars

Rebecca Frances Byars

Mary Catharine Byars

Elizabeth Barton Byars

and his one year old son, Austin Mires, b 11 Feb 1852, started from their home twelve miles west of Burlington, Iowa, for the Oregon Country. Together with them were Joe Isham, Sr. and a young man named James D. McFarland. They had two covered wagons with three yoke of oxen to each wagon, besides they had loaned one yoke of oxen to Uncle Joseph Deardorff, which he worked all the way across the plains.....

They also had one mare, Nell. Joe Isham drove one team and father, John H. Mires, the other while W. H. Byars, then a boy 14 years of age and James D. McFarland, near the same age drove the loose cattle, about 20 head. In driving the team, father Mires walked just about all the way across the plains. The journey took just about five months time and was beset by many hardships.

In our immediate train were the following families and people besides our own family already recited: Wm. H. B. Deardorff & wife Georgianna, Rube Roberts, Joe Isham, Jr., and Flemming Deardorff, son of Joseph Deardorff about 14 years old, one wagon, three yoke of oxen, about 15 head of loose cattle, one mare and a riding mule. Rube Roberts also had a mare and a dog. Uncle William Deardorff drove the team. He also loaned one yoke of oxen to his brother Joseph Deardorff.

Joseph M. Deardorff & wife Elizabeth, Mary Ann, William L. and Peter K. Deardorff, their children. One wagon, three yoke of oxen and one yoke of cows. Joseph Deardorff drove the team.

David Workman & wife Martha and Jackson Morton. One wagon, three yoke of oxen, two cows and a dog. Workman drove the team.

Christopher Sears & wife Rebecca, their children Emanuel Z., Susan and Sophrona. With them was a man named Levi Cline and Dr. David Reams. Dr. Reams left Sears at Grand Round and traveled with us from there on. Sears had two wagons, one drawn by 4 yoke of oxen and the other by two mares.

About five days after starting, the train was joined by Sanford Mires and wife Sophrona, their children: Lucinda, Ellen, Newland, Josephine, and Henry Mires. With them were a man and wife named Barker and James Pearson, an old Mississippi river pal of John H. Mires. They had two wagons, six yoke of oxen, two cows. These composed our regular emigrant train. Others fell in with us from time to time, traveled along for a while and then dropped out. At Raft River, Sanford Mires and Company left our train and took the road to California.

After reaching Oregon we lived the first fall and winter at the little village of Milwaukee, a few miles below Oregon City on the Willamette River. Here my brother Benton Mires was born 26 Sept. 1853.

There John H. Mires, our father, did all kinds of work - chopped wood, cut saw logs, made rails, built fences, helped load lumber on Coast vessels, dug potatoes and did many minor jobs. The stock was wintered by Dennis Harty near Amity in Yamhill County.

In June 1854 we moved south to Umpqua Valley, then Umpqua, now Douglas County and bought the squatters rights to our old home place near the foot of Tyee mountain and something over a mile from Calipovia (hard to make out) Creek from Bob Stewart, giving one wagon and two yoke of oxen as the purchase price. There the family resided in a little one room log cabin with dirt floor until they built a larger hewed log house during the fall of that year, after which the old cabin was used for a stable. Here four more children were born: Anna, Margaret, Addie & John Solomon Mires. There father & mother lived until father died 3 April 1888 at the age of 65 years.

The Mires men, as a rule, were tall, spare and athletic. Father, John H. Mires, was rather undersized. He was 5'7½" tall and his average weight was about 145 lbs. He stood and walked erect until he died. He had blue eyes, soft wavy black hair and a perfect Grecian nose & regular features. His hands were large for his size but his feet were small and he was light of bone. In later years, he always wore a full beard. In early manhood he had few superiors as a sprinter or wrestler and he possessed wonderful strength, his activity and physical endurance seemed without limit. In any kind of work he kept up his end with the largest and strongest of men. He was quick of temper, easy to provoke to a quarrel, deathless in his hate and constant in his friendship - and yet, when properly approached he was forgiving and merciful, and he had as kind and sympathetic a heart as ever throbbed in a human breast. He was a brave, industrious, venturesome and generous man. He was honest and sincere and a lover of home and country. He held the confidence and respect of his neighbors. No man ever regretted that John H. Mires was his friend. He would go to any length and dare any hazard for those in distress - and especially for those he loved.

For some unaccountable reason he received but meager schooling but he had a phenomenal memory and he took a deep and active interest in the education of others. He did all he was able toward the education of his four step-children and six other children and it cheered his good heart to see them advance.

He never sought nor held any office except that of road supervisor and district school director. These positions he always filled, when called upon, with ability, attention and satisfaction.

He was a pioneer of the best type. He bravely met, face to face, all the stern conditions of pioneer life and preformed his duties full and well. He helped to reclaim the Great Northwest. No greater victory has ever been won by any people. Humble though the sphere of life in which his lot was cast, he strove with honest purpose and played his part without shirking. Nothing better or higher can be pronounced of any man.....

His was a life of arduous toil from childhood to the grave, and he never received the reward of ease and convenience that his efforts deserved. His hands were calloused and scarred by toil, but as one of his old and life time neighbors said after looking upon them folded upon his silent breast there in his coffin - "they were honest hands". What a tribute -- what a eulogy.

Located - 1  $\frac{3}{4}$  miles N.E. of Amboy, on Vargas Road, Amboy, WA.  
Caretaker - Mary Campbell.
45. Chelatchie Cemetery Established 1892.  
Located 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  miles N.E. of Amboy on Highway 503, Amboy, WA.  
Caretaker - Mary Campbell.
46. Columbia Tie Road Cemetery  
Located - to the top of Columbia Tie Road, north of Amboy, WA, near the gate of Lake Merwin Campers Hideaway, on the right in grove of trees.

Grave located - end of dead end road that once was the Pacific Highway, LaCenter.

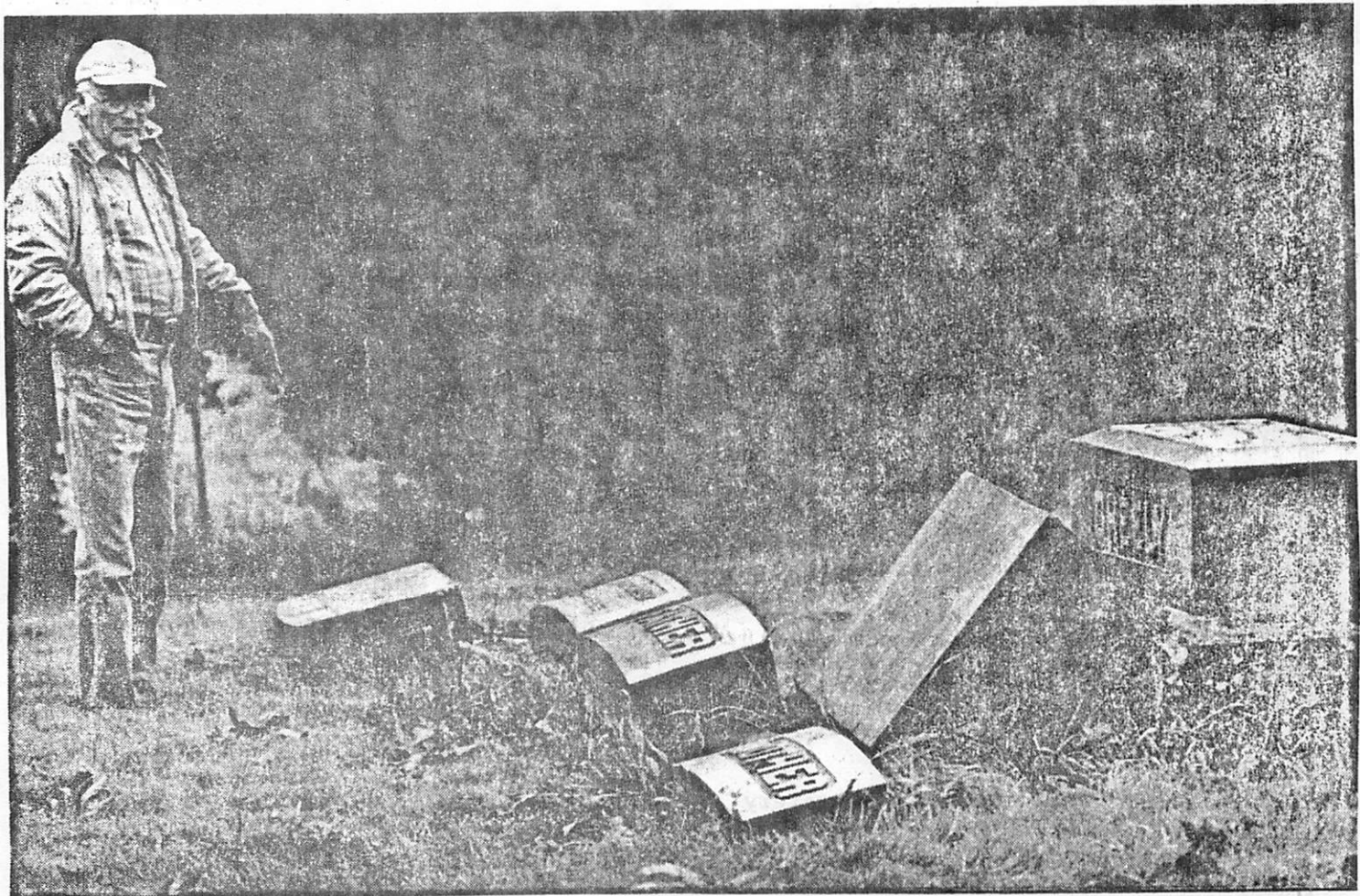

**DID YOU KNOW CEMETERIES ARE BEING VANDALIZED?** Cemeteries are an important part of our hertiage. Many cemeteries have been vandalized in recent months, tombstones were toppled over. Last October Pioneer Cemetery in Ridgefield, WA was severally damaged. Caretaker Melvin Anderson, reported there was only \$800.00 in the cemetery fund far short of what it would required to even begin restoration. Public awareness is urgently needed to prevent future desecration of our historic graveyards.

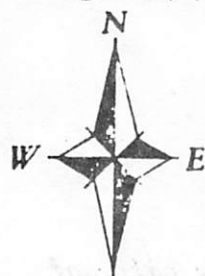


Al Ost, a resident of the Pioneer area for 40 years, identifies one of the desecrated tombstones as that of Charley Greely.

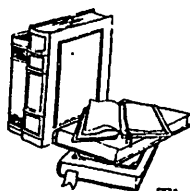
