

PROVIDENCE ACADEMY VANCOUVER, WASHINGTON

Gold dust and nuggets built the 90 year old monument to the first provincial, Mother Joseph.

She shouldn't have been wandering about the grounds of the Academy at ten-thirty in the evening. She knew this well, but she also knew there weren't going to be many such times left to her. Mother Joseph felt that her own evening of life wasn't far off, so she couldn't resist the temptation to scan again this building toward which she had marshalled all her talents and forces.

In a few minutes, from across the road, would come the nostalgic melody of Taps, settling the army personnel for the night in their barracks. The reverent cadence would bring peace to her heart. The moon with its cool blue light made the trees appear taller, more sure, while her most beloved of all buildings, first named "Providence of the Holy Angels," stood as the surest, tallest sentinel of all. Standing at the main gates, she gazed over the Academy building which was now a school for day and boarding students as well as a home for orphans. Adjacent was St. Joseph Hospital, taking care of the ill and needy. The academy and the hospital marked the central location of the Sisters of Charity in the West and fulfilled the request by Bishop Blanchet, in 1852, for works of mercy, charity and of the apostolate.

As her eyes wandered from window to window, the memories of great dreams and deeply buried sorrows passed through her mind. There were the seven temporary houses she'd built nearby on the Mission Compound in which to care for the helpless of all ages. These cottages were built from lumber donated by Colonel Wright from disused Hudson's Bay Company buildings. Then she thought of the work necessary to expand the gardens to produce more potatoes and vegetables.

Her heart warmed as she paused to appreciate the Academy grounds which too had been obtained under slow, observant and wary care. Since much of the land in and around Vancouver was disputed property, it was difficult to obtain. Acquiring the perfect tract of almost ten acres was played through with the thoroughness of a chess player's skill and concentration. The major part of the land had cost Mother Joseph \$325 for a Quit Claim Deed.

Undoubtedly, this sturdy, dynamic woman often thought of her father who had taught her all she knew of architecture and its sister arts. Every time she started new establishments, her abilities came into total use. When women did no such things, she broke trails and set a pace of outstanding achievement in so many different ways.

Architectural plans, fees, construction supervision, materials, lands - Mother Joseph of the Sacred Heart managed them all. Even money. There might not have been commercial banks along the Pacific Coast, but gold dust and nuggets served very well. Even while unrest and brutality stirred the tribes after the Indian Wars of 1855, Mother Joseph, or other sisters, took long rides by horseback and river boat to the

Idaho and Montana mines. The annals of the middle 1800's give this account of one of their money missions:

"As we were preparing to decamp, we heard the tramping of horses and saw a troupe of Indians in their war paint surround our caravan. When they recognized our pectoral crosses, they immediately gave sign of friendship and respect, so our fears were dispelled. We treated them to a meal, but cringed before scalping knives which they kept ready to carry off scalps of whatever Americans they would encounter. How happy we were to see them depart peaceably. God be praised!!"

Her thoughts passed on to the endless struggles with indebtedness, or forays into untravelled areas, reaching out to people anywhere who might be willing to help. Her sisters went two by two into logging camps as well as gold fields, ranging from Orofino, the Boise Basin and other Idaho strikes and into Montana. Later her emissaries reached deep into the Caribou country in British Columbia and came back with \$6.800.

Mother Joseph recalled that 1873 was the great year of her life in the West. Her plans for Providence Academy were completed. There were misgivings among some of the sisters for this venture, because after the other houses had been helped, there remained only \$11,500 to build the new school.

Little did the sisters know that the Academy, begun in 1873, was Mother Joseph's dearest dream, prayed for and worked for through the silent years. Divine Providence had guided her hand and footsteps through many difficult hours for other foundations in other places. This was but another commission and trust. It was slow work as department by department was transferred into the new home. Her spiritual family was under one roof, at last. It was bitterly depressing to have 100 orphans and looming debts.

The Taps interrupted her memories . . .

Mother Joseph died in January, 1902. At that time, 37 establishments had been founded on the West Coast. The last one she had hoped to build was Providence Hospital in Oakland, California, but this was left to her successor. A hundred years after her arrival, over 70 foundations extended from Alaska to Southern California.

Providence Academy, Vancouver, since its opening, lists 115 former students as sisters, living and deceased, in several religious communities. Three former grade school boys now serve as priests in the Archdiocese of Seattle. Over 900 high school graduates are listed as Alumnae members since the first formal graduation was held in 1896.

Several thousand students have been in attendance at various times, either as grade or high school pupils, since 1857 when the first charge, little Emily Lake, was given over to Mother Joseph by a destitute mother.

Far from the banks of the St. Lawrence River in Montreal, the seed of the apostolate planted by a dedicated nun on the river bank of the Columbia River, has spread and fulfilled her dream.

The following information was taken from the 1860 Census of Clark County, Washington: The first name listed, Esther Pariseau was Mother Joseph.

ANCESTORS

"Ancestors are found along with old furniture and captive skeltons in all our best regulated families. Ancestors consist of forefathers and foremothers, to say nothing of fore-uncles and aunts, who have done something grand and noble, like being beheaded by a king or having a relative who was governor of a colony. This enables them to be pointed at with pride by their descendants forever more.

Being an ancestor is one of the easiest and most attractive of jobs. It merely consists of being boasted by one's descendants. Thus many ancestors have been able to make good after they are dead. More than one ancestor who has gone out of this life a poor person, and only a few jumps ahead of the sheriff, has had the good fortune, a century later, to become the ancestor of some ambitious family with plenty of money and has become so famous in consequence that his tombstone has had to be greatly enlarged and improved.

Ancestors are one of the most valuable and satisfactory of possessions. They are non-taxable and cannot be stolen. Their upkeep is practically nothing, and they do not deteriorate with age and neglect. In fact, they increase in value as they grow older. An ancestor six hundred years old is worth a whole mass meeting of fifty-year-old ancestors. Adam is the oldest ancestor. He is six thousand years old, and had a fine record. But he is a common possession, like education and liberty, so he is not valued very highly.

Almost all rich people own and operate ancestors. But the poorest man may have them, too. Many a man who hasn't two vests to his name, and cannot hold a job two minutes, has ancestors which are the envy of his automobile neighbors. We cannot buy ancestors if we do not have them, but we can buy them for our children by marrying discreetly. A full set of fine imported ancestors can now be purchased for a million dollars. The great trouble with these imported goods is the fact that they are often badly infested with descendants. Some of the very finest ancestors have been almost ruined by these parasites, and there is no legal cure.

In England, everybody has ancestors. Some of them are over a thousand years old, and are still in a state of excellent preservation. The best American brand came over in the Mayflower about three hundred years ago.

We should be proud of our ancestors, but not out loud."

TO OBTAIN HOMESTEAD PAPERS

To obtain Homestead Papers, the legal description of the land which includes the township, range, section and legal subdivision must be provided when requesting copies of papers in the patent case files of the National Archives. This can be acquired from the recorder of the county in which the land is located. There may be a fee for this service. Send this legal description to the Bureau of Land Management for copies of the patent. There is a small charge. The addresses of the various district offices of the Bureau and the states they handle are below.

LIBRARY UPDATE

LAND RECORDS......Where do we obtain them?

First of all, land records are not the type of source which you will find filled with names, birth dates, birth places, names of parents, etc., that identify and set apart one person from all others. However, the existence of land records where there were few other records make them valuable far beyond what their ordinary content might suggest. Basically, the older the records the more genealogical data (especially concerning relationships) they contain.

Kinds of Land Records: Homestead Entry Files, Private Land Claims, Donation Land Entry Files, Military Bounty Land Records, Headright Grants, Local Land Records. These are the ones most familiar to most of us, but there are others.

I will not go into detail to define all of the above. The definitions may be found in genealogical research books. One book that is particularly informative and goes into definitions, relationships to be found in land records, etc. is "The Researcher's Guide to American Genealogy" by Val D. Greenwood. This book is on the shelves of both the Fort Vancouver Regional Library and the C.C.G.S. Library. It is an excellent research source for any phase of genealogical research.

The Bureau of Land Management (formerly known as the General Land Office) maintains film copies of the original federal land patents. These include homestead entries and donation land claims. You may contact them by mail or in person to obtain the Cash Entry Certificate No. or other entry, the description of the land, the date entry was made, so that you may request the file from the National Archives. You need to furnish the BLM Office with the following information: Name of individual who filed for title of land, the land office where the patent was filed, approximate date of filing, and the county where the land was located. Address in National Archives: General Services Administration, National Archives and Records Service, Washington, D.C. 20409, fee is \$5.00.

The Bureau of Land Management Office for Oregon and Washington is at 729 N.E. Oregon St., P.O. Box 2965, Portland, Oregon 97208. You may write or visit them in person for information. A fact sheet in the vertical file of the C.C.G.S. Library lists the addresses of eleven western states offices of BLM. Eastern states BLM office address is Bureau of Land Management, Eastern States Land Records, U.S. Dept. of the Interior, 350 So. Pickett St., Alexandria, VA 22304.

Military Bounty Land Records may be obtained from Military Service Branch (NNMS), National Archives and Records Service, 8th & Pennsylvania Ave, NW. Washington, D.C. 20408. Use NATF Form 80, fee of \$5.00. You may request a supply of NATF Form 80 by writing to Reference Services Branch (NNIR), National Archives & Records Service, 8th & Pennsylvania Ave, NW, Washington, DC 20408. They are free.

Contact the County Recorder in the county where your ancestor resided for local land records. These often contain names of relatives and usually the name of the man's wife.

Especially interesting to read and a book that will give you a clear picture of the public land process during the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries, is "Lure of the Land" by Everett Dick, available in both the Fort Vancouver Regional and C.C.G.S. Libraries.

The following is a news release from the San Francisco Public Library:

On April 18, 1906, an earthquake measuring 8.25 on the Richter Scale rocked San Francisco. The quake, lasting 48 seconds, and the subsequent fire, lasting three days and nights, caused tremendous property damage. The number of casualties, never completely tabulated, was in the hundreds.

To arrive at an accurate total for the number of dead, Mrs. Gladys Hansen, San Francisco City Archivist, has made a thorough search of all available records. Her total of 826 known dead far exceeds the official figure of 478 given by the 1907 Board of Supervisors. Yet even with her careful calculations, Mrs. Hansen believes the revised figure too low. She appeals to anyone having knowledge of any person killed in the 1906 disaster to write to her with whatever information they have. The names of the dead will be entered in the official roster in the Public Library, available to researchers of history and genealogy.

Why on some old maps is Clark County spelled Clarke County?

"Thereby hangs a tale.

Clark County was named after Capt. William Clark, of the Lewis and Clark expedition. He did not spell his name with an E.

The Oregon provisional government on June 27, 1844, created the District of Vancouver, embracing all territory west of the Rocky Mountains and north of the Columbia River to 54 degrees 40 minutes North latitude. On Dec. 22, 1845, the word "county" was substituted for "district".

The Oregon legislature in 1850 changed the name from Vancouver to Clarke, for some inexplicable reason adding an E. Nobody bothered to correct this error for about 75 years.

On Dec. 23, 1925, Washington Gov. Roland B. Hartley signed a bill dropping the E and changing the spelling to Clark County. At the same time, he signed a bill making it illegal to pluck rhododendrons from state lands, so don't do it anymore."
