HANDLING OF PHOTOGRAPHS - BASIC RULES

DON"T

- 1. Don't use pressure sensitive tape of any kind on or near photographs or negatives.
- 2. Don't use rubber cement to mount prints. It contains sulphur and will both stain and chemically attack.
- Don't use water absorbing glues and pastes such as white glue, library or wheat paste.
- 4. Don't mount on or store in plywood, masonite, or any composition board.
- 5. Don't store in wooden boxes or cabinets. The peroxide in wood will attack the emulsion.
- 6. Don't place newspaper clippings and photographs together in the same file. Newsprint is highly acidic, sulphuric and contains bleaches.
- 7. Don't use blotters not specifically made for photographic use.
- 8. Don't use any paper or cardboard that contains sulphur.
- 9. Don't use rubber bands around groups of prints, color slides, negatives, or to hold film on a reel.
- 10. Don't use paper clips. They will permanently imprint the emulsion, and they rust.
- 11. Don't touch the emulsion side of any print or negative. Touch only the edges. Human oils and perspiration are acidic.
- 12. Don't write on the back of photographs with ink--felt tipped, ball point, or fountain pens. Don't rubber stamp them. Inks are acidic and may contain sulphur.
- 13. Don't use glassine envelopes for negatives or prints. They deteriorate rapidly and may stick to the emulsion and trap gases inside. (Glassine is cellophane.)
- 14. Don't use Kraft paper envelopes or highly acidic paper printed with acidic ink.
- 15. Don't use white envelopes that contain bleach.
- 16. Don't store photographs flat in stacks or loosely in boxes. The weight may cause them to stick together. The lack of support in a box will cause curling.

DO

- 1. Use only acid and sulphur-free adhesives such as polyvinyl acetate, dry mount tissue.
- Use acid and sulphur-free mount boards.
- 3. Slide prints into acetate sleeves with a support sheet of acid-free lightweight board. The sleeve protects the print emulsion from fingerprints, dust and abrasion.
- 4. Store negatives and prints upright in acid-free folders in metal cabinets with a baked enamel finish. If repainted metal filing cabinets are used, do not put the negatives or prints in the drawers for at least a month after painting until all paint fumes have evaporated.
- 5. Use chemically inert envelopes for negatives made of acid-free bond, cellulose acetate, polyethylene (Mylar polyester film). Use only envelopes with side seams to ensure none of the adhesive will touch the emulsion. Insert the negative with the dull or emulsion side away from the seam side of the envelope.

- 6. Write on the back of photographic prints with a soft lead pencil, being careful not to press so hard as to imprint the emulsion side.
- (7. Mylar mounting corners are now available -- those, used on acid-free mounting board are probably one of the most desirable methods of arranging family photograph collections.)

TOWN/TOWNSHIP?

Have you ever puzzled about the location of a place which you cannot find on a state map? Some of us do not realize the significance of the township, commonly called "Town" in the eastern states.

In some states, including Oklahoma, a township has regular bounderies, 6 miles square, which serves only as the basis of land records and, although named, it has no local government. In many states, the township is a corporate unit and is the local governing body. It may have irregular bounderies, and may have more than one village, or none at all.

Townships are often used as division on census returns. This name was (in many areas, still is) used by local residents to designate the place where they live, were born or married. Confusion comes if there is a "Town" (Township) by the same name as a village located in another county. That village can be searched, and nothing found relating to your family, because you misunderstood "Town".

In New York, the Town Clerk is custodian of the Town Archives, Registers of Births, Deaths, Marriages. In Rhode Island, Connecticut, and Vermont, the Town Clerk is the Registrar of Deeds, and in Rhode Island he is the Clerk of the Probate Court.

If you have a place name in any state which you cannot find, write to the Historical Society of that state for any reference to a city, village, or township (past or present). Oklahoma Historical Society Library has a very useful atlas of townships: maps arranged by state. It is Atlas of the United States, by John L. Andriot, 1979.

Spurr, Executive Secretary, Board for Certification of Genealogists, 1307 New Hampshire Ave., N.W., Washington, DC 20036. Certified researchers are divided into three categories, namely genealogists, American lineage specialists, and genealogical record searchers.

Tip: It is important to note "of" and "in" in Scottish research: "of" denotes the owner, "in" is the tenant, e.g. John Smith of (place).
