From the Editor:

Many of us find summer the time to do the research which requires traveling away from our area. Traveling to other cities, other states - pouring over records in libraries and court houses (while the sun shines brightly outside); working as quickly as we can to utilize the short time we have there; visiting relatives with notepad in hand, jotting down information and "clues" that may lead to "great" discoveries later; tramping through cemeteries; driving through country roads looking for that certain plot of land where great grandpa had his farm.

Now with fall upon us, our time is spent mulling over the information we have gathered over our "vacation". Notes from our trip are often rewritten or typed and filed away as "evidence". Letters are written to new sources and our research of local libraries begins again, looking for information pertaining to our new-found clues.

There are a few "time-consuming" ways you can make yourself and your family research made known, using our own Trail Breakers or our library resources. But that time may prove very valuable! Following are a few of those ways:

Ancestor Charts - Submit ancestor charts (either in ink or typewritten) to Gloria Holverson. Gloria will type them in the appropriate format for the Trail Breakers, and they will appear as soon as possible.

Queries - Because our Trail Breakers is found in numerous genealogy libraries across the United States, do submit your queries; don't feel they must only pertain to those family members who settled in the Washington/Oregon area. Submit queries to Cathy Ward.

Bible Records - If you have an old family Bible, possibly it has pages listing family births, deaths, and marriages. Submitting those entries for publication in the Trail Breakers (to the attention of Jo Landers) may even bring inquiries about your family from other readers.

Locality File - This index of counties in states may help put others in touch with you, enabling you to share books or materials on a certain area. Also, this may prove to be of help when others are doing research in a certain area; they may run across your family names and make a note of the reference. (Likewise, you may be able to help them.) For instructions on how to fill out index cards for the file, see Volume XI, No. 3 of the Trail Breakers or check out the file next time you are in our library. Cards are to be submitted to Lori Okel.

Surname File - This index is of surnames being researched by members of the society. Included with the surname are first names, known vital information (years/states), and the name, address, and phone number of the member researching this family. See Volume IX, No. 1 of the Trail Breakers for instructions on how cards are to be filled out, or you may wish to check at the library next time you are there. Submit these cards to Lori Okel.

Make you and your families known to other members of the society - and to readers of the Trail Breakers!

WAGON TRAIN TO WASHINGTON TERRITORY

Recently, while browsing among very old genealogical publications in the local library, I came across a query from a lady in Washington state, stating she was descended from James Biles and his wife, Nancy M. Biles, who came to Washington Territory in 1853, and asking for information on the parents and family of Nancy M. Biles. The query reminded me of a list of names which might be of interest to family researchers, as well as the very interesting story of the first wagon train through the Naches Pass of the Cascade Mountains into the Washington Territory.

The hardships endured by the pioneers in the wagon train are recounted in The Busy Life of Eighty-Five Years by Ezra Meeker (Indianapolis: Press Wm. B. Burford, 1916), and Ox-Team Days on the Oregon Trail, by Ezra Meeker with Professor Howard R. Driggs, University of Utah. The story is too long for our purpose, here, and the names of the pioneers are our primary interest.

Nancy M. Biles, incidentally, was Nancy Merry Carter, daughter of James and Susannah (Dickey) Carter. James Carter was born in Bedford County, Virginia, in 1776 and Susannah Dickey was born in North Carolina in 1788. They married, 1803, in Davidson County (Nashville), Tennessee, and settled in Henry County, Tennessee, in 1822. (See The Colonial Genealogist, IV:2:72-80, "Carter of Lancaster County, Virginia, and of Tennessee".) Nancy M. Carter married, first, George Wiley Biles and, after his death, she married his cousin, James Biles, a Presbyterian minister, who was a principal leader of this wagon train in 1853.

Early in the spring of 1853, a company gathered together from Indiana, Illinois, and Missouri to form a wagon train headed for the Willamette Valley in the Washington Territory. Somewhere on the Platte River, the company was joined by a group from Kentucky. James Biles was a leader of the train and Nelson Sargent acted as guide. Enduring extreme hardships, the wagon train made it through the Cascade Mountains in wintertime conditions--the first wagon train through the Naches Pass--having crossed the Yakima River eight times and the Naches River sixty-eight times, as well as the turbulent White River and the Columbia. For the last 50 miles there was not a blade of grass for their animals. When the bedraggled pioneers came out of the mountains, the people in the Willamette Valley were astonished, as there was no road through the mountains. The pioneers had literally to cut their way, at times, through sagebrush as high as a covered wagon and, at others, through the timber. They descended Mud Mountain in a drenching rain. Settlers in the valley could hardly believe their eyes. At one point, an almost perpendicular bluff of over 30 feet lay across the path, and a reconnoiter showed there was no way around the precipice. Sixty-six wagons had to be lowered one at a time by ropes lengthened with the hide of three steers cut into strips. A team of oxen was hitched to a wagon, the wheels locked, small logs with branches tied to the wagon for braking, and the ropes tied to the back of the wagon to lower it down the bluff. Two wagons were lost, but, in the two full days it took to get the wagons down, the other sixty-four wagons made it safely.

When the pioneers came out of the mountains, Mrs. James Longmire and her children were walking a hundred yards or so before the teams. She met a man walking toward her, who stopped in astonishment and exclaimed: "Good God, woman, where did you come from? Are there any more with you?"

The pioneers camped near the cabin of John Lackey, and he and Dr. Tolmie, head of the British company, furnished them with food. Most of the pioneers settled in the Puyallup Valley, the Biles family in Tumwater, Washington, George H. Himes and family in Portland, Stephen Judson in Steilacoom, Nelson Sargent in Grand Mound.

¹ While most of these pioneers listed as from Kentucky may have been from Kentucky, two of the settlers, at least, were from Tennessee. Nancy Merry (Carter) Biles was from Henry County, Tennessee, and the Biles' home was Giles County, Tennessee, although it is not unlikely Nancy and James Biles settled in Kentucky after their marriage.

C E R T I F I C A T I O N O F G E N E A L O G I S T S

The Board for Certification of Genealogists was founded in June 1964 for the purpose of formulating standards of professional genealogical research, establishing a register of persons who are qualified to do such work, and providing lists of those who have passed the required examination and have been certified by the Board to libraries, archival institutions, societies, and individuals.

At the present time researchers are divided into six classifications. Certification is granted upon the presentation of evidence of expertise in the specific category of certification.

A Certified Genealogist (C.G.) is one who not only conducts research among primary sources and studies secondary works but also works to solve genealogical problems and constructs genealogies of families based upon his investigations of the sources and careful analysis of the evidence.

A Certified Genealogical Record Searcher (C.G.R.S.) is one who searches original and published records, has an understanding of all sources of a genealogical nature relating to the area in contents of the records examined, but not certified to construct a pedigree or to prepare a family history.

A Certified American Lineage Specialist (C.A.L.S.) is one who prepares a single line of descent and is competent to determine the authenticity of evidence and acceptability of original source material and compiled printed material. American in this category is not limited in meaning to the United States.

A Certified American Indian Lineage Specialist (C.A.I.L.S.) is one who shows competence in work in the specific records (such as tribal records, etc.) dealing with this category. American in this category is not limited to the United States.

A Certified Lecturer (C.L.) is one who lectured on specific genealogical topics. Requirements for certification in this category include C.G.R.S. certification.

A Certified Instructor (C.I.) is one who provided instruction in all aspects of genealogical research techniques and sources. Requirements for certification in this category include the requirements for C.G. certification.

Fee's for Certification cost between \$50.00 and \$100.00 plus an application fee of \$10.00. Certification is granted for a five year period only and must be renewed with submission of information relating to continuing activities in the genealogical field. This requirement is essential to insure that each person certified by the Board continues to do work meeting the Board's standards of acceptability.

LIBRARY UPDATE

NEW.....MICROFILM READER in Clark County Genealogical Society Library. It has a zoom lens and other beneficial features which definitely make film viewing more pleasurable.

Following is a reminder of services offered by the Fort Vancouver Regional Library and the C.C.G.S. Library.

Fort Vancouver Regional Library's interlibrary loan program includes loan of books; newspaper films, both foreign and U.S.; Canadian census films; some state censuses particularly Minnesota and Ohio. At present it is planned to initiate an interlibrary loan program for federal censuses through the Oregon State Library. The Oregon State Library does not have a complete supply of federal census, but their stock includes many states.

C.C.G.S. Library does have a loan program whereby federal census films from all states may be borrowed. Films contained in the C.C.G.S. Library include Washington federal censuses from 1860 through 1900 with one 1910 Clark County film. Completion of purchase of 1910 Washington federal census films will be accomplished in the near future. Among other films at C.C.G.S. Library are census films for some counties of Minnesota and Ohio as well as all the Washington and Oregon Death Indexes plus part of the California Death Index.

Be sure to check the periodical card file in the library for new exchanges that have been added since printing of our last directory of 1984-85.

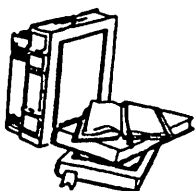
SCHEMES TO SEPARATE YOU FROM YOUR MONEY!

Beatrice Bayley books have received much publicity in the past six or seven years. However, people continue to receive postcards offering a book entitled "THE AMAZING STORY OF THE (family surname) IN AMERICA". This implies that it is a genealogy when it actually contains a "how to" section and a second section which is a computer list of people in the U.S. with your surname. Sharon Taylor also offers a book called "THE (family surname) FAMILY HERITAGE BOOK". It is practically the same offer as that of Beatrice Bayley. There are other similar solicitors offering the same information. These books range in price from \$25.00 to \$30.00. The advertising is not actually false but is misleading. It leads people to believe that the names of those individuals listed in the computer section are actually relatives. Letters sent to the computer addresses have been returned because the people have moved or are deceased. It is more practical to obtain these names free of charge from telephone books in public libraries. There is another offer of computerized genealogy with many additional benefits. The memberships are \$15.00-\$25.00. However, an order of \$20.00 or more is expected in order to receive free individual name print-outs. In return you are expected to furnish your information for their computers to receive anything. Actually you receive only a membership card for the \$15.00 membership fee. So BUYER BEWARE!

WHAT WAS HER MAIDEN NAME?

By Peggy Roberts

A question often stumping us in our search of our families is "What was her maiden name?" Often the places we most expect to find the answer do not reveal this name. Then when we do find the name in one source, we are eager to assume that this is the maiden name we have been searching for. But the one source we do find may not always carry the correct information. With that in mind, it is best to search many sources in hopes of finding the name repeated several times.

Below is a list of some of the places you might search for that missing maiden name.

1. Her death certificate.
2. Her obituary - she may be survived by a father, brother, or unmarried sister.
3. Her marriage certificate.
4. Children's birth certificates - often give mother's maiden name.
5. Children's death certificates.
6. Divorce papers.
7. Certificate of Naturalization of husband.
8. Land records - finding the woman on an index of grantees has sometimes, when followed through, found the grantor to be her father, deeding land to his daughter.
9. County histories - often give biographies of a family, telling the wife's maiden name.
10. Widows military pension - where the woman may have received a widow's pension for her husband's service in the Revolutionary War, Civil War, or War of 1812.
11. A family history of the husband's line may give the woman's maiden name.
12. Census records for 1880, 1900, and 1910 - For these years the relationship to the head of the family was given for each person living in the household. You may find a mother-in-law living in the household; thus, in a large percentage of instances - the woman's maiden name.
13. Printed Church records or printed marriage records.
14. Unpublished Church records - If you know the church the woman was married in and approximate year, often a church will be willing to undertake a search of their wedding records.

EVALUATION OF EVIDENCE

1. Circumstantial evidence must be relied on to prove many things in genealogy, but no conclusions should ever be made or connections accepted on the basis of one piece of evidence. And if one piece of evidence from any other source conflicts with the inference, that connection or conclusion cannot be accepted until the conflict is resolved. When a connection is made on this basis, we say it is "circumstantially proved beyond reasonable doubt."

2. This is the most abused area of evidence by the beginning genealogist. Too often a piece of circumstantial evidence looks so appealing that it is accepted without question, without resorting to any other sources.

15. Wills - She may have left something to her brother or unmarried sister. Likewise, she may have been willed something by her father, mother, brother or unmarried sister.
16. Family Bible records.
17. A query in a genealogical magazine or periodical.
