

An ANCESTRY begins with a single individual and traces back in time to include the male and female lines of that person's ancestors. A full 8 generations of one's ancestry would involve 511 persons.

• A GENEALOGY, on the other hand, begins with a single ancestor and traces forward in time to include all descendents to the present.

INTERNATIONAL GENEALOGICAL INDEX (IGI)

The International Genealogical Index (IGI) is a list of deceased individuals found in the computer of the Genealogical Society of Utah. For names that were extracted from parish registers, they would include only those individuals born or christened before 1871 or married before 1886. Some names are of people for whom temple ordinances have been performed. All information known about an individual is not included in the index. It does include, however, a batch number that can be traced to the original source of input.

The IGI is on microfiche and located at the Genealogical Society Library in Salt Lake City and at most LDS branch genealogical libraries. If neither of these options are available to you, you may send a completed Temple Ordinance Indexes Request form and \$1.00 for each name to the Genealogical Society. Request forms are available at most branch libraries or through the LDS Church Distribution Center, 1999 West 1700 South, Salt Lake City, UT 84104. When using the IGI or requesting information by use of a form, the following information must be known:

- 1. Name
- Date of an event in his/her life, which may be an approximate / date.
- 3. Place of the event, being a state in the United States, a province in Canada, a county in England and the Scandinavian countries, and the name of the kingdom or ducy as it existed in 1918 in the case of Germany.

Note: Keep in mind the boundary changes.

When searching the <u>place</u> of the event, you will find that the surnames are arranged alphabetically, and for the same surname, arranged alphabetically by given name. Be sure to check all spelling variations. Entries with the same name are arranged chronologically by date of event.

On a page of the IGI, the following information may be found:

- 1. Name
- 2. Names of parents or spouse of individual
- 3. Sex
 - M Male
 - F Female
 - H Husband
 - W Wife
- 4. Type of event
 - A Adult Christening
 - B Birth
 - C Christening
 - D Death or burial

- 4. Type of event (cont)
 - F Birth or christening of first known child (used in lieu of a marriage date).
 - M Marriage
 - N Census
 - S Other, such as LDS baptism
 - W Probate or will
- 5. Event date
- 6. County, town, parish
- 7. LDS baptism date
- 8. LDS endowment date and temple
- 9. LDS sealing date (for sealing to parents except when event-type is marriage)
- 10. Source Batch No.) Used to obtain further
- 11. Source Serial Sheet No.) information

There are forms available at the LDS Library for use when extracting the information off the IGI.

After you have located entries on possible family members, the next step is to find out what the original source of input was. The source may be determined by the batch number and the serial/sheet number. The three major sources of information indexed are as follows:

 Extraction programs. Names were extracted from original or printed sources such as vital records of births and marriages.

Batch numbers begin C, E, P, J, K, M (except M17 and M18), 725, 744, 745, and 754.

To trace further, use <u>Parish and Vital Records Listings</u>
<u>in Batch Sequence</u>, available on microfiche. When you
locate film number, you may order the film and check
yourself, or having the serial/sheet number, you may have
a print made of the entry in Salt Lake.

2. Forms submitted by LDS Church members. When found, the form will give the name and address of the person who submitted it.

All-digit batch numbers with the third digit smaller than 4. The first two digits indicate the year the information was submitted; the next three digits indicate the day of the year; the final number indicates the number of the individual who submitted information that day.

To trace further, use <u>IGI Batch Number Index - Numberical</u> to determine correct film number. Use sheet number from IGI to find correct form on the film.

3. Marriage sealing records taken from LDS temple records.

Batch numbers begin with A, M17, or M18.

Use a Temple Ordinance Indexes Request form to request searches of the archives at Salt Lake City for an \underline{A} batch number with a sealing date between 1942 and 1970. An \underline{A} batch number with a sealing date before 1942 may only be traced by direct descendants of the person listed through the original temple record. The descendent must personally do this research or have it done by a professional genealogist with access to the Genealogical Society Library in Salt Lake City.

He went to Mexico after the trial at this place some months ago, and returned on the Nevada on her last trip. He will probably now be tried for murder.

May the deeply afflicted family, and especially the father and mother, be sustained in this hour of their sad bereavement, by a faith that knows no wavering, and a hope full of consolation.

A SOLDIER KILLED

A soldier was arrested a few days ago in town by the guard for drunkeness, with a view to his removal to the guard house. On his way hither, he undertook to resist, or make an attack in some manner, as we are informed on the guard. Whereupon he was run through the body with a bayonet, and is now dead and buried. We have heard it said that he was so near the guard and the attack was so sudden that there was not time to reverse the gun. Perhaps this was so, and without knowing we are inclined to the charitable opinion that the guard acted without time for consideration. We suppose the act is justified by the strictness of military rule, and yet we cannot but feel that there is sometimes too low an estimate set upon human life and that it could scarcely have been necessary for an armed guard to treat a lone, drunken, and we suppose unarmed soldier, with such severity in order to compel obedience.

EARLY CLARK CO. PEOPLE

MATTHIAS SPURGEON

The following sketch was written by the grandson of Matthias Spurgeon, namely, Dean Brooks, 5141 Lincoln Ave., Los Angeles, CA 90042. Mr. Brooks has been working on the Spurgeon genealogy longer than most of us. Many of you may have read his article in Genealogy & History, Vol. 12, No. 1, Issue 103, pp. 15-17, item 14328, March 1951.

Matthias Spurgeon (son of Elias Spurgeon and Jane Likins,, both of whom may have been born in Ohio) was born in Dubuque, Iowa, 22 Apr. 1838, one of seven children. His father passed away in January 1847 of typhoid fever and his mother passed away about 21 March 1851 in Cedar Co., Iowa. Matthias lived with his sister Pricilla, who had married Edwin Sparks. During his stay with his sister he had the opportunity to attend school for three months each for three terms. A total of nine months altogether. He was exceedingly successful in life, very well read and far better in arithmetic than many with far superior education.

When he was 14 years old he came west with his uncle George Spurgeon, who was older. This was at the same time as the Mormon Pioneers were headed for Salt Lake City and the gold seekers were rushing toward California. Thousands headed for Oregon on the Old Oregon Trail because of the free land in the beautiful wooded Oregon Territory. The land was theirs if they lived on it for four years.

They left from Iowa on the 6th of May 1852 with ox teams and covered wagons. There were five families in the train and they traveled after the fashion of the times, a slow and tedious journey, experiencing hardships and privations by want of pasturage and water for the stock, however, they were very fortunate in not having any trouble with the Indians or cholera as many settlers of the day experienced. Although only 14 years of age Matthias droved one of the ox teams.

They traveled the Old Oregon Trail by way of Fort Laramie and the north side of the Platte River, via the Columbia River to the Dalles and down the Columbia to Fort Vancouver, which was originally a Hudson Bay trading post and portion of Canada. Washington State was still a portion of Oregon Territory. In 1853 it was declared Washington Territory but it did not become a state until 1889.

From the Dalles the families went down the Columbia River in canoes with the Indians and the men of the party driving the cattle on the trail beside the river. The trip west from Iowa was uneventful in that although practically every mile of the Oregon Trail held the graves of those who had passed away because of accident or disease. Not a member of the party became ill and they had no Indian problems.

In the same train was Jeremiah Dillon and his wife, Roxy Ann Brooks (Matthias' future father and mother-in-law). The train divided at Fort Hall, Idaho. The Dillons going south to California and the Spurgeons going on west to Vancouver in the Oregon Territory.

After reaching their destination Matthias went to live with William Hendrickson, a United Brethren minister who lived on the Washington shore of the Columbia River near the mouth of the Willamette River. The next spring he went to live with and work for William Dillon with whom he had started west from Iowa. He remained with the William Dillon family until he was 21 years of age. William Dillon had come west in 1847 and then operated a ferry across the Columbia River near the mouth of the Willamette River, at what was called Dillon's Landing.

When he was 21 years of age Matthias took a four months trip through the mining district of Idaho. He then returned to Vancouver and worked for William Dillon until the following spring when he again went east of the mountains and freighted from the Dalles to Wallula and from there to Lewiston Idaho for the remainder of the season. He then returned to Vancouver and remained with William Dillon for the remainder of the winter.

The next spring he rented a portion of the Petrain Donation Land Claim on the banks of Vancouver Lake. In 1865 he and a friend, Orson Seward formed a partnership and bought a portion of the Petrain Claim for \$10.00 an acre. At a later date Matthias and Orson decided to divide the property and Matthias gave Orson the choice of selecting the half he wanted and of setting the boundary lines between the pieces of property. Matthias' ranch consisted of pasture and meadow on the banks of Vancouver Lake. At a later date he bought additional land acquiring in all about 280 acres of fertile bottomland. He raised stock and broke horses.

In 1872, just 20 years after coming west, he took a brief trip back to Iowa but returned immediately to Vancouver. He brought back walnuts in his pockets which he planted on his place in Fruit Valley, as the place where his ranch had become called.

On the 21st of October 1877 he married Miss Nancy Olive Dillon, daughter of Jeremiah Dillon and Roxy Ann Brooks, with whom he had come west in 1852. They were married by the Rev. John Clark of Brush Prairie, Clark Co., Washington. The Rev. Clark was known as "Uncle Johnie" by all who knew him.

Matthias was very successful and was loved by his neighbors for his generous ways. Although not rich by our standards he was considered to be well to do. Money meant nothing to him and he helped many of his neighbors who did not always repay him. He spent practically his whole life on his farm in Fruit Valley.

In his mid-70's he suffered a stroke as a result of being attacked by a swarm of bees and was unable to work. He had to give up his beloved ranch. He rented his farm and moved to "The City" in Vancouver where he spent the balance of his life.

Seven children were born of this union. He passed away at his home in Vancouver on the 11th of March 1918 and was buried in the family plot near the U.S. Army Garrison in Vancouver, Washington

LOUISA WELLMAN

Obituary - Mrs. Louisa C. Wellman was born May 12, 1841, in Pennsylvania. While she was still very young, her parents went to Michigan, and from there to Iowa. At the age of 14 she went with her parents to Minnesota.

On July 15, 1865, she was wedded to Cimon A. Wellman in Preston, Fillmore County, Minn. In 1876 they traveled by wagon to Butler county, Kas., and June 2, 1882 they left Kansas by team for the west, crossing the Columbia river at Vancouver October 17, 1883.

They resided at Burton, Clarke county until 1890, and they then settled on a homestead on the Little Washougal river about six miles north and east of Washougal. In July 1893, she was struck by a piece of machinery, sustaining injuries from which she never quite recovered.

In 1894 she moved to Vancouver. For the past seventeen years she had been under the care of different physicians. She took to her bed the first of June 1910 and gradually grew worse until her death, June 18, 1911, at the age of 70 years, 3 months, 6 days.

Mrs. Wellman is survived by her husband, Cimon A. Wellman, one sister, Mrs. Elizabeth Winchell, two brothers, W. H. Taylor, of Portland, and M. W. Taylor, east of the mountains, and two daughters, Mrs. Sarah Merritt, of Makay, Idaho, and Mrs. Mary Martine, of Portland. Besides these are eight grandchildren and six great grandchildren, all living.




BIBLE RECORDS

LIBRARY UPDATE

During a recent visit to the new Genealogical Library of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Salt Lake City, Utah, I could not help but notice the lack of consideration and courtesy by some of the visitors to the library. The services of this large library are free to the public except for photocopying from books or films.

The library is much larger than the previous one, and it is a pleasure to spend hours researching there. Some significant conveniences have been added in order to aid one's research. The library requests that people file their own films and microfiche, and that only five films be taken from the file at one time. You cannot imagine the number of microfiche that were left lying around loose, and the number of readers that were left turned on when not in use. Many had complete disregard for the rule of selecting only five rolls of film at once. They could be seen with armloads of film much in excess of five.

There were complaints by some patrons that loud discussions by two people regarding research of an ancestor interfered with concentration.

Library courtesy is of prime importance in any library whether it be a genealogical library or a public community library. Libraries show great generosity by accommodating the public to use their facilities without charge. Therefore, let us not be guilty of inconsideration but show our appreciation by observing the rules and regulations of whatever library we have occasion to visit.

CONFEDERATE PRISONERS - The Chemung County Historical Society, 415 E. Water St., Elmira, NY 14901, has a list of 2,963 Confederate prisoners who died at Elmira Prison Camp, 1864-1865. For a SASE, they will check the list for your ancestor's name and, if found, send a photocopy of the listing. Information included is: grave number, name, rank, company, regiment/battalion, state and date of death. The camp opened July 6, 1864. In all, 12,123 prisoners resided in the camp. Death claimed 2,963. The dead are buried in Woodlawn National Cemetery, one mile north of the site. (Taken from Leon Hunters Dispatch, Jan/Feb, 1986.)
