



Jerri St. John

Born and raised in Alliance, Nebraska, Lois LaVerne "Jerri" Struble is the daughter of Leo Lyle Struble and Luella G. Prouty. She was born on July 19, 1928 and received her education in the public schools, graduating in 1945 from Alliance High School. She immediately went to work at the air base on a civil service job. There she met Bill St. John, a radio operator on a B-29. Following his discharge from the service in 1946 he returned to Klamath Falls, Oregon and found that his job at the railroad was still waiting for him. Jerri joined him on March 10th, and they were married at Klamath Falls on March 19, 1946. William Lawson St. John was born on June 23, 1925 at Montgomery, Alabama, the son of Herbert Lawson St. John and Leota Cooper.

The couple lived in Klamath Falls until Bill retired after 43 years as a locomotive engineer. Their three children were all born there. William Ward was born on January 2, 1947 (married Judith Wineburg), Elizabeth Anne on March 24, 1949 (married Edward Krebsbach) and Dennis Lawson on August 4, 1957 (married Debra Brock). Following Bill's retirement, they moved to Brookings, Oregon, where they had purchased a home some years prior. Bill passed away at LaGrande, Oregon on May 19, 1991 and is buried at the Zion Cemetery in Canby.

Jerri was employed in the area of credit and collection for nearly 30 years. She belonged to Business and Professional Women, and Credit Women International, holding every office in the organization. She did a great deal of traveling in this connection. She has been a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary for 48 years.

Several members of the St. John family are "ham radio" operators. Jerri shared the interest with her husband, her son Bill, daughter Beth and son-in-law Ed. She has had her F.C.C. license since 1958. They have taken an active part in Amateur Radio Emergency Services and belong to the Clark County Amateur Radio Association. During the Columbus Day storm, they worked as net control operators, providing communication with the devastated areas.

After moving to Vancouver in April of 1989, Jerri joined C.C.G.S. and has become a very active participant. As members you will appreciate the many changes she and Helen Taylor have made to better serve you in our Library. In addition to her work as co-librarian, Jerri works one day a week at the Portland East Stake Family History Library. She is currently serving her second term as Recording Secretary of C.C.G.S.

Jerri is the proud grandmother of six children: Joshua (age 13) and Kylie (age 9) who live at Klamath Falls, Oregon, Maggie (age 13) and Becky (age 11) who live at Mt. View, California, and Drew (age 10) and James (age age 9) who are moving to St. Helens, Oregon during Christmas break. Her son-in-law Ed has been promoted to systems manager of TCI and is being transferred there.

A six week research trip through Nebraska, Iowa and Illinois provided much information. After traveling with her sister, they reported that the car would make automatic turns into any cemetery they might be passing. This summer, they plan a two month excursion researching in Ohio, Pennsylvania and western New York.

EARLY CLARK COUNTY PLACES

Legend says chief slew lake's dragon

If they think it's crowded now, they should have been there in the old days," said Betty Lerouge Dollar.

Mrs. Dollar was talking about Battle Ground Lake and the announcement the state park there will go to a reservations system this year because of overcrowding.

Mrs. Dollar, 8605 N.E. 219th St., is the daughter of the late Steve Lerouge, who developed Battle Ground Lake to the point where hundreds of visitors were lured each day from Vancouver, Portland and elsewhere.

"I can remember standing, dipping ice cream cones all day, until my hands were blistered," Mrs. Dollar said.

Lerouge, who died in 1973 at the age of 83, built and operated concessions at Battle Ground Lake for nearly 30 years, from 1921 until about 1950. His attractions there included a dance hall, skating rink, wooden swimming tanks with a towering diving platform, speedboat races and a tremendous fireworks display on the Fourth of July.

The lake, about 2 miles northeast of Battle Ground, was privately owned until the early 1970s, when the state purchased it to develop into a state park.

Lerouge was an expert on the history and legends surrounding the beautiful lake. He printed this story on a menu about 1943:

"Battle Ground Lake is without visible inlet or outlet and, according to Indian legend, is without a bottom at its deepest point. According to this legend, the Indians believed a dragon or serpent lived deep in the water and was slain by a valiant young chieftain, thus saving his sweetheart from those deadly fangs.

"On account of its supernatural features and crater origin, the superstitious redmen regarded it as Mystery Lake (Tunaakaahos) and believe someday the bones of the monster would cause another eruption."

While this is a nice story, the facts about Battle Ground Lake are less romantic. Geologist say the lake is just over 60 feet deep at the center and gradually shallows out to the shoreline.

If it is the crater of an extinct volcano, it must have been tiny, for the surface of the lake is only 504 feet above sea levels and contains only 27.1 surface acres and 838.3 acre-feet of water.

A water-level footpath rims the lake, and the hiker finds himself passing through groves of giant fir and cedar trees and past huge boulders that appear volcanic in origin.


Although the lake was used for recreation from pioneer times, it was not until 1916 that anyone tried to develop it as a resort. Henry Blystone was the first resort operator, and Lerouge took over four years later.

The dance hall and skating rink were built on pilings and extended out over the water. There was a restaurant and boat rental facilities. By Bob Beck Printed with permission



Lerouge built a series of wooden swimming tanks out into the lake, and these lured thousands of splashers on hot summer days. Swimming schools were held there, and generations of Battle Ground boys and girls took their first strokes in them.

Lerouge sold out in about 1950, his daughter said. Later owners, Mr. and Mrs. Al Thomas of Dollar's Corner, rebuilt the skating rink and other buildings.

All Clark County Genealogical members are being asked to up-date or submit one five-generation pedigree chart and surname cards for the thirty-three names as completely as you have researched. Please follow the instructions below so a uniform response is possible.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR GENERATION CHART:

- 1. Make out one **five-generation** ancestor chart. The chart must be 11" X 8-1/2", standard letter size. Place your name, address, and date submitted in the upper left hand corner of the chart. Complete the chart insofar as you are able, stating complete dates when known and giving the city or town, county, state or country for each event. (The library has charts for sale. If your records are on computer, you may want to make your own.)
- 2. No. 1 on the ancestor chart should be YOUR name (use your MAIDEN name if you are a woman. No. 2 is the name of your FATHER. No. 3 is the given and MAIDEN name of your MOTHER. Nos. 4 and 5 are your FATHER'S father and mother. No. 6 and 7 are your MOTHER'S parents, etc. You will note that the EVEN numbers are always the MALE members of your line. (If you are working on your spouse's and your spouse is not a member, you may make up an appropriate set.)

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SURNAME CARDS:

3. After completing your chart, make out a 3" X 5" card for each MALE member on your chart as illustrated in <u>SAMPLE "A"</u> below. You may list the children of the family on the reverse of this card along with the dates of birth, date of marriage, name of person married, etc. <u>UNDERLINE</u> the name of the child from whom you are descended. For each **FEMALE** member on your chart, make out a 3" X 5" card as shown in <u>SAMPLE "B"</u>. Put your membership number in the UPPER RIGHT corner of all cards. Your name and address must be shown in the LOWER RIGHT hand corner or each and every card, along with the date submitted. (Small stickers may be used for convenience.)

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING:

- 4. Upon completion of your chart and your cards, please submit them to Clark County Genealogical Society, PO Box 2728, Vancouver, WA 98668; you may also leave them with the librarian at the Clark County Genealogical Library.
- 5. Charts will be filed in a special notebook in the Genealogical Library. Cards will be filed in the surname card file. If you have any questions, ask the librarian on duty or contact the Surname Chairman.

SURNAME CARDS: A VALUABLE RESEARCH AID


