





CLARKE COUNTY EXTRACTS FROM

R.L. POLK & CO.'S OREGON, WASHINGTON AND IDAHO GAZETTEER AND BUSINESS DIRECTORY 1886-7. VOLUME 2.

Extracts of all Clarke County, Washington, postoffices listed in Polk's 1886-7 Gazetteer and Business Directory are printed below. The fifteen enteries listed included: Battle Ground, Brush Prairie, Etna [north Clark County on the Lewis River], Fern Prairie [just north of Camas], Fisher's [Camas area], Hayes [35 miles north of Vancouver], Hockinson, La Camas [now Camas], La Center, Lewisville [8 miles southwest of La Center; north of Battle Ground], Pioneer [about 3 mi. south of La Center], Union Ridge [now Ridgefield], Vancouver, Vancouver Barracks [post office at the military post in Vancouver], and Washougal. Please note that the correct spelling for Clark County at the time was Clarke (with an e at the end).

BATTLE GROUND. A postoffice on Deep Creek, in Clarke County, 30 miles northeast of Portland, Or., and 18 northeast of Vancouver, the county seat and nearest shipping and banking point. Settled in 1854, it has 3 church societies. Ships grain, produce and lumber. Population, 75. Mail, sent weekly. J.L. Groat, postmaster.

BRUSH PRAIRIE. A postoffice in Clarke County, 12 miles northeast of Portland, OR., and 11 northeast of Vancouver, the county seat, nearest shipping and banking point. Population, 25. Mail, semi-weekly. John Jay Clark, postmaster. Vadnais Charles, General Store.

ETNA. A postoffice on the lewis river, in clarke county, 85 miles north of Portland, Or., 28 north of Vancouver, the county seat and banking point. Settled in 1882. It has a Lutheran church and a saw mill. Mail, weekly. Population 25. Caroline Hopf, postmater.

FERN PRAIRIE. A postoffice in Clarke county, 35 miles northeast of Portland, Or., 15 east of Vancouver, the county seat, and 7 northeast of Washougal, the nearest boat landing. Vancouver is the nearest banking point. Population, 15. Mail, weekly.

FISHER'S. A village on the Columbia river, in Clarke county, 21 miles northeast of Portland, Or., and

8 east of Vancouver, the county seat and nearest banking point. Ship goods direct. It has a Methodist church. Mail, daily. Alma D. Buchanan, postmaster. Buchanan S C, General Store. Danforth C H, blacksmith. Fisher S W, elevator.

HAYES. A postoffice in Clarke county, 47 miles north of Portland, Or., and 35 north of Vancouver, the county seat, nearest shipping and banking point. Populatin 15, Mail, tri-weekly.

HOCKINSON. A postoffice in Clarke county, established in 1885, 16 miles north of Vancouver, the county seat and bank location. There is a creamery and a shingle mill. Mial, semi-weekly. Ambrose Hockinson, postmater.

LA CAMAS. A manufacturing village on the Columbia river, in Clarke county, 14 miles east of Vancouver, the county seat, and bank location, and 22 east of Portland, Or. There is a fine water power which is utilized by a roller process flouring mill, and an extensive paper mill; a railroad is projected to Tacoma, and a system of water works is in operation. Shipments, paper, flour and farm produce. Troutdale, Or., is the nearest railroad station. Exp., W., F. & Co. Mail, daily. Population, 800. A. F. Mills, postmaster. Algeo Wm J, bridge builder. LA CENTER. A village on the Lewis river, in Clarke county, 28 miles north of Portland, Or., and 20 north of Vancouver, the county seat and nearest banking point. It contains a saw mill and a fouring mill operated by steam. The shipments comprise grain, lumber and general farm produce. Ship direct. Population 200. Mail, tri-weekly. John K. Gaither, postmaster.

LEWISVILLE. Also known as Hall's Bridge, is a postoffice on the East Fork of the Lewis river, in Clarke County, 25 miles north of Portland, Or., 16 north of Vancouver, the county seat, and 8 southwest of La Center, the nearest shipping point. Vancouver is the nearest baking point. Settled in 1882. It has a

church and a grist mill. Stages to Vancouver. Population, 18. Mail, semi-weekly. J. W Rowland, postmaster.

PIONEER. A village in Clarke County, 20 miles north of Portland, Or., 14 north of Vancouver, the county seat, and 3 1/2 south of La Center, the nearest shipping point. Vancouver is the nearest banking point. Settled in 1866, it contains Methodist and Catholic churches, and a steam saw mill. Ships grain, produce and lumber. Population of vicinity, 100. Mail, tri-weekly. Charles H. Greeley, postmaster.

UNION RIDGE. A post village on Lake River, in Clarke county, 21 miles north of Porland, Or., and 15 north of Vancouver, the county seat and nearest banking point. Settled in 1853. It has a church. Ships farm produce. Population, 65. Mail, tri-weekly. Stephen Shobert, postmaster.

VANCOUVER. Beautifully situated on the Columbia river, in Clarke county, of which it is the judicial seat, 18 miles by boat and 7 by land north of Portland, Or. The eastern half of the city is devoted to the military, this being the headquarters of the Department of the Columbia, and the storehouses, officers' quarters, and barracks, add materially to the appearance of the town. The shores on either side of the river above and below Vancouver are well cultivated and very attractive. First settled 1826, by hunters sent out by the Hudson Bay Co., it was incorporated as a city in 1862, and now contains Episcopal, Methodist, Presbyterian, Christian and Catholic churches, a good school employing six teachers, and having an attendance roll of 300, a Catholic college, a court house erected at a cost of \$35,000, a public hall capable of seating 500, steam saw and flouring mills, excellent water works, an efficient and well equipped fire department, a bank, the First National, capital \$50,000, a telephone exchange and all the other attributes of a prosperous city. Steamers leave her for Portland twice daily and once a day for The Dalles. The press is represented by the Vancouver Independent (Rep., weekly) the Clarke County

Register (Rep., weekly) and the Columbia Chruchman (religious). The shipments consist of fruit and dairy produce. Stages twice daily to Portland; fare 50 cents. Tel., W. U. Exp., W., F. & Co. Population, 3,000. Mail, daily. Hattie Dennison, postmaster.



Volunteer Spotlight

On September 21, 1942 at Bandon, Oregon, Carol "Jane" Chappell was born to George Chappell and Georgia Carol Philpott. Her twin brother Carroll Gene was stillborn. Her father, who owned and operated a Chevron Service Station, was born on July 23, 1913 at Caldwell, Idaho, and her mother, a homemaker and school teacher, was born on September 20, 1915 at Randolph, Oregon.

A second set of twins, Jack and Jill, were born to the Chappells on February 4, 1948. Jack, formally George Richard Jack Chappell, is the owner/operator of Seaview Sanitation at Bandon. Jill, whose full name is Susan Rosanne Jill Chappell, is now Mrs. Larry Sumerlin. She is a math teacher and lives at Beaverton, Oregon.

Due to complications, Jane's mother spent an extended time in the hospital following her birth. On one of her father's daily visits, he was stopped at the door by a soldier who refused him entrance despite the serious condition of his wife. They were not to learn the answer to this mystery for twenty years. Dr. Lucas, the attending physician, stopped Jane and Mrs. Chappell on the street and explained the circumstances to them. A fire on a submarine off the coast near Bandon resulted in several Japanese sailors being burned and they had been brought to the hospital for treatment. They had been treated in secret to avoid spreading fear that the enemy was so close

to the mainland and also for the protection of the prisoners. The townspeople had long suspected something out of the ordinary with the military presence at the hospital and that all of the burn medication and bandages in the town were requisitioned.

Following graduation from Bandon High School in 1960, Jane attended her mother's Alma Mater, Oregon State University and received her degree in education in 1964. She has taken graduate courses at San Diego State and OSU. In her first class at college, Jane met her future husband Larry Germann. He was attending OSU on a ROTC scholarship. They were married just two days after graduation on June 9, 1964. Ten days later, Larry was to report for duty at the Naval Base in San Diego. He stayed in the service for eight years and then transferred to the Reserve Fleet. Following his discharge in 1971, the family returned to Larry's home town and have remained here since. He grew up just northeast of Orchards where his parents, Fritz and Leona Germann, still live on the eighty acre family farm. Larry is a descendant of T.J. Wilson and Anna Chope who migrated to Clark County in 1864. His great great Grandparents donated the land for the first Pleasant Valley School.

During their stay in Pacific Beach, the Germanns adopted their first child, Susan "Susi" Jane Germann, who was born December 15, 1970. She was just two weeks old when they welcomed her into their home. Their son, Brian Fritz Germann, was born less than a year later on October 5, 1971 at the Bremerton Naval Hospital. It was six years later that daughter Barbara Carol Germann entered the world on February 9, 1977 in Vancouver.

While Larry was overseas for a year, Jane taught in Bandon at the schools she had once attended. She is presently a substitute teacher in the Battle Ground and Hockinson school districts. Following family tradition, Susi is a junior at Oregon State planning a career in elementary education. Brian is Midshipman 3rd Class at the United States Naval Academy, and Barbara is a freshman at Prairie High School.

The Germanns have been active in community affairs throughout the years, leading in scouting, 4-H and the children's sports programs. Very active in Trinity Life Center, Jane is acting state coordinator for Lydia Fellowship a women's intercessory prayer group. She enjoys gardening and did the landscaping at their home. She has cultivated the family vegetable garden for the past twenty years. She designed and built the large deck on their home and several of her water color and oil paintings adorn their walls. Jane and her daughter Barbara share an interest in genealogy and are both life members of C.C.G.S.

A past president and member of numerous committees, Jane is currently Editor of Trail Breakers. We are very proud of the outstanding accomplishments that she has contributed to our periodical. It just keeps getting better and better. Having made three research trips to Salt Lake and a three week excursion to England, she plans a joint publication with her cousin Hazel Lang, on the Philpott line. STUMBLING AROUND WITH GENEALOGY

As with most beginning genealogist, I began this hobby stumbling around gathering names, dates and other interesting bits and pieces of information, putting them in a loose leaf binder, easily found, I thought. As my collection grew to three, five and more of these un-indexed binders I found it necessary to group the information by family name, but this soon became unwieldy as brothers, sisters, cousins became married, had children who married, or granddad married second to a widowed mother, or as in one case, a man died and his brother married the widow and they produced another set of children ... oh my ... how should I keep them separate?

I always stumble on initials. For instance, my mother's uncle, John H.B. Jackson of Centerville, OR, always singed his name John H.B. Jackson, or John B. Jackson. For many years I searched for the name to those initials; once even searching out the wrong John B. Jackson of Cowlitz County, WA. Finally, searching through some Jackson family papers I came upon a John Henderson B. Jackson. Hooray! I'm making headway now. Not really; although I have narrowed the "B" down to either Brake, which seems unreasonable and improbable, or Barnes, which is the middle name of one of my mother's aunts, with indications of that name begin an old Virginia relative of the g-grandmother. Who knows? The stumbling search has gone on for years. Another kinsman was Perrin B. Whitman; his Lewiston, Idaho, obituary called him Perrin Baze Whitman, and as such, I carried him in my files for many years. One day while reading Drury's "A Tepee At My Door," I stumbled to the fact that Perrin carried his father's first name, Beza Whitman.

Another stumbling stone has been, when did great grandfather, Sam Parker, leave Virginia? His tombstone at Turner, Marion Co., OR, says he is a native of Virginia. I knew he came to Oregon in 1845 from Iowa, and for many years I believed he actually began his journey to Oregon from Virginia sometime just before that year, re—supplied, or over wintered in Iowa, then on to Oregon in May of 1845.

Not long ago, while idly thumbing through a genealogical quarterly, "Beaver Briefs," at the CCGS Library, I stumbled upon Samuel Parker's obituary from the Oregon Statesman, stating that he had left Virginia, now West Virginia, in 1837. I now know, just from stumbling around, when to look for him and other kin folks in West Virginia and Van Buren County, Iowa.

According to g-grandfather Sam's journal of 1845, they left Van Buren County, Iowa, on May 1st. On May 17th, "R. Parker left fore home."

Who is R. Parker? Where was home? Why did R. only go to the Widow Stone's camp? I have stumbled over those questions on many a long researching day.

Genealogy is a real kick, after months or years of fruitless searching, you find your kinsman through long hard legitimate research but it's a real gas when it happens just stumbling through the book shelf.

I'm slowly learning to keep better records of my search information, but occasionally I still forget, or get lazy, and because of that laziness, I know I'll stumble again, one of these days.

Continued from January 4, 1868

TURKEY SHOOTING. - This time honored custom was revived with much effect during the holidays. MR. JOHN POWELL put up the turkeys and a pool being formed by 10 men contributing 25 cents each, they took a shot at a target 40 yards distant and the nearest to the "bulls eye" got the turkey. It was the occasion of a great deal of fun to all, though somewhat costly to the unsuccessful. [3/1]

MATCHES. - MR. A. H. SHEFFIELD has returned from the upper country and intends to re-commence the manufacture of matches in this place. We are glad of this and trust that the community will nourish such enterprises and not permit them to die for want of support. The matches of his make are really good. [3/1]

CALLED. - MR. A. J. KANE, soliciting agent for the *Unionist*, called on us this week. [3/1]

Local Matters

No. 1's NEW HOUSE. - The lower portion of MR. EDDINGS', fine wooden structure on the corner of Main and Fifth streets has been metamorphosed into as fine an engine house as any fire company could desire. The meeting room is arranged with exquisite taste, the pictures and chandeliers being fit for any parlor. MR. TROUP recently presented the company with a magnificent pair of elk horns, valued at 40 dollars, which occupy a conspicuous place * * * MR. WINTLER, the present foreman, is unceasing in his efforts to promote the interests of the company which were never in better hands. [3/1]

FAILED. - The attempt to raise the body of MR. BATTERSBY, the man who walked off the wharf on Christmas Eve, by firing a cannon near the spot where the body is supposed to lay, failed. The [philosophy of this common method of raising dead bodies we believe is that the shock produced by the explosion causes the gall to burst, thereby lessening the specific gravity of the body

to such an extent that it will float.

SERVED HIM RIGHT. - A discharged soldier attempted to leave on Wednesday afternoon's boat without settling a small balance of three dollars with his laundress. She followed him to the boat importuning him in a very vehement manner to settle, emphasising her demands by pelting the delinquent over the head with her umbrella. Failing to get any satisfaction she called **DEPUTY MARSHAL FOX**, who went on board the steamer and made the fellow disgorge, generously refusing any compensation for his services. [3/1]

DEATH OF CHARLES PROUX. - This old resident of Clarke County died, of hemorrhage of the lungs, on Thursday night, at his far two miles below Vancouver. MR. PROUX was a fine specimen of an almost extinct class - Hudson Bay batteous men - of whom none were more intrepid of skillful. 
