



A Swedish Immigrant Family Leaves Many Vancouver Descendants

In the small village of Okna, Sweden, on the farm of Graneberg, lived Johan Mangus Gustafson, who was a farmer and a Circuit Judge, his wife Inga Maria Andersdotter and their eight children. All the children came to the United States between 1875 and 1893. Out of the eight, five resided in Vancouver and four are buried here. With the exception of my grandmother, all changed their name to Roden as it sounded more American.

August and Al Roden

The eldest child, August Roden, was born in 1851. He remained in New York. His only child, George, had no children. The second child, Al Roden, was born in 1857 and never married. He mined in Tonapah, Nevada and later had a hay ranch in McEwen, Oregon. He retired in 1927 and lived on the corner of 9th and Jefferson in Vancouver until his death in 1941. He is buried in Park Hill Cemetery.




Harry, Jenny and Anna Gustafson - 1904

The third child, Jenny Gustafson, grandmother of author, was born in 1859. She was the last of the eight children to emigrate to the United States. She and my grandfather, Carl Gustafson, were married in Okna, Sweden in 1892 and came to America in 1893. Carl worked for his brother-in-law, Gustaf Nelson, in Bridal Veil and Cascade Locks, Oregon and in Vancouver. He also mined in Tonapah and Silver City, Nevada. They had two children, Harry and Anna. Jenny died in 1914 at the old St. Joseph's Hospital and is buried in Old City Cemetery in Vancouver. Carl lived until 1956 and is buried at Kenton, Oregon.

Jenny and Carl's son, Harry, was born at Bridal Veil, Oregon in 1894. He grew up in Nevada and in Vancouver. During World War I he served in France as a farrier, and was with the Occupation Forces in Siberia. After his discharge he returned to Vancouver and drove truck for many years for Swift & Company. He married Grace Craine, a native of Vancouver, in 1929 and they had two children, Robert and June. Harry worked in the shipyards during World War II. In later years they lived in Portland where Harry worked at Fiber Form and Grace worked at St. Vincent's Hospital. After retirement they moved to the Oregon beaches. Harry died in 1977 and is buried in Willamette National Cemetery. Grace is still alive and lives in Portland.

Harry and Grace's son, Robert, was born in Portland in 1930. He graduated from Central Catholic High School in 1949 and served in the Army with the Medics in Korea from 1951 until 1953. After the war he returned to school, graduating from Portland State and then the University of Oregon Medical School. He interned at St. Vincent's Hospital in Portland. In 1959 he married

Marianne Roberti of Portland, and have two children, James and Kristen. Robert practiced in Portland from 1964 until 1966 when he returned to school for a degree in anesthesiology. Between 1968 and 1970 he practiced at Vancouver Memorial Hospital. Marianne grew up in Portland, graduating from Lincoln High School and Marylhurst College. She is a medical technician. The couple and their children moved to Vancouver in 1968 and still reside here.

Robert and Marianne's son James, was born in Portland in 1964. He currently manages a grocery store at Sisters, Oregon. Their daughter Kristen was also born in Portland. The children grew up in Portland and in Vancouver. Kristen, who graduated from Oregon State University, currently works for civil service in Portland.

Harry and Grace's daughter, June was born in Portland in 1931, growing up there and in Vancouver. She was a student at Providence Academy on 13th Street in Vancouver. In 1952, she married Phillip Wills Jr., and they have lived all of their married life in Tigard, Oregon. They have seven children who all reside in the Portland area.


In 1896, Jenny and and Carl's daughter Anna, was born at Cascade Locks, Oregon. She grew up in Nevada and Vancouver, marrying Fred Biggerstaff in Idaho in 1911. Their daughter Lucille was born in 1919. The couple lived in many places in Idaho and in Vancouver. In 1927, they separated and Anna and her daughter moved to Vancouver to live with her brother Harry. In 1930 Anna married George Reed of Vancouver, who was a lineman for the S.P.& S. Railroad. The house they lived in at 3305 "G" Street is still standing. In 1937 his job with the railroad required George to move to Portland. Anna died in 1943 and George in 1961. They are both buried in Park Hill Cemetery in Vancouver.

Born in 1919 at Caldwell, Idaho, Lucille Biggerstaff moved to Vancouver in 1927. She attended the local grade schools, Shumway Jr. High and Vancouver High School. She live in Portland between 1937 and 1943, prior to her marriage to Harold Moss a native of Wyoming. She traveled with him through the W.W.II years until he was sent overseas with the 96th Infantry Division. Returning to Portland, she worked for the O.P.A. until the end of the war. They lived at Milton, Oregon for a shot time and then moved to Spokane where they still live. They have three children, James, Christine and Craig. Harold was in sales and maintenance and Lucille worked part time in market research. Both are now retired.

In 1948 James Biggerstaff was born in Spokane. He graduated from Eastern Washington State University and served in the Navy during the Vietnam conflict. He is currently employed as a welder in Spokane. He has an adopted son, Aaron, but is now divorced.

Christine Biggerstaff was born in Spokane in 1950. She married young and has four children: Alecia, born in 1969, Aaron, born in 1971, Matthew, born in 1977 and Wendi, born in 1979. Following a divorce, Christine returned to business college and is now head cashier for A.A.A. Alecia has a son, Kyle, who was born in 1988. All live at Spokane.



Anna and George Reed




Lucille Biggerstaff - 1941

Anna Roden Nelson

The fourth Roden child, Anna, was born in 1861 and was eighteen when she emigrated to the United States. She worked as a nurse maid for the Jay Gould family in New York City. During a smallpox epidemic, her eldest brother sent her to Wyoming to stay with the Nelson family, friends from Okna, Sweden. In 1882 she married Gustaf Nelson a worker for the Union Pacific Railroad. They lived in Wyoming, Montana and Oregon, and in 1903 they moved to Vancouver where he was the roadmaster for the S.P.& S. Railroad. They lived in the large section foreman's house at 7th & Ingles where they raised their five children: Carrie, Harry, Charles, Lyndon and Frances. Anna died in 1920. After his retirement Gustaf lived in a house at 9th & Jefferson until his death in 1945. The couple are both buried in Park Hill Cemetery.

Born in Wyoming in 1883, Carrie Nelson never married, living at home and helping with the younger children. She passed away in 1927 and is buried in Park Hill Cemetery.

Harry Nelson, who was born in Wyoming in 1885, attended school in Vancouver and went to work for the S.P.& S. Railroad. He married Beulah Wirt of Vancouver, who died a few years after their marriage. She is buried in Old City Cemetery. He remarried in 1920 and moved to Kenton, where he operated a wood yard. Harry died in 1965 and is buried in Portland, Oregon.

In 1887, Charles Nelson was born in Wyoming. He grew up and attended school in Vancouver. In 1913 he married Ada Parker of Portland and they became the parents of two children: Bill and Betty.

Charles worked for the S.P.& S. Railroad and was roadmaster after his father retired, and they lived in the section house on 7th & Ingles. Charles organized many dances and called square dances at the Odd Fellows Hall and the Hazel Dell Grange. He died in 1942 and following his death, Ada worked as a LPN at Kaiser Hospital in Vancouver. She passed away at the age of ninety-eight on New Year's Day in 1988.

Bill Nelson was born in Portland, Oregon in 1916. He grew up in Vancouver and went to the local schools. After graduating from Vancouver High School he attended Clark College and then Multnomah College. A sports enthusiast, he was active in skiing, swimming and mountain climbing. During the Regatta on the 4th of July Celebration in Vancouver, he and his friends would dive off the Interstate Bridge into the Columbia River. He served in the Army Air Corps during W.W.II and received his wings in May of 1943. In July he was killed when his plane blew up in mid air. He is buried in Park Hill Cemetery.

Betty Nelson was born in Portland in 1921, growing up in Vancouver. She attended the local school and graduated from Clark College. For eleven years she worked for doctors and then for the American Legion for thirteen years. In 1942, Betty married Vancouver native Ward Holmes, who was born in 1918. He was a graduate of the University of Washington. Ward was a pilot in W.W.II and the Korean War. They have lived in their home on the Evergreen Highway for thirty-five years.

The fourth child of Anna and Gustaf Nelson, Lyndon, was born at Bridal Veil, Oregon in 1897. A seven month baby, he weighed on 1 1/2 pounds. He was fed with an eye dropper and slept in a shoe box padded with cotton. Later he had polio and scarlet fever and his legs were paralyzed. He was educated at home and had many interests, including reading. In his later years he lived with his father and other family members. He did in 1965 and is buried in Park Hill Cemetery.

Frances, the youngest child of Anna and Gustaf Nelson, was born in Portland in 1901. She grew up in Vancouver and graduated from Vancouver High School in 1920. She worked for Mr. Campbell at the Vancouver Columbian. In 1923 she married Dr. H. Weissert Andresen of Vancouver and they lived at Camas, Washington for over fifty years. They had two daughters: Marjorie and Frances. Weissert died in 1970 and in 1975 Frances in moved to Portland where she passed away in 1989. They are both buried in Portland.

Marjorie Andresen was born in Camas in 1927 and grew up there. She graduated from Willamette University and in 1949 married Bruce Barker of Camas. They have two sons: Christopher and Michael, who were born in Vancouver. They lived at Salem and Lincoln City, Oregon, where Bruce was a high school principal. Marjorie and her son Chris still live at Lincoln City and Michael lives at Salem. Michael has one son.

Born in Vancouver in 1928, Frances Andresen grew up at Camas. She graduated from Washington State University and in 1953 married Howard Hermanson. Howard, a native of Vancouver, is an interior designer. They live in Portland and have two sons: Howard Jr. and Jon.





The fifth child of Johan Magnus Gustafson and Inga Maria Andersdotter, Ed Roden, was born in 1864. He lived in McCall, Meadows and Boise, Idaho. In 1903 he married Ethel Mathias. He was a hotel and saloon keeper and also drove freight wagon. They had one daughter, Frances, and also raised their nephew Bill Roden. Ethel passed away in 1934 and Ed in 1947. They are both buried at Boise, Idaho.

Born in Weiser, Idaho in 1909, Frances Roden married Wesley Reid in 1933. They had one son, James, who was born in 1940 and grew up in Idaho and Oregon. Wesley died in 1942 and Frances moved to Pendleton, Oregon where she married Martin Kreutz in 1943. The had a son, Dennis, born at Pendleton in 1946. Later they moved to Richland, Washington where Frances passed away in 1972. Dennis married Kathie Kopp in 1966 and they have seven children: Michael, born in 1967, Jeffrey, born in 1969, Kristi, born in 1972, Shawna, born in 1974, Scott, born in 1976, Brian, born in 1978 and Chad, born in 1978.

Frank Roden

Frank Roden, who remained a bachelor, was the sixth child of Johan Gustafson and his wife. He was born in 1866. He mined in Montana and Alaska. In 1919 he moved to Vancouver where he worked for the S.P.& S. Railroad on the section crew and as a flagman, where the tracks cross on 8th Street. He lived in a house near the bridge that was on 26th Street and has since been demolished. Later he bought a home on the northwest corner of 9th & Jefferson. Frank was the only one of the family who returned to Sweden, making a trip in 1907 to help his mother relocate after the death of his father. He died in 1932 and is buried in Park Hill Cemetery.

Andy Roden

The seventh of the Gustafson children, was Andy Roden, born in 1870. He settled in Butte, Montana and owned a grocery store there. He married Kate Lewis, who had a daughter, Annie. After Kate's death he remarried. He died in 1961 and is buried in Butte, Montana.

Will Roden

The youngest of the Gustafson children was Will Roden. He was born in 1871 and came to the United States at the age of fifteen. Will served in the Spanish American War, was wounded ad received a lifetime pension. In 1905

he married Annie Lewis, Andy Roden's fourteen year old step-daughter. They had a son, Bill, and around 1908 they separated. He drove a team in Butte, Montana and for tourist at Yellowstone Park. Years later he married Dagne, and they lived for many years in the Vancouver-Orchards area. For a time they lived at Taft, Oregon and following his wife's death, Will moved to Boise, Idaho. In 1953 he passed away and is buried there.


Bill Roden, son of Will Roden and Annie Lewis, was born at Butte, Montana in 1907. He was raised by his Uncle Ed and Aunt Ethel Roden and grew up in Idaho. In 1927 he married Dorothy Craig and they lived for a few years in Vancouver. They had two children, Bill and Sharon. Bill worked for the State Highway Department, as a salesman for a liquor company, and had a dude ranch in Sawtooth, Montana. He died in 1982 and is buried at Boise, Idaho. Dorothy still resides there.

Bill Roden Jr. was born at Camas, Washington in 1929 and grew up in Vancouver and in Boise, Idaho. He graduated from Idaho State University, receiving his law degree in 1953. In 1950 he was married to Betty Hill and they have two children, Belinda born 1957 and Timothy born 1959. They continue to live at Boise.

Married to Richard Mansfield, Belinda has three children: LeAnne, born in 1979, James, born in 1985, and Jason, born in 1986. Her family lives in Vancouver, B.C.

Tim graduated from Wyoming University and taught special education for several years. He is currently Director of Product Development for Health Education in Seattle, Washington.

Bill and Dorothy's daughter, Sharon, was born at Nampa, Idaho in 1932 and grew up at Boise. She married Calvin White in 1953 and they have a son Craig. Calvin died in 1956 and in 1958 Sharon married Bob Beaver. They have two sons: Scott, born in Boise in 1959, and Bryon, born in Boise in 1964. Sharon teachers school in Boise. Craig is a doctor. He and his wife Carolyn have two children: Sean, born in 1983 and Kristi, born in 1985. The family all lives in Boise, Idaho.

RICHARD GRAFTON: MORE STUMBLIN' LUCK

In early March, while browsing through the April issue of *Colonial Home*, I turned to an article titled "The Stanley-Whitman House of Farmington, Connecticut," and determined that these Whitmans were kin folks of the Whitman family that I was related to by marriage.

I wrote to Ms. Jean M. Martin, Director/Curator of The Stanley-Whitman House, a National Historic Landmark, explaining my genealogical interest in that particular Whitman family and asked for more information, inclosing a SASE for her reply.

On March 28, I received a reply from Ms. Martin. She had enclosed a one page copy of descendants of the Rev. Samuel Whitman, the one-time owner of the house, and a copy of a page form "History of the Descendants of John Whitman of Weymouth, Mass." by Charles H. Farnum, published in 1889.

Of interest to me in this information was a brief bio of Perrin Beza Whitman, giving date and place of birth and date of marriage to Priscilla Mace Parker, my great aunt. The bio also included the date and place of Priscilla's birth in Greenbriar, VA (now WV).

This information was particularly welcome since I had never been able to determine just where great grandfather Samuel Parker had lived in Virginia (West Virginia).

An intriguing piece of information was the name of Mace used with my great grandmother, Elizabeth Mace Parker; my family records have always listed her as "Elizabeth M. Sutton." I never knew what the initial "M" stood for. Could Mace have been her maiden name? Had g-grandmother Elizabeth been married once before? One answered question always seems to pose another.

I have also been enabled to fill in bits and pieces of my Whitman kin, add another branch to that family, put full names to Perrin's and Priscilla's children and their spouses (not just initials).

I suppose the point I'm trying to make is not to be afraid to write an inquiry. Most people are only too happy to help you out - just don't forget that SASE.

COUSINS FOUND AMONG CCGS MEMBERSHIP

Pat Bauer is one of our members who found a cousin among CCGS membership! By exchanging information with Lois Godier, Pat was able to fill in one line of her family tree. Here's her story:

I always put anything else aside when the *Trail Breakers* arrives at my house and when Volume 17 No. 3 (Spring 1991) arrived I went through my usual ritual of reading it from cover to cover. When I reached Lois Godier's ancestor chart I announced to my husband that I had found a distant cousin, then immediately called Lois.

I am related to her through Richard Belden/Belding. My ancestor was Samuel belden and her (Lois's) grandparent (several times removed) was William . . . both sons of Richard Belding. Shortly after I called Lois, another distant cousin (Barbara Jones, CCGS member living in Salem, OR) called her. Barbara descends from Richard's third son, John Belding. Richard came to the U.S. in 1630 with three sons and the three of us, one descending from each son, have found each other here in the Clark County Genealogical Society. I think it's pretty unusual.

We have pooled our information and I put it into my computer in my "Family Roots" program. There are 96 pages of standard charts when I print the chart from my grandparent (Samuel) back as far as I have it in the computer. Then, there is a two page chart from one of the publications in our library which takes us back another 100 generations to Adam and Eve!

I am also related to Lois through the Foote family and probably through the Fitch family.

Volunteer Spotlight

The organizer and first President of Clark County Genealogical Society, Margaretta Maude Zimmerman, is a descendant of Clark County pioneers. She was born at Salmon Creek on August 31, 1911 to Martha Estella Tenny and Arthur Holabert Brown.

Her great grandparents, Joseph Hill Goddard and Hester Ann Hendricks, came west by covered wagon in 1852 and settled in Clark County on a donation land claim at Salmon Creek. He was a member of the Territorial Legislature and walked to sessions at Olympia. Hester Goddard started Salmon Creek School.

After graduating from Vancouver High School in 1928, Margaretta attended Northwestern School of Commerce in Portland, Oregon. Later she secured a civil service job working for Columbia National Forest Service from 1933 until 1941. She was married to Arbra Wayne Zimmerman at St. James Parish House on September 20, 1933 by Rev. Fr. John B. Egan. The son of Clark County pioneers, Edward Gabriel Zimmerman and Martha Higdon, Arbra was born at Glenwood on March 17, 1904. Living on the farm their entire married life, they ran a chicken hatchery and sold eggs. Together they raised a family of six children.

The busy life on the farm with a growing family was reason enough for her decision to relinquish her job and remain at home. In 1966 Margaretta was selected as Clark County Mother of the Year, the same honor received several years earlier by her mother, Martha Tenny, who had eleven children.

The Zimmerman children were all born in Vancouver. The eldest, Mary Frances, was born on March 22, 1938 and is in charge of the chemistry laboratory at Providence hospital in Portland where she has worked for thirty-one years. Mary is single and lives at Glenwood with her mother. The next child, Carol Jeanne, was born on her mother's birthday August 31, 1941, and married Ross M. McFadyen. She is director of a nursing program in Sheridan, Wyoming. The first son, Edward Arthur, was born June 2, 1943 and is married to Mary Elizabeth Aylmer. He teaches in the math department of Tacoma Community College. Donald Leland was born August 3, 1945 and is married to Faye Ida Adolphson. He is employed as a machinist at Spokane Diesel. Raymond Mark was born February 16, 1950 and is married to Arlene Elaine Brown. William Frederick, the youngest of the clan, was born on August 28, 1953 and is married to Margaret Lee Tribe. Bill is the farmer in the family. There are twelve grandchildren, six boys and six girls, and one great grandchild.

A member of Daughters of the Pioneers of Washington since 1959, Margaretta has served in many capacities, including State Historian and President. She is a member of numerous organizations including Ft. Vancouver Historical Society, D.A.R. and the Mayflower Society. She has long had an interest in local history and has been an active participant in its preservation. Her contributions made in the P.T.A. and Lay Advisory Council of the Battle Ground School District won her the Golden Acorn Award in 1968. In 1987 she received a pin and a certificate of recognition from Clark County Auditor, Liz Luce, for having participated as a Washington State voter for 55 years.

Margaretta still lives on the sixty acre farm at Glenwood that she came to as a bride. During their first twenty-five years of marriage the Zimmermans lived in the house that Arbra was born in. The Zimmerman farm is a Centennial Farm, and has been in the family for five generations. Arbra's grandparents, Gabriel Zimmerman and Janette Vincent, were the first of the family to come to Clark County in 1872. They donated land for the first school at Glenwood. Arbra, passed away on October 22, 1980 and is buried in the Goddard Cemetery at Salmon Creek.

Through her enthusiasm and devotion to the job as C.C.G.S. membership chairman this year, Margaretta has increased the society's membership roll to an all time high. We are truly appreciative of this outstanding volunteer.
