

Mildred E. McNeal Porter, 78. died at her home Sunday, Sept. 27. after a brief battle with cancer.

Mrs. Porter, a homemaker, had lived in Vancouver since 1967. She was born Feb. 27, 1914, in Marion, Ore. She was a charter member, past president and editor of the Clark County Geneological Society.

Her husband, Roscoe, died in 1986.

Survivors include one daughter, Karen "Kyp" Luse of Vancouver; one brother, Stanley G. McNeal of San Diego; and one sister, Ruth Clay of Vancouver.

A funeral will begin at 11 a.m. Wednesday at Memorial Gardens Funeral Chapel, with burial following in Evergreen Memorial Gardens Cemetery.

Special honor is given to past Trail Breakers' editor Mildred Porter who died early this fall. At age 63 she took on two years of editing our magazine (87-88 and 88-89). Mildred was also honored by being the first person to appear in our Volunteer Spotlight column (p. 21, Fall 1987, Vol. 14, No. 1). As a charter member in 1974, she served our society from its beginnings. Mildred served as our second President and held many other positions: Librarian, Printer, Researcher, Membership Chairman, Directory Editor, Trail Breakers Editor, Compiler of CCGS's first cemetery book (Old City Cemetery of Vancouver) and compiler and typist of the 1850 & 1860 Census of Clark County. She has been a continual inspiration for excellence in our society and she will be missed. Thanks, Mildred, for your dedication.



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

McKee Descendants

Many records of my ancestors on my father's side were destroyed during the Civil War in 1922 in Ireland. The earliest reference to the name Pinkerton was in Ballymoney in the Hearthstone Roll for County Antrim in 1666. The name was on a list of people who paid tax on the number of hearths in their homes. The Pinkertons were talented and industrious. Several were educators and others became successful land owners and farmers.

James Pinkerton was born in 1762, probably in Ballymoney, County Antrim, Northern Ireland. He married and moved to Lloydtown, York County, Ontario, Canada in about 1820. He had eight children. One of the daughters, Agnes, was born in 1802, and married James Galloway Sr. on September 18, 1820. Twelve children, eight boys and four girls were born of that union. The third child was James Jr., born February 13, 1822. James married Mary A. Lang, born March 16, 1837. They had twelve children, the

third being Mary Elizabeth "Lib" Galloway, born August 5, 1855 in Port Huron, Michigan.

In researching the Galloway name I learned the name belonged to a sect of folks included in the Clan MacFarlane. The MacFarlane group is shown in only one area along the shore of the northern portion of Loch Lomand northwest of Glasgow, Scotland. The wife of my great great grandfather was from the Dunbarton sector east of Edinburgh, During the religious persecutions of "Bloody Mary" many of those people moved over to northern Ireland.


My grandfather and grandmother, William Sylvester McKee and his wife, Mary Elizabeth Galloway had five children. Three were born in Michigan; Charles Westley in 1876, died from a hit on the head by a baseball when he was fourteen years old; Mary Elizabeth "Bessie", born in 1880; George Adam, born in 1881, died in Portland, Oregon in 1949. The last two, James Rudolph born in 1883, and my father, William Arthur "Art" born in 1886, were born in Vancouver, Washington.

Evidently my grandparents moved west from Michigan to the Vancouver area in about 1882. Possibly they traveled by train but my father said several pieces of furniture that we had as late as 1950 had been "shipped around the horn." One large wooden chest is the only relic left in the family.

The old McKee home was located on East Reserve Street across from what is now Clark College. My grandfather worked for the Vancouver City Water Works near the blind school. During the flu epidemic of 1918-1919, both of my grandparents contracted the disease and my Aunt Bessie came down from Prince Rupert where she taught school, to nurse them. Both of them died within a week of each other in December 1918. Bessie returned to Prince Rupert in Canada where she too died of the flu one month later.

My father, William Arthur McKee, married Ethel Mae Beaver and they had three children. I am the oldest; Florence Elizabeth born 1915, William John "Bill" born 1917 and Herbert Westley "Herb" born in 1920. We lived in the old McKee house on East Reserve Street during the days of the first world war and my dad worked as a ship fitter in the shipyards.

I still have faint recollections of living there on East Reserve Street. The area where Clark College now stands was a thick forest of second growth fir trees. There was a stile over the fence just below our house and a path through the woods that led to the Barracks. This was a short cut on the way to town. Each evening there was a flag lowering ceremony and at precisely five o'clock the cannon was fired. I have vivid memories of seeing all this when my mother would be walking home from town with my brother, Bill and me. Some

evenings our family would go see a movie at the theater in the Barracks. My dad put my little brother on the seat of his bicycle and we walked through the woods on the pathway. It nearly scared me to death when a sentry would step out from behind a tree and shout, "Halt! Who goes there?" My dad would give his name. The sentry then gave us permission to pass. It was a spine chilling experience for me, I remember.


We lived in the old McKee home on East Reserve Street until a final settlement of the estate of my grandparents was made. At that time my Uncle Jim inherited that property. We moved out to Fern Prairie where the parcel of land that my dad inherited was located. My mother was pregnant at the time of the move and she suffered a miscarriage, She was in the hospital in Vancouver for awhile. Because of complications she developed blood poisoning. Since there was no hope for her recovery, my father took her to the home of some friend named Dumas, in East Vancouver. That is where she died on the 31st of December 1922. I was seven and a half years old at the time. Bill was almost six and Herb was only a year and a half.

My education started in the old Harney School in East Vancouver which my dad had attended when he was a boy. After the move to Fern Prairie, Bill and I went to school there. My dad took my baby brother, Herb, with him in the truck since he was too young to attend school. My dad was a wood dealer during most of my "growing up" years. He later became a dairy farmer.


I married Charles Burton Clemans, the son of the local methodist minister there in Fern Prairie. Our first son, Charles Arthur was born in 1934. William Herbert was born in 1936 and the twins, Lois Elizabeth and Lloyd Burton were born in 1939. My husband, known as "Chic", worked in the Camas Paper Mill until his death in 1978.

Charles Arthur "Chuck", our first born, married Marjorie Zent of Vancouver. They have two sons, Glen and Dean. Chuck graduated from Clark College, Portland State College, then went on and earned his PHD in education. He and Marjorie divorced and each remarried. Chuck is now married to Nancy Hungerford, an attorney in Oregon City, Oregon.


Our second son, William Herbert "Bill", graduated from Clark College and Washington State College at Pullman. He majored in chemical engineering. He later graduated from MIT training on the east coast. He married a girl from Richland, Washington and they moved to the

east coast where their three children were born. Their names are Warren, Burton and Shellaine. When Shellaine was still a baby, they longed to be back in the northwest. They moved to Kennewick, Washington where Bill has worked at the United Nuclear Industries, Inc. as a supervisor. Their two boys have both finished college.

Lois married Neil Buhman. Neil is the son of Wayne and Eva Buhman of Camas, Washington. Neil graduated from Washington State College with a degree in music. He and Lois have two children, Cynthia "Cindy" and Tad. Cindy is married to a professional football player. They have three children. Tad is married and had two children. Lois finished her college after the children were in school and went into teaching.

Lloyd married Gail Weakley of Camas and they have two children, Scott and Tiffany. After Lloyd and Gail were divorced, Lloyd married Diane McMorrow and they have three children, Jeremy, Amanda and Adam.


I have no recollection of my Uncle Charles Westley McKee because he died before I was born. Also, I do not remember Aunt Bessie as she died when I was only four years old. My Uncles George and Jim lived in the Vancouver area and their children are the ones I remember most. Uncle George married Emma Weigle. The Weigels were well known in Vancouver. There was a Weigle's Grocery on Main Street just below the old C. C. Store. Uncle George had a prune orchard out in Fern Prairie, but he and Aunt Emma lived in N. E. Portland. They had three children. Lucile was born in 1905, Edward was born in 1907 and Robert "Bob" was born in 1910. All of them have since died.

James Rudolph "Jim" married Margaret Ann "Maggie" Clark in 1908. They had five children; Charles Robert, Helen Frances, Leah, Marjorie and Lawrence Richard "Tom." Charles married Agnes Ethel Smith. they have no children. Helen married Howard Peter Newberg and they have one child, Jill. Jill married and had two boys. Leah was married twice. Her second husband was William Huckins. He was a timber cruiser for Weyerhauser, He died of a heart attack in his sleep. They had no children. Marjorie married Ross Wilmarth and they had five children; Steven, Gregory, Wynne, David and Susan. Marge and Ross have both died. They have many grandchildren living in the northwest.

Three years after my husband died, I remarried. Lovell Groves, who had a business called "Groves Escorted Tours", hired me as a typist to help him in his office. I ended up marrying the boss. We travelled extensively for seven years escorting tours all over the world. In 1989 we retired.



Originally published 1885. 400 pages with appendix and index giving detailed emigration plans of many groups from Europe to America, especially New England. Various religious beliefs, attitudes of English and French, problems with them and native Indians are treated in detail.

A Bibliography of American County Histories. Compiled by P. William R016 Filbin. Baltimore: Genealogical Publishing Co. 1985. Presented by Jerri St. John. A state by state listing of about 5000 county histories.

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
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
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
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
