

ON THE SUBJECT OF THE OREGON TERRITORY

Articles printed in the eastern papers helped spread concern for the Oregon Territory. The following is a letter copied from the Boston Mercantile Journal by The Erie Observer 13 Feb 1841, Vol XI #38, James Buchanan Printer & Publisher, French Street, Erie, PA. (Contributed by Gerry Gilman.)

AFFAIRS IN OREGON

The author of the letter below is a citizen of Boston - at the time a resident at Honolulu, the chief town and mart of the Sandwich Islands, where he owns considerable shipping, and carried on an extensive trade.

For several years he was engaged in a profitable commerce on the shores of Oregon. About the years 1832, he, with the other American merchants withdrew from that coast, their trade being almost entirely broken up by the monopolizing power of the Hudson Bay Company.

Mr. P. [Henry Pierce] is a true I have had much American. acquaintance with him. I saw and knew much of him while at the Islands in 1835. Others, with myself, can bear honorable testimony to his worth, his public examples of generous and noble testimony to his worth, his public examples of generous and noble actions it is due Mr. Pierce and the country, to speak thus particularly of his character and a knowledge of the facts in his letter, as well as of others which may follow them in a subsequent paper being of real importance to the interests of our citizens. They are true, and should be published throughout the land.

Honolulu, Oahu, Sandwich Islands March 18, 1840 HALL J KELLY, ESO. BOSTON:

Dear Sir -- I have received the pamphlet of documents relating to the action of Congress on the subject of the Oregon Territory. Please receive my thanks for the same. Is it not astonishing that our Government should show so much apathy on the question of taking possession of and colonizing a territory clearly ours, by

discovery, by purchase from the Indians, and by former settlement of Jacob Astor's People. Our country are little aware of the monopolizing, grasping, ambitious spirit of the British Hudson Bay Company in this part of the world.

Look what they have done, are now doing, and intend to do. They have for two years past been increasing the number of men at Fort Vancouver, on the Columbia River. A month since a vessel of theirs took from here eighty natives of these Islands, ostensibly for the purpose of farming, &c, but really to increase their military force at the Columbia, and to resist any attempts on the part of our people or government from dispossesing the Company of the occupancy of that place.

A large number of Saxony sheep have been imported into the Columbia for breed. Last year they imported 800 sheep from California for the like object.

It is reported here and generally believed that the H.B. Company intend to establish a colony in Puget's Sound, Straits of Juan de Fuca. Two more ships are to be added to the company's marine in the North Pacific, for the purpose of extending their operations to these islands and China, and if possible monopolizing the trade of the whole "North Pacific." You well know they have already succeeded in respect to the Fur trade of the North-west coast and I have to tell you that they have now succeeded in monopolizing the trade to the Russian settlements at the Norfolk Sound, &c. The Company have contracted to furnish them with any of the products of England and Europe at about 30 per cent on the prime cost, an advance hardly sufficient to cover the charge;

but the object of the company will be obtained viz to destroy the American commerce on the whole coast of the Northwest.

A Company's vessel will leave this and each succeeding year from the Columbia to Norfolk Sound with a large contract of flour, wheat, beef, pork, butter, &c -- actually realizing some of your mad projects! Last year a fine coal mine was somewhere about Puget Sourd, and 150 to 200 tons of the same was taken to England for sale by one of the Company's vessels as much probably for ballast as for profit.

I might write a volume on the subject of this latest. But enough has been stated to show that unless some of the energetic character of the "old General" is shown by the present President, our trade in this part of the world instead of increasing much be destroyed by the overpowering capital of the H.B. Company, our rights as to the sovereignty over the Oregon territory laughed at, and our character as a nation become a byword to the world. Do for the honor of our country what you can to arouse our government to the great importance of an immediate military occupancy of the Oregon Territory and the establishment of its northern bounds.

You may make such use of the letter, (written in haste) as you think proper.

John B. Lindsay was born in Harrison County, Ohio on Christmas Day 1820. He later migrated to Iowa. Leaving his wife and children behind in Muscatine County, Iowa, John set out for the Oregon Country, planning to send for them once he was established there. He arrived in 1849 and settled on a donation land claim of 319.80 acres located along the Columbia River in Clark County, Washington, on what is now Lower River Road. During his absence, his wife and three of their children died of cholera, and the two children that lived never came west. The known children by this marriage were: Thomas, Susanna, Elizabeth and John Lindsay.

John took for his second wife, Mary Elizabeth Strouse/Strause, the daughter of John and Rachel Strouse. Her mother was born in Pennsylvania about 1824. Mary Elizabeth was born in Iowa on October 4, 1842, and came to Clark County at the age of ten with her mother in 1852. The family had left Iowa with a team of six oxen, two cows and two wagons. Following a night of guard duty during the journey west, her father died of cholera along the Platte River. Her mother, who was frail and sick, did not have the means to hire a driver and sold a team and wagon. In desperation she accepted the offer of marriage from a Mr. Black. At the Cascades he traded the last of their oxen for the passage of Rachel and Mary Elizabeth to Sandy, Oregon Territory, and left the wagon there. He helped some of the others in the party travel overland and re-joined them at Sandy where they found shelter in an old shack, the first roof over their heads in six long months. They decided to cross the Columbia River to Washougal. During the crossing, the boat capsized, the boatman was able to rescued Rachel and her daughter, but Mr. Black was never seen again.

Rachel secured employment with David Parker at Parker's Landing and worked for him for several months. In 1853 they moved to Vancouver and Mary Elizabeth attended school at the home of Marshall Hathaway for three months. In those early days, Vancouver was a tiny village, with the Hudson's Bay Company Store between the river and Vancouver Barracks. Three other stores, located on houseboats, were operated by Stevens, Barker and Hart. Samuel Marsh had a small blacksmith shop and Main Street was no more than a path. There was no bank.

While working on one of the houseboat stores, Rachel met William Goldbeck whom she married on February 5, 1855. He was born in Berlin, Germany about 1825, and came to the Oregon Country around 1849/50. He was naturalized, as a citizen of the United States, in the Clark county District Court on November 30, 1853. The Goldbecks remained in Vancouver during the Indian Wars and were members of St. Luke's Episcopal Church. Later they moved to his claim on Fourth Plain. They were the parents of four children: John Henry, who was born in 1856, Charlotte, born in 1857, Henrietta, born in 1858 and Agnes Augusta born in 1860. Charlotte was first married to John Burkhart, December 4, 1877. Her second husband was James C. Strong. They were married April 7, 1883 at St. Luke's Church. Henrietta married Thomas E. Cloud, May 19, 1875 at St. Luke's, and Agnes married George Allen on October 21, 1880. William Goldbeck passed away from pneumonia on June 18, 1893. Rachel died April 2, 1899. They are both buried in Old City Cemetery in Vancouver.

About 1856, at the age of fourteen, Mary Elizabeth married John B. Lindsay and they moved to a donation land claim on the Columbia bottom lands near Felida. After years of being flooded out, the Lindsays sold the place in 1862, and moved a 160 acre homestead west of Manor, settling in a small log cabin that had no windows and only a sack for a door. John cleared his land of the old growth Douglas fir and farmed there. Meeting the terms of the Homestead Act, he received title to his property on May 20, 1872. Eleven children were born to the Lindsays. John donated land south of Salmon Creek along the west side of the present 72nd Avenue, for the Manor Wilson Bridge Cemetery. Many members of the Lindsay family are buried there.

Mary Elizabeth was a cripple from four years of age, following an attack of black fever which shortened the tendons in her right leg. Despite her handicap and the hardships of pioneer life, she did her own work and tended her garden. When in her sixties, she suffered a fall, and as a result was confined to a wheel chair for eighteen or nineteen years. At the age of eighty-one she was still able to read and thread a needle without glasses.

John Lindsay served on the first Grand Jury to convene in Clark County on September 7, 1852. During the Indian Wars of 1855-56, he was a Private under Captain William Kelly in Company "A" of the Washington Mounted Scouts. Later he was in Captain Hamilton J. G. Maxon's Second Regiment of Washington Mounted Rifles in the Puget Sound region. The military records of 1856 describe him as age 35, blue eyes, light hair, light complexion, born Ohio and occupation farmer.

John died at the age of seventy-seven on March 6, 1897, and his wife received a widow's pension for his service in the Indian Wars. His property was divided among the children following Mary Elizabeth's death on September 16, 1925. The Lindsays are buried in the Manor Wilson Bridge Cemetery.



JOSEPH BENJAMIN AYMOND

A TRAVELER OVER THE OREGON TRAIL


My¹ Great Grandfather Nasciquant Francois Aymond was born in 1797 and was in Napoleon's Army. With his wife and his son Francois who was born 1826, he migrated from France in 1831 and settled in St. Louis, Missouri. They had four children in St. Louis, one of which was my grand-father Joseph Benjamin Aymond, born Oct. 28th, 1833.

After the revolution of 1830, no mention about this officer, not in the annuaries nor the bulletins of law. Pierre François Aymond and son are crossed out on the list if emigrants.

The name "Nasciquant" was given to Pierre Francois Aymond by the revolutionists in France plus other references to his serving in Napoleon's Army. Nasciquant is latin and means "High Born."

As a young man Joseph had T.B. (Consumption) and was, according to the doctor, going to die in less than a year. A friend of his father's who had been trading with the Sioux for years offered to take the boy with him for a year and said he would bring him back to St. Louis whole and hearty. The Indian cure included raw buffalo liver and blood, immersions from steam to ice water, etc. After a years time he brought him back to St. Louis healed. The boy's father tried to put him into shoes and white man's clothing and send him back to school, but Joseph had decided that the frontier life was what he wanted so he returned again to the Indian Territories with the trader.

He became a true frontiersman, very skilled in horsemanship, hunting, fishing and all the skills necessary to survive. He worked as a wagonmaster, a teamster, an Indian Scout for the Union Army, and drove a stage coach for Wells Fargo as far west as Denver. He could butcher, shoot, use a whip or fight with the best of them. He spoke several Indian dialects. He knew such people as Sitting Bull, General Custer, Wild Bill Hicock, etc. Joseph had a long barrelled rifle and also a short barrel pearl handled pistol.

This began his life on the frontier where he seemed to have spent most of his time. He went back and forth to St. Louis when he wanted to.

I went to the University of Victoria and found 10 Volumes of "The Mountain Men and the Fur Traders of the far West," and in the Chapter of Seth E. Ward (pages 357-383) at Fort Laramie, Wyoming, it said "J. Aymond and Chas. Gurue are also listed as traders with Guerrier" There were a great many men mentioned in these 10 Volumes! Joseph Aymond was mostly called "Frenchy." Many men were called "Frenchy."

On September 28th, 1858, Joseph went back to St. Louis and married Victoire Laperche. They had 4 children in St. Louis, in between trips to the frontier. In 1874 Joseph decided that he and his brother Capt. Frank would homestead in Neche, Dakota Territory. Joseph then went to Cavalier, the County

Oregon Trail Celebration

Ft. Vancouver was often the place where settlers coming across the Oregon Trail would rest up before moving on. In the early days, it was the only place to get provisions that had run out on the trip west. Many of the travelers did not arrived until late fall, too late to "find a place" and plants crops. Many, thinking this would be a temporary stay ended up settling in Clark county.

Joseph moved all his family to Neche. Once he got them settled, he took a Wagontrain on the Oregon Trail to Vancouver, Canada², which is now Vancouver, Washington. By this time Joseph knew his way around the country very well. Victorie was upset; actually all the family were upset because he left them again -- and all this area were new to them. And they would get up in the morning and find Indians asleep on the kitchen floor! This never happened in St. Louis! However, these Indians were friends of Joseph's and never hurt them.

When Joseph came home, he and Victorie had two more children. Victorie died March 30th 1878. On October 11th, 1881, Joseph Aymond and Catherine Bauer went to Pembina, Dakota Territory, and got married. Catherine was thirty years younger than Joseph. Catherine had ten children, of which eight survived. (My mother, Celeste Ann Aymond Ziegler, was one of them.)

As Joseph grew older (in his second marriage), he used to sit before the fire in the winter evenings and tell the children if his experiences on the frontier.

My Grandfather Joseph died June 6th 1913, and my Grandmother Catherine died August 12th, 1941, both at Neche. Only one of the children is still living at age 92.

My Mother Celeste married Carl Frederick Ziegler from Gretna, Manitoba, at Neche. My Father was in the Army in Winnipeg - the first War. After the war, they moved to Transcona - seven miles east of Winnipeg - and we went to the Catholic School where the Nuns were all from Quebec.

We all learned French at School, all four of us! Which was nice because the Aymonds were French. During July and August, our four children spent our time on my Grandmother's farm at Neche. And then during the winter my Grandmother came and lived with us, because the snow was so deep on the farm that she and her son Fred were marooned!



Salmon Creek Methodist Cemetery Update

Originally part of the Goddard donation land claim, the property was deeded to the Salmon Creek Methodist Church in 1893. Burials in this pioneer cemetery dated back to the 1850s.

In 1982, Clark County Genealogical Society published the tombstones recorded for the cemetery in volume two of Clark County Cemeteries. At that time we were unable to research the records kept by the church. Recently our member Deenie Nugent sent us a copy of the cemetery with additional information taken from the records. 


