

One afternoon while working in the library, I pulled a book from the Iowa section, A MEMORIAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL RECORD OF IOWA, Vol. II, published in 1896. And, as usual, I checked the index to see if any names therein where mine. Sure enough, there was a Rachel Foley, a sister to my 2nd greatgrandmother, listed who had married a William F. Lowry. The narrative about Mr. Lowry included a paragraph about Rachel's family and it was from her information that I learned the name of her grandparents, Daniel Foley and Katherine Rock. upon writing to Dallas Co., Iowa's genealogical

society, I amassed a wealth of material about her parents, John Foley and Sarah Haworth, from the genealogist who responded to my query and she discovered that we are fourth cousins, twice removed, in our Haworth line. Therefore, I now have Sarah's line completed BUT, sadly, Daniel Foley remains "lost" in history at this time! Like all genealogists, though, hope springs eternal that he will eventually surface someday in some unexpected way.

Premise: "Did William Kidd Best Search for Smugglers"

My great grandfather, William Kidd Best, was born in upper state New York in 1837 and died in Cloud County, KS, in 1918. His obituary stated that he had volunteered for the Civil War, served with New York's 106th Regiment, and was wounded at Cold Harbor, VA. The obituary went on to say that he had been a guard of the assassin of Lincoln, that he had served as a secret service agent responsible for catching smugglers, and that he had moved to Kansas, married and farmed for the remainder of his life.

His military service and years spent in the Midwest have been proven reliably by pension records, land deeds, etc., but that portion of his obituary - the secret service career at a customs house in Oswegatchie, NY, across the Saint Lawrence River from what was then the Dominion of Canada - was subject to speculation.

My wife, Maryalice, and I were attending the 1993 National Genealogical Conference in Baltimore, MD, during the first week of June, 1993. One of the workshops I attended was "National Archives Finding Aids; Preliminary Inventories, Guides, Checklists, and Other Useful Publications." I thought, "Why not prove that William Kidd Best served the government as a customs agent." I knew that his service would have to have been between 1865 and 1868 before he migrated to Kansas. We were going to spend a few days in Washington, DC before heading west in our RV (we are full time travelers), so why not visit the National Archives and try to locate the applicable records. My curiosity and the fact that I was in the right place at the right time, allowed me to confirm the actual circumstances of William's service.

I utilized the Guide to the National Archives of the United States to locate the appropriate area: the Records of the Bureau of Customs (Record Group 36). Two different subgroupings seemed to be the perfect places to start research. The first was entitled "Records of the Division of Special Agents including letters sent to special agents, 1861-1915, regarding special appraisals, smuggling, illegal entry, and procedures." The second area for likely research was entitled "Records of the Customhouses or Collection Districts on the Great Lakes and Canadian Border. 1799-1925... New York:... Oswegatchie, 1867-1912."

At the National Archives I registered and was referred to an archivist for that particular are of interest, the Department of the Treasury. I completed a form listing my specific areas of interest. The archivist stated that this was going to be an interesting research problem. The first group of records was assembled from the archives and delivered to

the second floor reading room, a very controlled area. Maryalice and I carefully looked through the various original ledgers and letters looking for evidence of William Kidd's service in customs, and although the archival material made for interesting reading, it did not produce any evidence of my great grandfather.

We visited again with the archivist who said he had some other areas that might work. After spending an in-between day at the Daughter's of the American Revolution (DAR) Library, we came back to the 2nd floor reading room, signed for a library cart full of leather bound ledgers and letters filed in cardboard holders. Within a short time we made our discovery - a transmittal letter with attachments from the Collector of Customs in Ogdensburgh, New York, to the Secretary of Treasury in Washington, DC This transmittal listed all of the employees of the custom house for transmittal listed all of the employees of this custom house for the months of August, September, October, and November, 1866. William Kidd Best was first appointed as a Watchman on the 14th of August, 1866 and made \$2.00 per day. In November of 1866 he was being paid \$2.50 per day with his occupation listed as an Inspector and Secret Detective. (It is interesting to note that female inspectors were being paid \$1.50 per day.)

I had made my find in three days of research at the National Archives. I was told by the archivist that writing ahead to identify the area of research is preferable on their part, but in this instance it worked for me. The cost for this valuable research was the amount spent on the photocopies. While researching to locate William Kidd Best, I came upon an interesting National Archive Microfilm Roll #M497, entitled "The Commissioners of Customs Relation to Smuggling 1865-1869." This film contained copies of letters written to the field from Washington, DC and described official government policy regarding the problems of smuggling from Canada to the united States. The attached letter and a transcribed copy make interesting reading.

If you are ever in Washington, DC don't spend all of your time on the 4th floor with your head buried in a microfilm reader looking at census, military, and/or pension records. If you want to do some basic research with actual documents, maybe the evidence of your ancestor's existence is contained in the archival records stored in that wonderful building.

My next research: Was William Kidd Best a guard for John Wilkes Booth?

Pioneer Life in the 1860s

(the Continuing Story of Louisa John)

Previous chapters appeared in Trail Breakers Vol. 19, No. 4, Vol 20, Nos. 1 and 3

After the Latter-day Saints left the Pacific Northwest at the request of Brigham Young in 1857, Louisa remained behind, but firm in her testimony of the church. Elder David M. Stuart, who had gone on down the Willamette Valley as far as North Fork, near Eugene, heard of the problems back at the Lewis River and he returned to see if he could pull the branch back together. [See Vol. 19, No. 4] He first met John Shaw Bozarth at the Pekin Ferry boat landing. Shaw was a former member, who told him: "I cannot be harassed any longer and I've left the Church. The Saints have been called together and Solomon Strong made a motion that all those who wanted to comply with the resolution of the mob and not be driven from the territory, keep their seats and all who wish to continue with the Church and suffer the consequences rise to their feet. Sister Louisa John Springer was the only person there who arose to her feet. All the rest submitted to the rule of the mob through fear."

Bozarth continued, "Your two Elders, Winslow and Harmon, have been warned to get out of the country. They left for Oregon." Stuart said he could do nothing with the Saints there but leave them to their fate. "I rested for awhile at the home of Louisa Springer who neither feared the mob, nor their threats." Her husband, John Springer, was in sympathy with the persecutors.

William B. Smart, a historian, wrote in 1948 of Louisa, "Whether it required more moral courage to leave home and friends and journey to a new area or to remain alone in the face of such harsh Protestant sentiment is a moot question." Further research into Louisa's life brings out more information.

In the 1860 Census of Clark County Washington, Louisa and John Springer are still married and they have a daughter, Mary Ann, age 3 months plus their son, Uriah O., age 13. Divorce records were not kept very accurately in the 1860s, and two Clark County courthouses have been burned, but it is obvious that a divorce occurred. To further support this idea, Louisa's sister, Rhoda Ruth obtained a divorce from her absent husband, John Harrison Van Beeber in 1862. The documentation was presented to the first Washington Territory

legislature by Christopher Bozarth, brother of John Shaw Bozarth, who was a member of that body in 1860-61. Christopher married Rhoda Ruth 10 Jun 1863 and raised her four children, Francis, Emma, Edith and Ida Van Beeber. They had no children together.

In 1861 Louisa's father, Jacob John, moved to East Mill Plain, near present-day Fisher's Landing, and lived there until his death Dec 10, 1863. He was buried in the Woodland Cemetery. His wife, Rachel Whitaker John is listed in the 1870 Census of Clark County as an invalid living in the household of Christopher Bozarth and Rhoda Ruth.

Louisa records that in the spring of 1859 and 60 "I kept a boarding house at the lower cascades, boarded the men who built the first railroad on this coast, the men brought the cars with them from California and set them up in my yard. It was on the Hamilton Place, and they invited me to take the first ride on the first cars that run on this coast (I did), then I moved to the Barracks [at Vancouver], the Ainsworth men were organizing the O.R.N. at that time..."

A history of the Columbia Gorge tells us more about the railroads built at that time.

.1851 Frances A. Chenowith built a wooden railed portage 2-1/2 miles long around the swift rapids on the north bank. The little rail car was pulled with a mule.

.1852 Griswold and Hamilton built an ox team road from the lower end of Chenowith's portage to the lower end of Hamilton Island. Yokes of oxen pulled freight wagons through axle deep mud from the boat landing up to the rail portage.

.1855 A military road was started from Fort Vancouver to Dalles City. The Army used pack animals so it was more of a trail than a road.

.1856 A narrow hilly road was built on the south bank from Tanner Creek to the Upper Cascades, Oregon; 6 miles for portage around the rapids by Col. Ruckle.

. 1861 Ruckle built 4 miles of wooden railed portage on the south bank with mule power.

.1862 The first steam locomotive in the northwest was placed on this wooden rail railroad...the

little 6-ton PONY, now on display at the Cascade Locks Museum.

.1863 Joel Palmer built and operated a toll trail and wagon road from the mouth of the Sandy River to the Upper Cascades on the south bank.

.1883 Construction of the O.W.R.& N. Railroad on the south bank was completed.

Louisa recorded that in 1863-64 she went to La Grande and married A. B. Ingram, a Deputy Sheriff of Baker County, Oregon. She said he was commissioned by Governor Gibbs of Portland in the United States Infantry, 1st Volunteers of Oregon, and sent to The Dalles in June. After that his unit went to Canyon City and laid out Camp Logan. He held the rank of Captain. Also in 1864 a Mr. Backman purchased the Donation Land Claim owned by Jacob John.

There was another family who lived at Fisher's Landing headed by Moses Goodwin. Goodwin family owned a hotel called Alta House in Vancouver. There is an unnamed infant Goodwin in a small graveyard at Fisher. The Goodwins are listed in the 1860 Census of Clark County. Another family named Raley moved to Mill Plains, seven miles above Vancouver on the Columbia River in the spring The father engaged in freighting from Umatilla Landing. In the spring of 1864 he moved his family to Umatilla Landing. After the Goodwin's sold their hotel in Vancouver they and moved to the Umatilla-Pendleton area and they established the first hotel in Pendleton and also donated the land where the first county courthouse was built. After Moses Goodwin died, his wife, Aura, married J. H. Raley. Louisa's brother, Summeral Ambrose married Olive Goodwin at Umatilla, Oregon on 21 March 1865.

Now, the relationships get interesting. The Muster Roll of the First Regiment, Oregon Infantry Volunteers stationed at Fort Dalles, Oregon, dated April 30, 1865 lists No. 17 John Ingram, Pvt. born Tippecanoe Co. Indiana, age 26, Teamster; and No. 35, Uriah O. Springer, Pvt. born Muhaska Co. Iowa, age 18, farmer. Both enlisted on 2 Jan 1865 at La Grande by Lt. A. B. Ingram, for a period of 3 years. A description of Springer says he had blue eyes, auburn hair, light complexion, height 5'3½". He received \$300 for enlisting.

The Muster Roll of Aug 31, 1865 for Captain A. B. Ingram lists Springer but not John Ingram. The next Muster Roll of Oct 31, 1865 for Capt. A. B. Ingram says that No. 1893 Ingram, John, 1st Sgt.... Remarks dated Sept. 7, 1865 - Sgt. Ingram in arrest."

The same records tells us that No. 1, A. B. Ingram, Capt. joined June 22, 1865 at Fort Dalles, Ogn. by Ist Lt. Wm. Kaparz, mustered June 22, 1865, same. The remarks state he was conditionally mustered in as 2nd Lt., 1st Orgon Infantry Dec. 19.

1864 by 1st Lt. William Kaparz., Capt. (of same unit) by Gov. in June 1865.

The Muster roll covering the period Dec 31, 1865 through Feb. 28, 1866 at Camp Logan, Oregon lists No. 53 Uriah O. Springer on furlough until March 12, 1866. The same muster roll shows John Ingram, Sgt. discharged as of November 1, 1865 as a deserter from C.G.D. 2nd Cal. Inf. placed under arrest Nov. 1st-65, restored to duty without trial per 8.6 No. 1 Headquarters Dept. of the Columbia, Jan 2, 1866, discharged Feb. 19, 1866 per B.C. No. 22 from headquarters, Dept. of Columbia for ordinance retained S.G. 101 dated Washington D.C. May 20, 1865.

The Oregon Historical Quarterly, Vol. 45, p. 50 (Mar-Dec. 1944) tells us that Camp Logan located in Grant County was established during the Indian troubles in the summer of 1865. The compiler was not able to get the date it was occupied or when it was abandoned, but" it was not long in use and not a large camp. "William M. Hilleary, in recollections in the Oregon Historical Society library, says the camp was established by Lieutenant A. B. Ingram of the First Oregon Volunteer Infantry and quarters were built for 40 men. This was in August or September, 1865. The place is mentioned in the Oregon Adjutant General's Report, 1865-66, but no details are given."

In January of 1944, R. H. Sullens of Prairie City, Oregon wrote that Camp Logan was on Strawberry Creek about six miles south of Prairie City near what is now the Roger Kent ranch. This information agrees with War Department maps, although the stream was apparently known in 1865 as Indian Creek and later as Logan Creek.

Louisa's account says that Ingram went to the Dalles, in June was sent on special duty, taking everything out of the Government Quarters at the Dalles; went to Canyon City laid out Camp Logan and built quarters for the winter 15 miles from Canyon City, not a house there to Camp Harney.

"I slept many a night with gun in hand looking every moment to be fired on by the Indians; my husband gone with all his men after the Indians; I have seen 3 months at a time never seeing a white womans face, caring for the sick and wounded, stopping there until the close of the war."

The final muster roll of Company K is dated Jun 25, 1866 at Fort Vancouver, Washington Territory, It was mustered out of service in pursuance of telegram dated "Headquarters Military Division of the Pacific, San Francisco, Cal. May 21, 1866." No. 1, A.B. Ingram, Capt. discharged per S.O. (special order) No. 17 dated headquarters, Div. of the Pacific, San Francisco, Calif. March 6, 1866 (served under Col. George B. Curry). No. 38 Uriah O. Springer, Pvt. is listed. John Ingram, Sergeant again listed as a deserter. (J. Ingram sent on order to Ft. Vancouver at the same time that Uriah Springer was on furlough).

John Springer, Louisa's first husband, took another wife Henrietta (Martin) Redding on December 5, 1865. She had one child at the time.

Louisa and A.B. Ingram lived at Vancouver for at least a couple of years. He is included with a list of newly installed officers of the Vancouver Lodge No. 3 I.O.O.F. (International Order of Odd Fellows) dated Jan. 11, 1868. On April 29, 1868 he witnessed a marriage. On June 20, 1868 his name appeared in a newspaper notice in the *Vancouver Register* of a "Teachers' Association" meeting to be held on July 3rd. (Remember, Louisa had been a teacher in the 1850s.)

The Vancouver Independent of February 28, 1868 carried this notice:

HOTEL CHANGES - Captain Ingram having thoroughly satisfied himself of his ability to do most everything else, is about to try the extremely hazardous experiment of hotel-keeping. the scene of his first attempt will be the Alta House.

Another notice followed a few weeks later:

THOROUGHLY SATISFIED - CAPT. INGRAM has satisfied himself that he can't keep hotel, and has withdrawn from the management of the Alta House, after a brief but brilliant experience of five weeks. We understand that the Alta will be run as a private boarding house henceforth, under the supervision of MRS. RIGGS.⁴

Louisa's narrative of 1905 says she "lived in California helping in church work and doing many good deeds."

The trail of the Ingrams was picked up again in California. The Ingram Family pioneered in Anderson Valley and the first settler's name was Uriah Ingram, the grandfather of A. B. Ingram. Family records list A.B. Ingram as Alphonso Amos Burgess INGRAM, born 18 Jan 1834 at Jackson County, Ohio. They referred to him as Amos. Amos is listed with a wife, Louisa Springer, whom he married in 1864. But they also list another wife named Elizabeth Heuraty, a widow, whom he married before 1880.

Interestingly, an Ingram descendant referred to Amos' brother Uriah John as "Useless Jack" who was "supposed to have been in the 1st OR Volunteers during the Civil War and was at The Dalles, OR about 1864-1866.

"Late in 1880, Amos, who had been teaching in the Redding area (Shasta Co. CA) with his cousins, the Lawson boys, returned to his home in Manchester. Upon his arrival he found that his second wife had gone to San Francisco because she was unhappy alone in the country. At that time there was an epidemic of smallpox in the city, and Amos, while unsuccessfully looking for his wife, became ill. His brother, Mercer, went to the city and brought him to their home in Calistoga." Amos died of smallpox on 25 Dec. 1880 and by 12 Jan 1881 both his parents, the brother Mercer and a sister, Lidia all died of the

dread disease. They weren't allowed to be buried in the Calistoga Cemetery so the family buried them on the corner of their ranch near the county road. In 1955, permission was granted by the living heirs to construct State Highway 12 over the graves.⁵

Louisa says nothing more about her life from 1868 until about 1878 when she is again back living in Vancouver. More remains to be discovered about her life and that of A. B. Ingram, such as where, and when they were divorced, and more importantly, why? The Ingram descendant says that the Ingram family came west from Council Bluffs (lowa) about 1851. An Amos Ingram was listed in the 1850 lowa Census who could be the same person. It looks like the Ingrams and Johns may have at least met each other before they came west, or met each other on the way out, as they both came in 1852.

Louisa's son, Charles Uriah Oliver Springer died August 2, 1871 at the age of 25 years. He was buried in the old Hawke Cemetery near Woodland, Washington. It isn't known what happened to her daughter--whether she died early or married in some other state. David M. Stuart's missionary journal said that John Springer wouldn't support Louisa and her two children, which was the reason for her divorce. Louisa seemed to be living alone between and after her other marriages. Louisa had baptisms and endowments performed for all her dead relatives in the Logan Temple in the late 1880s. She had work done for her son but again, there is no mention of her Since baptisms are not performed for persons who died under the age of 8 years old, this might explain the absence of her name. The other possibility is that she was still living at the time Louisa had the work performed in 1882, but David Stuart tells us " her children, one by one, passed away in death, and last of all her husband died, and left her free to come to the home of the Saints."

"Secrets" of German surnames of the past

Now I would like to tell you some "secrets" of German surnames of the past. Normally when a man called Miller marries a woman called Smith, the woman's name is changed to Miller and their children are also called Miller. In the former times it was different. when the woman inherited the parental farm, her husband and their children got the woman's name. When a couple bought or leased a farm they both assumed the name of the farm. [See parent of Elisabeth Grans #7.] Or when a widower married again, he was often named after his first wife.

That causes many genealogical problems because you do not know what surname you have to look for in the birth register. I hope that all this was not too confusing. If you have any questions please ask and I will try to explain.

Photos and Questions Yield A Success Story

About seven years ago on a trip to the east coast we wound up with some time to kill in eastern
Pennsylvania. We had found my mother's father's name among the many on the Penn- Monument at Gettysburg. We still had a week before we were scheduled to meet with cousins from my father's family in Wisconsin.

Without the names of any relatives and only the knowledge that my mother had been born in the small village of Sugar Run in Bradford County we went there. In inquiring around we were given the name of a lady who was supposed to be the local historian. In a short time we arrived at her home. I has taken some pictures with me and on seeing them she asked where we had obtained them. Upon telling her that they had belonged to my mother, she responded that she was from the same family and she kind of went into shock. She just kept saying, "I just cannot think" when we would ask her a family question. She was over eighty at the time and a daughter of one of my mother's first cousins. From her we were able to obtain the name and address of another lady who was also a cousin and family historian.

We wrote to her on returning home an the letter soon came back marked, "deceased". In the meantime had sent some copies of other pictures of my mother's to the first lady who found that they were of her brother and herself as teenagers. She had also fallen and broken her hip. She had her grandson who was very close to her write to me. In my correspondence with her grandson we found that the deceased historian's daughter had inherited her mother's desire and will to keep up the family history.

I wrote to her and soon received a phone call. She asked me why we had not visited the "Oldest House," a historical museum in nearby Laceyville in Wyoming County, PA. "You would have found out all about your family if you had." It seems that the oldest house was built in 1781 for my great, great grandfather James Smith. She then laughingly asked if I new that I was descended from a bunch of hookers. I replied that we had always suspected something like that. My mother had mentioned a Dr. William Hooker Smith was the father of James. Both were in the revolutionary war, the senior as a captain and surgeon. The son was a private and a scout. My new found cousin then gave me the name and phone number of a genealogist in Michigan and asked that I call right away.

I waited a couple of weeks before calling. William Korroch, a genealogist with the Colonial Family Research Society and he asked why it had taken me so long. It seems that his youngest sister had married a Hall, a descendant of James Smith. At that time they had a list of more that 75 hundred of his descendants. My mother was among those that they had no information on. It took me several months to contact all of my mother's descendants and obtain the correct information.

In return William Korroch sent me a computer printout plus many pages of information. He said that I would be overwhelmed by what he was sending me and it took about two years for the implications to finally sink in.

Dr. William Hooker Smith was descended from Thomas Hooker the Puritan Theologian from the Plymouth Colony on his mother's side and from Sir John Carrington who fled to

France on the fall of Richard II by Henry IV. He returned as Smith. The line has been traced from before Mychel or Micheal de Carrington the Crusader in a straight line down to my great, great grandmother Susan Smith in Laceyville, PA.

On my first visit to the Clark County Genealogical Society Library in Vancouver, we found a book: "Royalty for Commoners" by Stuart and Magna Charta Barons by Browning. These books gave me an inkling of what William Korroch meant when he said that we would be overwhelmed. Another book from the local library "Ancestors of American Presidents" by Gary Boyd Roberts. In it we found that my mother Cyrene Mandana Crandall (Naffin) was related to over half of the U.S. presidents to date from and including George Washington and George Bush. My mother shared their ancestry because of several lines from very early colonial ancestry and European nobility/royalty.

There is or was several known members of the Clark County Genealogical Society who share this same ancestry, among them Gertrude Hamblen (deceased) a Croswell and Staacks. I have never met any of them and I am sure that my mother had no idea she had cousins here in Clark County.

I asked a Morrow here in Camas about his line. Although they were from Tioga County right next to Bradford we could find no connection. We did find that he and his wife in their research did know more about my Morrows than we did—So do not be afraid to ask questions.

A very destructive fire occurred in Portland on Monday night, by which the Franklin Hotel, and a large pork-packing house, the property of A. P. ANKNEY, were destroyed. *

* * Workmen were engaged yesterday in picking out from the rubbish those which are not entirely worthless, and hauling them to the auction house of A. B. RICHARDSON, where they will be offered for sale. Mr. J. W. COOK's loss in buildings is about \$800. The proprietor of the Franklin House, MR. HELLENBRAND, lost \$400. * * *


