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SANDRA HARGREAVES LUEBKING, CCGS SEMINAR SPEAKER "GETTING OFF THAT RESEARCH WALL"

Two stars are in my notes for this hint from Sandra: sixth in the list of my notes from her lecture on methods of "getting off the wall" in research, is hiring a professional -- not to do the work, but to evaluate my work! After (1) regrouping: sorting documents in a new way (chronologically vs category, maybe) and entering all the information on new fresh family group sheets, then comparing fresh to old; (2) re-evaluate your sources (are there others to consider?), (3) consider the quality of the source, (4) cast a wider net (check sources further away from your target area), and (5) consider on site research. All of these I have done in varying ways. My cousin had even hired a professional to try to get us off that wall on the Philpott family. All he did was to re-do work we already had done. Asking a professional to spend an hour going over my research to see where he sees the holes and come up with a list of suggestions seems to be a valuable and economical way to forge ahead.

Another help which we have probably all used at one time or other, especially when we first started, is to use someone else (not related) as a sounding board. It works just as well after years of researching. I did just that the other day when researching at the LDS family history center near Prairie High School. Like the person in the middle of the forest can't see the trees, I had lost focus going around in circles within the forrest of documents. It was a slow day so librarian and CCGS member Roy Katschke acted as a sounding board and together we came up with several ideas. Roy's wife Mary said she thought I was kidding when she asked if I needed any help, and I had responded kiddingly in return about needing helping with my Philpott line. At first niether one of us took it seriously, but taking it seriously paid off. Thanks Roy!

More Clark to Clarke and back to Clark Again!

The last issue of the Trail Breakers had an article about the spellings of Clark county. Here are two more sources:

Brett Oppegaard ran a series of articles in *The Columbian*, and on January 19, 1995, page 1 of section B, he included this article about the spelling of Clark County:

Here today, gone tomorrowe ...

So why was Clark County spelled wrong for 75 years?

Part illiteracy, part human nature.

It all started at a board of county commissioners meeting held on July 7, 1851. A new member was quickly scribbling the minutes and added an E to the end of Clark, making it Clarke County.

When the minutes were received at the territorial capital in Oregon City, the person accepting them figured a commissioner would know how to spell his own county, wouldn't he?

Instead of questioning the change, the clerk changed Oregon City's records, and the added-E belief spread.

The extra letter made it onto all the official state, federal and private maps for the next 75 years.

The error wasn't corrected until Charles W. Hall, a state representative from Clarke County, introduced a bill in 1925 that requested that the county return to the original and proper spelling.

It passed both houses and was signed by Gov. Roland H. Hartley on Dec. 23, 1925, as a Christmas present to the "purists."

It wasn't the first misspelling in the old west, Milton Bona, a Camas historian noted. "Milwaukie, Ore., was supposed to have been Milwaukee and Port Townsend should have been Port Townshend."

Life before spell checker.

[Brett would not have needed to leave even Clark County to find spelling discrepancies. Hokanson was Anglicized to Hockinson by the post office when the name Eureka was declined for the area because Eureka was already in use in Walla Walla county. Hession/Heisen or maybe it was Heissen is still an area in north Clark County spot on the road

Martin Plamondon II of Vancouver responded to Brett's article with a letter to the editor on February 3, 1995, page A6, of *The Columbian*:

Spelling confused

Brett Oppegaard's oddities articles were amusing, but the Jan. 19 story, "Here today, gone tomorrowe," was not quite complete nor correct. During my many years in the county mapping department I was often asked about the final "e" in "Clarke" appearing on maps of Clark County.

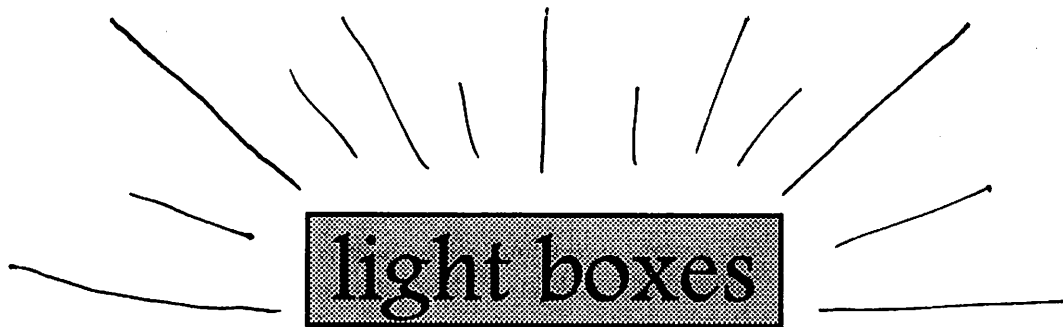
Our county's namesake, William Clark, had a distinguished career in the Army, rising to the rank of Captain. Two other captains by that name were in the Army at that time, and at least one of them spelled his last name with an "e."

During the 1800s, historians confused the documents and records of the captians, and the similar circumstances of the three Army careers further clouded the issue. Spelling was not important in those days. President Jefferson used both spellings when referring to Clark. Most of the publications on the Lewis and Clark expedition spelled Clark's name with an "e."

"Clarke" was the accepted spelling of the name until 1892, when Elliott Coues, working on a new edition of the journals of Lewis and Clark, straightened out the confusion and proved that the Clark family had never spelled their name with an "e." In later years, handwriting experts supported his findings, but it took about 20 years for the new spelling to become accepted.

Perhaps some day people will also accept the spelling of the name of the young Indian girl that accompanied Lewis and Clark as Sacagawea, not Sacajawea.

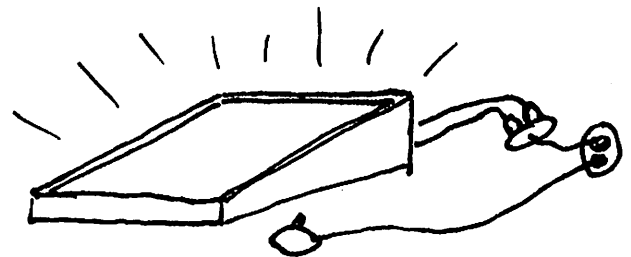

Do you remember taping a picture up to the window, putting a piece of white paper over it, and tracing the picture, depending upon the sunlight to provide light? I do, and I still do when all I need is a quick reference point. As a youngster, I had great fun. Later, in high school, if I needed some diagrams for a class assignment and if I needed to do the task at night, I'd take a picture frame that had a glass front and use the glass held up by stacks of books with a table lamp inserted in between to provide the needed (and glaring) light. The light would even get too hot sometimes and my back would ache from the awkward positions I would use in tracing or pasting.

When I got ~~older~~ more mature, I still wanted a box to trace ideas, patterns for projects, etc., but balked at the price of the ready-made ones. (This was before copy machines were so convenient.) I was delighted when I took the genealogy classes that CCGS was offering ten years ago and they showed a home-made light box. Basically, the teacher had made a wood box, painted the interior white to reflect more light, used a fluorescent light for a non-glaring light source and used frosted glass for even less glare. The instructor even suggested getting a special grid paper to help line up the typed lines (six square to the inch for pica type)!

Using the ideas from the class, I made my own light box. (Interestingly enough, its first use was a loan to my daughter Barbara's class when she was in third grade and the school was making banners based on American books to send with a teacher as gifts to Russian classes. They were delighted to have a large light box which allowed them to transfer the children's art work to the fabric banner that they then colored in with crayons. The class had chosen E.B. White's *Charlotte's Web* and their project was terrific!)

I modified my box from the one in class. Knowing I would spend a lot of time at the box, I wanted to make mine with a slant to save my elbows and back. I did that by cutting the side boards out of one board by making a diagonal that was two inches from the top on one end and two inches from the bottom on the other. I then cut another board straight across at two inches to the short (2 inches) front, using the remainder for the back:



I then cut a quarter inch notch in all four top inside sides to hold an opaque piece of plastic purchased at a glass store. I made my measurements to allow an eighteen inch florescent lamp to fit across the back (the kind that are made for under kitchen cupboards to give more light to counters). I painted the inside white to allow more reflection of light, but it was not enough for my size box, and I added a second fluorescent strip. I use a special Christmas Tree Light cord that has a remote switch so I can easily turn the lights on and off. Not planned, was the fact that my low side was about 1/8" too tall. But this was to my advantage as it acts as a lip to catch papers.








I found a plastic quarter inch grid on clear plastic at a stationary or art supply store. Fabric stores often have plastic grids that quilters

use. Using a contrasting permanent pen to mark a center line and paper edge lines, I can find center quickly when pasting up pages for the *Trail Breakers*. A special non-stick tape prevents paper tears. Rubber cement can be used to hold photos, different articles, or headers. I use "Uhu Stic" brand glue stick, because I can put "spots" of glue on the article I want to glue down, gently place it in place and still lift it up to adjust if necessary. Because I use just enough glue to "do the job," I can even usually gently remove a piece to reuse somewhere else if I am careful.

Now the computer does a lot of the lining up and placement I used to do by hand. In fact, if I had the money for the proper equipment, I'd get a scanner for photos and place them right in the layout. (One member just got one the page scanners and has a program for "fixing" up the

photos. She showed some restoration work her son did with some damaged photos. He even "removed" a person from one photo.)

At our fall workshop, Rose Marie Harshman and her mother Bertha Krause did a talk/demonstration on putting together your own book. Rose Marie showed a light box she had made from a speaker box salvaged from her son. She, took off the front screen, painted the interior white, added a small lamp (the kind for replacing a light fixture in a table lamp) to one end, added a piece of opaque plastic on top and quickly had her own light box. My husband gets the *Family Handyman* and they have a regular feature called the Wordless Workshop. This is how Rose Marie would appear in their feature:

Many Clark County residents gave lives in World War II

In the aftermath of World War II, some Clark County families were never again complete.

Some Clark County men who served their country were killed in action or died of their wounds. Other families had only uncertainty to hang onto with sons listed as missing in action.

With the upcoming 50th anniversary observance of V-E (Victory Europe) Day and V-J (Victory-Japan) Day, three local researchers set out to locate the names of all the Clark County residents who died in World War II.

And a little-known plaque at Battle Ground High School helped provide the key to knowing their list was complete.

Battle Ground residents Bruce Barker and Chuck Jones, with the help of Vancouver resident Coleah Penley-Ayres, dug up the information and compiled the list. It took them a year to do the work.

They gleaned the names from the Fort Vancouver Regional Library, the Clark County Courthouse War Memorial, Columbian newspaper archives, the Library of Congress, and the War Department, State of Washington, List for 1946.

Jones said he believed the original list was complete until he had a chance to look at the plaque at Battle Ground High. And some of the names on that bronze plaque were not on the trio's list. That knowledge sent the three back to work.

The Plaque, which sits unobtrusively above a trophy case in the school, lists Battle Ground High School graduates who died during World War II. They were Julius Bergman, Edmond

Condon, Jack Freel, Shelton Kessendorf, Lawrence Mackey, William Pelt, George Taylor, Robert White, Milton Winston, Robert Brown, Herbert Felming, Bruce Green, Marion Liebman, Joseph Pancoska, Clifford Peru, Harry Van Zandt, Ralph Wilson and James Yenne.

Barker and Jones emphasized that the Plaque only lists Battle Ground graduates. It does not list those who attend Battle Ground and died in the war before graduating.

The Clark County list includes 344 names. Barker and Jones believe the

list is complete, but apologize if anyone was inadvertently left out.

A legend follows most names: MIA, missing in action; FOD, finding of death; KIA, killed in action; DNB, died non-battle; NFI, no further information; DOW, died of wound, UTV, unable to verify; POW, prisoner of war. No legend means the soldier's fate was unknown.

Here is the list of Clark County residents who died during World War II:

Using Queries as a Research Aid

Most obviously, the greatest reward is getting a response from a query by a person who has your particular line back several generations. And occasionally that does happen.

But just the writing of a query can be helpful. It will cause you to focus in on missing information and compare it to what you have on hand. A well written query will contain a focal question of missing (desired) information and be backed up with supporting information (details) to help others determine if they have helpful information.

CCGS format of presenting queries allows a researcher to quickly identify surnames that might interest him. An all caps or bolded surname in the parallel column details information. The name and address of the submitter is in italics for easy identification.

When submitting a query, make sure names and dates are easy to read. Using b for born, etc., is common in queries as a space saver. Look over queries from several sources to see how you can write yours.

Also, search queries for leads to your own lines. Even if the person writing the query has moved or died, the information obtained can be a valuable lead.

Try writing a few queries and submitting them to the *Trail Breakers* and other publications. Sometimes the only expense is a stamp to mail your query.

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The names in the alphabetical listing of nearly 400 Clark County Residents who gave their life in World War II which appear on pages 7-9 are not included in this index.

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
