CLARK BROWN VISITS

Vancouver Columbian, November 20, 1940

Frank Blaker, Long-time County Employee, Who Recalls Early Days at Amboy and Here; Saw Three Courthouses Constructed

This is a story of Frank Blaker, son of one of Clark county's old pioneers. Mr. Blaker said: "I was born in Sioux City, Iowa November 13, 1876. Father and mother came to Portland in 1878, coming by train to San Francisco and to Portland by steamer, as there were no railroads in the northwest at that time. For a number of years we lived on Union avenue, right at the north end of the bridge that spans Sullivan's gulch. The old house was moved a few years ago to make room for a modern building, but it still stands there on Union avenue as I passed it a few days ago.

"At that time there were no bridges across the river, and the street car system was a one-horse car on the west side of Front street. I well remember going across on the ferry with father, and one day he pointed out a man to me, dressed in a Prince Albert coat, silk hat and cane, and told me that man was Jack Dempsey, the Nonpareil. Father was always fond of hunting, and at that time he hunted ducks and geese on Swan Island.

"When I was still a small boy we moved to Amboy. At that time, the country was a virgin wilderness. Father together with his brother, cut their own road from about three miles down Cedar creek into the land they had selected. Our place covered 120 acres, while my Uncle Charles selected 80 acres joining our place on the north. Our first house was 11 by 14 feet, built out of split cedar shakes and had a split-puncheon floor. Later, a shed was built on one end which served for a wood-shed and a potato bin, the construction materials being the same as the house. I well remember that one spring, mother and I went to Portland and stayed for several weeks, and when we came home,, we found that the

ferns had grown several inches high up through the cracks in the floor.

"Father and my Uncle Charles followed the brick mason trade, and every spring they would go to Portland and work until late fall. Then they would buy a year's provisions and ship it down to La Center by boat. Then the big event of the year, to me, was when they would take two ox teams and go after it. Transportation was slow. The trip took one day down and one day back, and I still remember the thrill it gave me if they would let me go. Flour and sugar were purchased those days in barrels, the sugar being called 'Extra C or Golden C', both being what we call brown sugar today. Salt also came in barrels, tea in five or ten pound chests, nicely wrapped in tea lead, the same making very fine sinkers on my fishing line. Coffee came green in sacks, to be parched at home, and I still remember the delicious odor that came from that coffee as mother parched it in the oven.

"At rare intervals, some of the neighbors would be going to La Center, and the news would soon spread among the few families there, and when said neighbor did go, he would have a list from nearly every family. I have heard my mother say many times that she always had her list started with, 'tobacco, dried apples and beans', and then followed the other few items not really considered necessities of life.

"Wild game and fish contributed very materially to our bill of fare, and it was on that little ranch at Amboy that I caught my first fish, and developed shall we say, my hobby, my love for fishing, which I still enjoy to the utmost. There were

no game or fish laws in those days, and I can truthfully say that I do not believe that there was ever a fish or a pound of meat wasted. Fishing or hunting those days was both for sport and food, and the supply was unlimited.

Had No Fires

"Another thing that I well remember was that every boy was taught to be careful with fire. The very education that is given us today on fire prevention, was drilled into us by our parents then, and no one of us would think of such a thing as being careless with a camp fire. I never heard of a forest fire when I was a boy.

"And how well do I remember the home remedies of that time. I don't think that I ever saw a doctor until we moved to Vancouver in 1889. In the spring, sulphur and molasses was the proper thing to clean out your system; Sassafras tea was also good to thin down your blood. If you needed a laxative, the old reliable Chittum Bark tea was just the thing, and what a tea! If you had a cold, a gargle of coal oil, together with goose grease rubbed on your chest, or sometimes an onion poultice would do the work. If there was danger of measles, diphtheria or scarlet fever, a bag of Asafoetida was tied around your neck on a string, and no self-respecting contagious disease would come near you. Large families were the rule rather than the exception and as there were no doctors nearer than Portland, the good old midwife had her day, and she was a busy woman.

"In those days, people were neighborly. If a new cabin or a barn was to be built, people came from miles and had a 'raising'. The women would prepare a big meal, and by nightfall the building was about finished. If death came, the men got together and built a coffin, many times out of split cedar, the women trimmed it in black, and the departed was solemnly laid away without benefit of undertaker or clergy.

Moved to Town

"I attended the first school in Amboy in a little log cabin of two rooms, the teacher living in one

room, and teaching school in the other. Later came the practice of the teacher 'boarding around', one week at each home, and her salary being furnished by donations from the parents sending the children. Payments were large or small depending on how many children you were sending. As I recall, my father and my uncle put up most of the salary. Three months was a term of school, during the months of April, May and June.

"In 1889 we moved to Vancouver and then lived in an up-to-date cottage on Eighteenth and Markle avenue. A cistern in the back yard with a pump at the kitchen sink, was the water supply. And best of all, we had a real bathtub made of tin. The old wooden tub for Saturday night was gone and a good thing too, for by then there were so many of us, that the weekly ablutions would take mother well into early Sunday morning. Finally she had to start in on Friday night, so as to have it all over by Sunday.

"I first attended school in the old Central school, then the only school in town. Many changes have taken place since that time. I remember the first pavement of wooden blocks that reached clear up to Fifth street; the first sidewalk up Main street to Twenty-sixth, on the east side of the street only; the old hand pump fire engine; and how proud we all were when we had our new steam fire engine; the firemen's tournaments held on lower Main street, with teams generally from The Dalles, Oregon City and Astoria."

And so ends the story of Clark county's oldest employee. He has served twenty-four and one-half years in various offices of the courthouse. And our new courthouse will be the third one he has seen built.

CCGS member Pat Bauer lived with George and Alice McKee after the death of her mother in 1934. He was the "grandfather who raised me." The story doesn't say "Oregon Trail" as such, but other stories about their trip refer to the trail. These two clippings were among her family mementos and Pat thought *Trail Breaker* readers would enjoy them.

CLARK BROWN VISITS

Vancouver Columbian, June 6, 1938

**With George McKee and Hears How Three
Brothers Came West in 1883 and
Settled in the Wilds of Amboy Forests**

"Just the right time for a visit," said George McKee as we met in Wood's furniture store recently. "Let's sit in Clyde's office. I pay Clyde many a visit just as I did his father whom I knew in the long ago. I suppose all of us who have reached the shady side of life would rather talk of the past just as the younger generation would rather talk of the future.

"My brothers, Jim and Archie, and I hitched up a team to a prairie schooner 55 years ago in 1883 and with my mother and our sister started for the west. We said good-byes to our Missouri friends and joined another schooner driven by W. F. Gerber, a man loved by all who knew him when he lived.

"It was a long journey, but in memory I enjoy the trip now. Over mountain roads, plains and valleys we finally made our way to Vancouver, our rainbow's end.

"It was haying time along the Columbia when we arrived. Ed Blurock at Blurock's landing wanted help. We worked there putting up hay and then went to Amboy.

"There were a number of boys there whose initials were A.M. and I think Burt Blaker is correct when he says that is where

Amboy got it's name. We homesteaded land, mother bought a railroad "80" and then came the building of homes.

"We worked together. There were the trees to fell and the land to clear and break up, but soon we had crops growing. One of my brothers went to the first school in that section, a little log schoolhouse long since fallen in decay.

"Our nearest postoffice was LaCenter. I carried the mail from there for 21 months, but was not paid by the government. The neighbors were to pay me one dollar a trip, but money was scarce and my entire receipts for the 21 months were 10 dollars. That was raised at a dance the neighbors gave, the profits to go to me.

"I shall never forget one Christmas eve when I started from LaCenter, a distance of 16 miles, on foot. In Canyon Creek I fell off a log, but managed to keep the mail sack on the log and dry. What a rush there was for that Christmas mail when I got home.

"Yes, there were three of us brothers who came west. Jim passed away a little over a year ago, Archie died a week ago on Memorial day." (George McKee died Nov. 5, 1938, five months after this interview.)

KNAPP MORTUARY RECORDS

Extracted by CCGS member Gerry Gilman, the Knapp-Gunderson-Hamilton Funeral Home records were first printed in the *Trail Breakers* Winter 1989/Vol. 16 #2 issue. The history of the funeral home has been printed in the first volume of the Knapp Mortuary Funerals, the Hamilton Funeral Home Records, and the Hamilton Family history was printed in Vol. 20 No. 2 of the Trail Breakers. In 1960 the Knapp Mortuary merged with Mylan-Gunderson-Lanier and is presently under the Hamilton-Mylan-Knapp-Gunderson Funeral Home, located on the Corner of 11th and Columbia Streets in Vancouver, WA. Three volumes have now been printed: *Knapp Mortuary Funerals 1907-1925*, *Knapp Mortuary Funerals 1926-1940*, and *Hamilton Funeral Records 1927-1929*.

REPORT.

GENTLEMEN OF THE BOARD OF
MANAGERS OF THE CLARKE COUNTY
AGRICULTURE AND MECHANICAL
SOCIETY:

At the close of this fiscal year, I will report to you briefly the condition of our Society. The Society was organized on the 23d day of July last, and legally incorporated under the laws of this Territory. It was thought to be advisable by the Board of Managers to hold a County Fair in October last; arrangements were made and the Fair held; the list of premiums and awards can be seen by the report of the President and Secretary at the close of the Fair, as published in the *Vancouver Register* of October 31st, 1868.

By the report of the Treasurer it will be seen that the Society has received the sum of Seven Hundred and Thirty-One Dollars and Eighty-One Cents, and has paid out the sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars and Eighty Three Cents - being Nineteen Dollars and Two Cents of expenditures more than receipts. The Treasurer, Mr. **S. D. MAXON**, generously donating that sum to the Society.

The sum of Fifteen Dollars had been previously donated by Messrs. **BROWN, MAXON, SUISTE, MAULSBY, HAYDEN, CILLEY** and **PALMER**.

LIVELY TIMES. - As the Pacific Railroad approaches completion the towns on this coast seem

to be infected with the sanguinary propensities which characterize the towns along its line. Cheyenne, Green River City, Bear River City, in their palmiest days, are eclipsed for the time being by our usually law-abiding neighbor. The saturnalia began on the evening of January 1st, by one **JAMES HAYDEN** shooting and killing **MICHAEL MALONE** at Coulson's saloon on North Front Street. There had been a previous dispute between the parties concerning \$20 which Hayden claimed was owing him by the deceased. Hayden, upon a charge of murder, pleaded not guilty and waiving an examination, was committed to answer before the next grand jury.

On the same evening a Frenchman named **JOSEPH BERTRAND** was stabbed seriously in a room in the rear of the New Orleans hotel. Search was made for the man who did it, but he was not found.

On Monday evening, **W. R. HILL**, better known as "Backsin Bill," received a gunshot wound at the hands of **JAMES CONNOLY**, from which he died in a few hours. Hill went to the house in search of his wife whom he supposed to be there and while there a quarrel arose between him and Connolly and the latter's wife. Hill soon retreated from the house followed by both Connolly and his wife, the one with the pistol the other holding alight. When Hill reached the sidewalk and retreated to near the corner of Columbia street, Connolly fired, the ball taking effect in the left side of Hill's body, passing through and coming out the left side, just at the base of the ribs. Connolly was arrested within a short time after committing the fatal deed and lodged in the County Jail.

About two o'clock on Tuesday morning, a man named **JACK BURCHARD** was arrested while in the act of chasing and shooting **FRANK CLEVELAND**, on Front street. Burchard fired two shots, one of which, it is said, took off a part of Cleveland's ear. He was arrested.

The *Oregonian* remarks: "The roughs have come to think that they have a little more than an even hand with Justice and so the 'go in.' A little judicious hanging, a moderate amount of imprisonment and a considerable piling on of fines, would clear up the moral atmosphere of the city amazingly." [2/2]
