

Library & Archival Research

Public Libraries

I believe that we need to use our local Public Library and Genealogical/Historical Society as a "home base" for much of our common resources in our genealogical research. Varying widely from a bare bones collection of materials to an all-encompassing genealogical department. In order to ascertain what a public library or society has and how they can be of help to your research, you must inquire. The best method is to write a letter inquiring about their books, services, special collections, programs. Ask for a brochure or pathfinder on their genealogical offerings. Be sure to send a SASE and ask if their is any charge for the guides prepared by the library. Most are free, some are available for a small charge. [All are well worth any fees] If you are in a hurry, a phone call to the research desk might speed this process up.

Public Libraries located in the primary areas where your ancestors resided will be of particular importance. Many if not all of these libraries will have collections on the Pioneers of its geographic area. This means that valuable primary materials are just waiting for your inspection. If you are unable to travel to your library of choice, when you write your letter, you may wish to ask if they have a list of researcher's. Not all library research departments are set up to do long distance research for you.

You may wish to start with our Ft. Vancouver Regional Library, reference section, look for:

The Robinson-Spangler Carolina Room, located on the third floor of the main library, offers approximately 15,000 volumes covering more than thirty states with emphasis on the Southeastern United States, including information on migratory routes. This library also provides an array of nearly 10,000 microforms covering Federal Census, county records, newspapers, etc. The Room also serves as the depository for the Library's special collections, sound recordings, photographs, manuscripts, and its archives

Researchers will be pleased to note that Federal Census schedules are available for over 30

states. Special set of materials include the Piedmont, North Carolina, county records on microfilm, the South Carolina Historical Society church records, and the South Carolina Archives Consolidated Index. They have an excellent collection of family histories and other genealogy books. Another important par of their collection is their Vertical File Section. This contains clippings and unpublished material on many families.

Newspapers of the area are ready to be searched. They include the *Charlotte Observer* (1869-1886 and 1892-present), the *Charlotte News* (1888-1894 and 1899-1986) as well as other newspapers form Charlotte and the Carolinas. Maps are also available.

The Public Library of Charlotte & Mecklenburg currently employs some of the CD-Rom products of Automated Archives, Inc. Researchers can scan for information on the U.S.

Census Index Series and the Social Security Death Benefits Records Set.

As in most areas this library interfaces with the Olde Mecklenburg Genealogical Society.

Together, both agencies provide help to genealogists on how to get started. Photocopying facilities are available as well as lockers for storing personal belongings. The library will also respond to specific queries received by mail (Please include a SASE for response). Work shops for the beginner and advanced alike round out this library's outstanding offerings.

Rosemary J. Lands', gracious response to my query, let me know that they do not have a pathfinder to mail our *yet*. Their collection does not go out on inter-library loan. They did provide a list of local researchers who contract privately to do research in their collection (with specialists in Irish, Jewish, and Black genealogy), and a fee schedule for the limited amount of research they can do

As I have North Carolina roots, this is one of the Libraries I plan to take advantage of [SW]

The Tutwiler Collection of Southern History and Literature houses a remarkable group of materials that is being expanded upon annually at the rate of 2,000 volumes per year! This collection contains the largest genealogical research collection in the Southeastern United States. Their collection mainly focuses on the 11 Southern States (i.e. those who succeeded from the Union during the War Between The States) and Colonial and Federal period New England and the Eastern Seaboard.

This library's holdings include 90,000 printed volumes, 7,000 volumes of bound periodicals, 7,000 pamphlets, and 14,000 reels of microfilm, not counting newspapers and journal holdings. There is a large grouping of rare books that includes volumes of the American State Papers dealing with Indian affairs. The Collection boasts significant research material for all periods of Southern history. Thus, newspapers, pamphlets, documents, published records and papers are available for each historical period. Noteworthy are the Lyman Draper Papers, Travels in the confederate States, and the Confederate Imprints Series. Genealogists will be heartened to know that Indian and Slave census schedules, and the Southern Tenant Farmers Union Papers are among the many rich resources to be used in the Tutwiler Collection.

Genealogical journals are acquisitioned and the staff makes an effort to locate and purchase new, and out-of-print periodicals which will increase the scholarship potential of the collection. Periodicals and journals from fifteen different states are maintained and available indexes are shelved with these periodicals.

The Library includes significant holdings of extant U.S. census materials for ALL the Southern states (1790-1900); indexes to the Revolutionary War; War of 1812 services records;; and the Consolidated Index to Confederate Soldiers.

The Birmingham Genealogical Society meets at the library, and the library does offer beginning workshops once a month. Volunteers are available to meet with those needing individualized help.

The Tutwiler Collection is classified as strictly Reference meaning that the holding do not circulate, nor are they available through interlibrary loan. One must do research in person, or hire a proxy to conduct research for them. Photocopy and micro photography services are available for patron use, however, brittle/fragile items may not be photocopied. To assist those who would like to know what's in this magnificent library, the staff of The Tutwiler Collection has prepared an excellent pathfinder, "Genealogical Research in the Tutwiler Collection of Southern

History and Literature." The pathfinder is available for \$4.00. I believe it is well worth this small fee.. [SW]

According to Mr. Roger Torbert, since the reference collection, is not available through interlibrary loan. The staff does provide limited photocopy services, but exact titles and citations

must be supplied. He also inclosed a list of local independent researchers who provide additional research support, list of independent researchers who perform newspaper and city directory research and list of hotels/motels in the Birmingham area, some within walking distance of the library.



Overland to Oregon

IN THE TRACKS OF LEWIS & CLARKE
1843 Emigrants list

from a book by Edward Henry Lenox

extracted by Jane Germann

This small book was tucked in among other books at the library. This 1965 edition was a facsimile reproduction of the 1904 issue. It is a short book (69 pages) with stories of the first trip across the Oregon Trail. Ten members of the Lenox family made the trip. When they arrived west, the family lived to a great extent on "boiled peas, boiled wheat, with parched wheat and parches peas for coffee. This was our coffee for fifteen years." Here is Clark County, one of the families ate "potatoes, potatoes, and more potatoes." The stories are entertaining to read. It's a fun book. At the Fort Vancouver Library the call number is 917.8 Lenox.

An appendix lists those first emigrants to the Columbia River, arriving November 1, 1843. Two lists, one for men, the second for women, have been combined here into one alphabetized list. Note that there were inconsistencies in spelling and probably errors in spelling in the book. Two names on the men's list are listed twice; it is not clearn if they are dupplicate or two different men.



Blair had a total of nine children.
