Library & Archival Research

Public Libraries

Public Libraries located in the primary areas where your ancestors resided will be of particular importance. Many if not all of these libraries will have collections on the Pioneers of its geographic area. This means that valuable primary materials are just waiting for your inspection. If you are unable to travel to your library of choice, when you write your letter, you may wish to ask if they have a list of researcher's. Not all library research departments are set up to do long distance research for you. When writing do not forget your SASE.

The Penrose Public Library, Palmer Wing, a part of the Pikes Peak Library District offers researchers yet another repository of valuable resources. Strong in North American materials, and in the States lying east of the Rocky Mountains, the Penrose Public Library is developing their collection to include many Canadian resources, as well, along with European "how-to" titles. The collection covers the time from the Colonial Period to the lat 1880's.

Researchers will enjoy the use of approximately 8,000 volumes consisting of directories, research guides, and census index books (on records created between 1790 and 1850 with some indexes for the '860-1870, and 1880 censuses).

Also available are family and county histories, military pension records providing pension numbers useful in obtaining military/pension records from the National Archives in Washington D.C., and heraldry books with information on English, Scottish, and Irish families.

The library is strong in its local history collection and has resources for genealogical research for Colorado Springs, El Paso County, The Pikes Peak region, and the state of Colorado. History books, biographies, and published county and cemetery records for the region as well as the state make this an extensive collection. Federal census microfilm is here for Colorado and New Mexico, along with the Soundex. An 1885 state census for Colorado is also available for 20 counties.

Newspapers are abundant at Penrose numbering nine in all. They are for Colorado Springs and for regions such as Manitou Springs and the Cripple Creek Mining District. Indices for the Gazette and Gazette Telegraph are available form 1872 to the present.

Penrose stocks the complete set of the P. William Filby: Indexes to Passenger Immigration and owns several of the titles that are indexed therein. They also stock the Pennsylvania and New Jersey Archives, and the DAR Lineage Books. The Domesday Book collection can be found here along with the re-issue of the American State Papers and its index, Grass Roots of America. Outside of the United States, Penrose offers the first census of England (1068 A.D.)

All research correspondence received at Penrose Public Library is answered by volunteer members of the Pikes Peak Genealogical Society in an effort to serve those who are unable to use the facilities in person. The library in cooperation with the Society offers a full array of work-shops in genealogical research two times per year. A pathfinder entitled, "Researching Your Family History in the Local History and Genealogy Section" is available to the public at no charge. For further information about the collection and library hours, contact the library at the address above.

The Materials in their Local History/ Genealogy collections do not circulate and are not available on Inter-Library Loan. However, they will photocopy pages of indexes of specific books for specific names. After examining the indexes they will honor requests for copies of material indicated in the request. The cost for copying is 10 cents per page. They do not answer E-mail or Fax requests. You can access there Library Catalog through the Internet, by using Telnet to reach Colorado Libraries Information Network (ACLIN). After getting into ACLIN, select the listing for the Pikes Peak Library. [sw]

The Special Collection Department at the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library offers researchers a collection of 3,000 titles from the "Buffalo Collection" as well as on New York State local histories.

Genealogists have at hand 300 scrapbooks of local newspaper articles from the 1930's through 1975 from the Pan American Exposition, 1899-1904, and many others. The Local History Collection contains 27,500 volumes and includes materials on individual states and localities from Main to California, including, of course, New York State, and Western New York outside of Erie County. While the standard works of atlases, gazetteers, guidebooks, censuses, and vital records are here, the collection is particularly strong in the area of New England local histories. The DAR Lineage Books, 1890-1939 are of particular note.

This library offers an extensive series of newspaper genealogy columns which spans a fifty year period. All newspapers, including the Buffalo Times, Buffalo Commercial Advertiser, and Buffalo Express are on microfilm.

If one is looking for alternative sources in research, please note that this institution has been designated a Federal Depository since 1895, and a New York State Depository since 1970. If your ancestor might have been an inventory, the patent records could prove

useful. The library has been a Patent Depository since 1871.

Genealogists will be pleased to learn that Buffalo & Erie County Public Library holds a complete set of the Buffalo City Directories from the year 1832 to the present along with the Buffalo Telephone Directories from 1886 to the current issues. Other useful reference tools for family research include the YMCA Yearbooks for the early 1900's and the newsletter, Chimes of St. Paul's Cathedral (1938-). Published and unpublished books and pamphlets that are currently out-of-print, top off some of the more unusual sources available at this location.

The genealogy and local history collection consists of approximately 30,500 volumes in the related subject fields of local history (25,000 volumes) and genealogy (5,500 volumes). The genealogical collection is composed largely of American family history and biography; publications of genealogical and patriotic societies; English parish records and visitations; books on royalty, the peerage, baronetage, and knightage; and muster and pension rolls.

In the related area of local history, each of the fifty states and nearby Canadian provinces is represented by a selection of town and county histories, maps, atlases, gazetteers, guide books, and publications and journals of historical societies, together with state archives, censuses and vital records in some instances. The collection of New England area local histories is especially strong, as is the Niagara Frontier portion, which is augmented by the Buffalo file, a card index to facts and information concerning the local community, and the Local History File, which indexes the local newspapers through 1982. The Western New York Index continues the indexing from 1893 on.

The Special Collections Department will answer written inquiries as the majority of the collection is non-circulating, Because of the value and heavy use of the genealogy and local history collections, the materials must be used within the Library and are not available for loan or inter-library loan. Many of the materials are available in the open stacks of the Special Collections Department; the additional items may be requested from the closed stacks via the Special Collections Service Desk, using call slips.

Upon request a guide will be sent to you arranged by type of material with call numbers for the individual works cited, also a list of local history and genealogical researchers who work on an hourly fee basis will be included in the envelope at no charge. [sw]

This eighth book in a popular series transcribes court records from 1814 - 1920. The court records from 1814-1820. The court records presented in this book involve land disputes, crimes such as theft or assault; inheritance disputes, business transactions; slander suites and other matters. Papers from other courts appear at times, usually having to do with actions concerning area citizens. Each name of a person, place or thing is presented here as it has been deciphered. So why did St. Louis get enumerated again in 1880?

Kitty Oman¹ has been researching family in the St. Louis, Missouri, area. Two enumerations were made in 1880 for this area. As she was extracting the Block family, she many found differing records -- which brought up the question of why two enumerations?

Here are two reading for the Louis Block family:

As you can readily see, one reading uses more formal names. Also, Isabella is only on one reading, and Henry's age is different. There are probably several reasons for this different information: for some reason, Isabella was not with the family (was she visiting someone, hired out, or die? — research may answer this question). Henry's age may have changed between enumerations.

Researching why there were two enumerations
But the question in hand is why were two
enumerations made anyway? It took several phone
calls and much waiting to get the answer.

Calls to Missouri didn't come up with an answer. Librarians knew that in 1870, the reading just after the civil war, that inflated numbers were given to hide the desiccation of that war. And it was duplication of names (the number of people reported) not the statistical data that was questioned. The language barrier was also added as a reasons of different information.

A call to the Seattle Archives finally helped the why question. The archivists there didn't realize that 1880 had a second enumeration. After explaining that page 66 of the catalogue of *Federal Population Censuses 1790-1890* did show a second enumeration for the city of St. Louis, she said she would check into it. And she did. She e-mailed someone at the National Archives and it took several months before the reply came. She wasn't sure why, but sent Appendix C of the 1880 PUMS report: a 26 page report entitled "A procedural History of the Enumeration Process in the 1880 U.S. Census," by Miriam L. King and Diana L. Magnuson. A full annotated bibliography of 275 references followed.

The purpose of their report was to lay our the steps involved in collecting the 1880 enumeration information, to understand why the tenth (1880) return was more reliable than the 1850, 1860 and 1870 returns, and to recognize the problems facing enumerators with returning full and accurate reports.

Answer found

In 1870, intentional inflated returns brought more pay to the enumerator. Several of the 1870 returns were inflated: "the average number enumerated by honest deputies was about 4,000, but ... give deputies [in St. Louis] returned 129,000, and .. the names showed a stereotyped method." (King & Magnuson, p. 203)

"The only large scale reenumerations in 1880 came at the instigation of outside pressure, from the disappointed city of St. Louis (which launched a massive pressure campaign via the press and citizens' committees) and from northerners and Republicans suspecting fraud by Southern Democrats. (King & Magnuson, p. 202) It appears that politics caused two enumerations: the south making sure they got their fair number of representatives and the north making sure they didn't get too many.

Mariah Robinson Switzler: a case study

Maria Switzler died of chronic diarrhea in 1850. She is buried on the old donation land claim farm across the river from Ft. Vancouver, where her husband John and their oldest son Joseph ran the first ferry across the Columbia. Maria was John's second wife and the Switzlers were pioneers of 1845. The ferry landing was near the common border of John and Joseph's claim. John's daughter and son-in-law Sarah and A. Wilson and family had the claim immediately east. Their son Jehu's claim was a little farther east. Today the land would stretch from Jantzen beach to the airport.

Researching the Switzler name in the northwest has been easy. First, it is an uncommon name and any reference with this spelling has led to this family. Secondly, the Switzler's had an uncommon occupation, so they have not been lost among the farmers. Also, they were early pioneers to the area and as such "made a name" for themselves. It was easy to come up with a couple dozen references with a bit of research: marriage records, land records, area histories, newspapers, etc. The reference list has probably come close to a hundred now. The only record of the marriage of Joseph Switzler to Mary Wolf was found in the land records. They were married a couple years before the "early Oregon" marriages and didn't get entered.

It has also been fun to research the Switzler name. The discoveries include a "Switzler" street sign in Umatilla, OR, a Switzler Canyon near Pasco, WA, that Hayden Island was known as Switzler's Island for about five years before the Haydens lived there, and that a Switzler's Lake was located in the area of Hayden Meadows. The Switzlers were also well known for raising horses and one was an interpreter during the Indian unrest.

After ten year, the results of reserch on the Switzler line has nearly filled two file drawers. It had been easy to discover that John Switzler's mother was a Denig. Local biographies filled in much information, including her maiden name. A probable marriage was located in Pennsylvania

with other Denig data. A probable Denig uncle had drawn a "picture Bible" which has been reproduced in full color as Pennsylvania folk art.

But the Robinson name -- Maria's maiden name -- had been a puzzle. Donna M. Wojcik's *Brazen Overlanders* gave the best clue. In the short family biographies in the roster section, this source indicated that Sara Maria Robinson, second wife of John Switzler, married 26 September 1829 Saline Co., MO, was born 1798/1809 in Warrensburg, MO. She had died in May 1850 in Clackamas/Multnomah Co., OR.

The Switzlers hailed from Missouri where the Switzler name was well known, a statesman, editor, etc. Researching in Missouri was more difficult. The Switzler were too late to be the early settlers, but still early enough that the record keepers had not been established.

But what about Robinson? Missouri probably did have the answer. There were lots of them: Robison, Robinson, Robertson. The clue of the Warrensburg birth helped narrow the search. In the Johnson county histories, information about a Jehu Robinson was found. One of Maria's children was Jehu Robinson Switzler - and Jehu was an uncommon name. This Jehu was the right age to be her brother. The naming patterns of the children were similar. But it would be several years before it was proved that this Jehu was indeed her brother.

Jehu had a son and grandson written up in one county history. But his father was listed as just that -- "his father." No first name. (Remember the rule to check ALL the histories for the county?) The 1895 history didn't feature Jehu, but the 1881 one did! "His father" was named. Joseph R. Robinson. A name to narrow the search among all those Robinsons. But wouldn't you know it -- "His grandfather" was just grandfather. Grandfather had been a Revolutionary soldier. Grandfather died in Kentucky in 1812 at age 79.

And these clues were enough to find the name of grandfather in the DAR listing. There are seven pages of Robinsons: there were several Johns, Josephs, Williams -- you know "all the men

family names" -- take you choice. But armed with information from the county history that this grandfather had a child born in "Carolina," a birthplace in Ireland, a death date of 1812, and an approximate birth date (1812 minus 79 years) of 1733, the DAR Centennial Edition list was rechecked. There was only one Robinson that fit the parameters - and they fit exactly! William Robinson; one of seventeen William Robinsons listed. (The DAR file has been requested.)

"His grandfather" has been located. The clues had been there. Waiting. Finally used by looking for details instead of names.

Then it was decided to follow Jehu to see if he had siblings, the logical choice was to check probate records for his father's will. The county history had mentioned a death date -- 1941, but no place. It had mentioned that he had come to Missouri and settled near Glasgow, Howard Co. not far from Boone Co., and Switzlers were in both of these counties. So were a lot of Robinsons. But the history had mentioned that Jehu was the only son. Perhaps he lived near his son. It was in an abstraction of Johnson Co. wills for that time period that two entries were found

for Joseph Robinson with a daughter Mariah Robinson Switzler and a grandson Joseph Robinson Switzler! Pay dirt!! His son Jehu was also listed. The tie had been established. The proof found.

This was enough. But it was a secondary source. Was the primary source available? I called the court house. They gave me the card reference that the extractor had apparently copied. But I kept pressingg, "Where did they get tht information?" It paid off. The clerk had me call back that afternoon after she had time to search. When I called back, she had an old document, difficult to copy. But she did copy it. (Thank you,

The copies were easy to read for someone who has sweated over faded documents on microfilm. And they held a surprise. Joseph had died before the Civil War and four years before Maria and John Switzler traveled overland to Oregon. In his will were the disposition of three slaves-- Manuel, Jenny & Lewis. In one document, all the slaves went to his son Jehu. In the second document, his daughter Mariah (and then his grandson Joseph) were to receive the youngest slave named Lewis.

The wills follows.

JOSEPH ROBINSON WILL

Johnson Co., Warrensburg, Missouri, Will of Joseph Robinson:

FIRST WILL:

I Joseph Robinson of Johnson County in the State of Missouri, being old and infirm in Body, but of Sound mind & memory, and knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do make & publish this my last will & testament in the following word to wit -- In this first place I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mariah Switzler during her natural life and after her death, to my grand son Joseph Switzler a certain negro boy named Louis about nineteen years of age, said negro was purchased with my money of Rice Wood, and the Bill of sale take in the name of my son Jehu Robinson. And it is my wish & I hereby will the said Boy to my Daughter & grandson as aforesaid. 2nd I will and bequeath unto son Jehu Robinson, two certain negros to wit Immanuel & Jenny & all the lands now in the pofsefsion [possession] of my son Jehu, which said land was also purchased with money & the title taken

in the name of my son Jehu & I like wise will unto my said son Jehu all my other property both real (continues on page 2) and personal not herein before mentioned. But this bequest of the two before mentioned negroes Immanuel & Jenny to my son Jehu, as made upon this express [express] an dition that is to say that my said son shall give up unto my said Daughter Mariah Switzler the said slave Lewis the Bill of sale to which said negro is in the name of said Jehu as aforesaid - and that the said Jehu shall on no pretense compel the said Mariah to go to Law to recover possefsion [possession] of said slave and I wish it to be distinctly understood that if the said Jehu shall refuse to give to the said Mariah the peaceful possession [possession] of said negro according to my wish as above expressed [expressed].

- Their & in that case I revoke & annul the bequest of the said slaves Immanuel & Jenny to said Jehu and will that the said slaves Immanuel & Jenny to my said Daughter & her son Joseph as aforesaid.

And whereas I did once make a will of most of the property above mentioned, to my son Jehu I here by revoke and annul the same (continued on page 3:) the considerations which induced me to make said former disposition of my (inserted: my property having) failed - The Bequest of the slave Lewis or of the two slaves Immanuel & Jenny as shall be determined by the condition aforesaid, is made to my Daughter Mariah Switzler in addition to any property which she may heretofore have ne--ed by way of advancement.

In witnefs whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal the 28th day of July A.D. 1840. In the presence of us Joseph Robinson Jno. A. Trigg.

He had no children and (9) Chester Clyde Blair (1897-1973) (was a minister) married Jenny Fisher. Mary E. Nerton was the daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth (Larkin) Nerton; She was first married to Edward Calder [1845-1878/9 son of John Calder who was an early employ of Hudson's Bay Company] She was about 14/15 when she married Edward Calder(1845-1878). Edward Calder is buried at Sifton Cemetery with their children Flora Belle (1871-1880 and son Charles Edward (1873-1885). Frame Wesley Blair was a Civil War Vet of the Union Forces in the 6th Missouri Volunteer Cavalry and he was a member of the Ellsworth Post of the GAR., Frame Blair was a farmer - had a prune orchard, lived at RFD #4 Mill Plain Camas, Clark County, Washington (Fisher area) and had a dairy. Lloyd W. and Katie Blair (the son and daughter of Frame and Louisa are buried in the family plot); Lulu Blanch Blair (1892-1920 the daughter of Frame and Mary E. (Nerton); and Melissa Lundsfort Blair (1849-1874) the first wife of his brother Pinkney Blair. Note:In Plot NE 17 Line 1 are William T. Blair Calder (1876-1939) age 62y 8m called "brother" died of heart failure buried by Vancouver Funeral Chapel;

Rossman. Ordered by daughters (1) Mrs. Julia Etta (John Penny) McQueen (1879-1972) and (2) Mrs. Sarah Bertha (Thomas Watt) Robinson (1882-1963 both buried at Fern Prairie Cemetery). They were daughters of Nancy Ellen Lunsford Blair. Charged to the estate % (brother) Columbus Siegel Blair (1861-1931) who is buried in SW 195 N/2. Other children of Pinkney Blair were Asa Alonzo Blair (1859-1931) buried at Park Hill Cemetery), Minnie Mae Blair (1877-) married (1) Frank Robinson (2) Will Strunk, Isham N. Blair (1886-1906), and Frankie N. Blair (b. 1894-). Parents were George W. Blair (6 Apr 1817 Warren County, Tennessee, son of Alexander Blair and Rebecca Brown, he and his wife came west with son Dr. Hannibal Blair in 1877 and returned to Missouri that same year) and mother was Sarah/Sally Rook (24 Jan 1818 Granger County, Tennessee the daughter of Hezekiah Rook and Lucy Watson. Blair (1817-) Tennessee son of Alexander Blair and Rebecca Brown and Sarah (Sally) Rook (1818- Granger County Tennessee) the daughter of Hezekiah Rook and Lucy Watson. BLAIR, NANCY ELLEN

June 26, 1869 (con't)

The Tribune last week indulged in some very unwarranted reflections upon the character of Mr. CHAS. H. HUBBS, the accommodating telegraph operator at Vancouver, because his dispatch to the press stated that the FLETCHER affray was the result of an old feud between the parties. MR. HUBBS stated the plain truth, but the truth did not suit PROSCH's purposes, and he belabors an innocent man merely to make capital for his party. It is proper that money should be considered the root of evil when it makes a man descend to the dirty work PROSCH and WATSON have done.

Standard

We have no wish to injure MR. HUBBS, but the first telegram sent by him to Portland stated the shooting was the result of a "political quarrel." To dissipate all doubts on this point we publish the telegram sent by HUBBS May 31, 1869. We copy from the Oregonian of June 1st. HUBBS stated to us that he sent this telegram to the Associate Press:

Vancouver, May 31. - A sad shooting affray occurred at this place just now. THOS. J. FLETCHER was mortally wounded in a political quarrel. * * *
