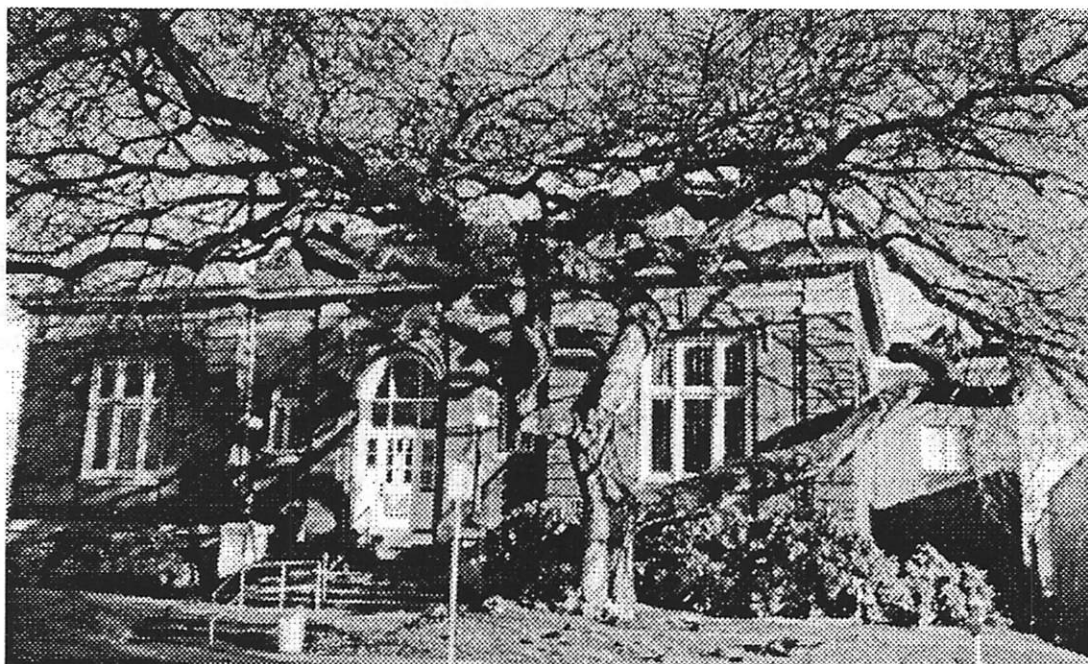


Workshop a Success

Museum's Elm Tree

The old elm in front of the museum is a familiar sight when we go to the CCGS library, which is located in its basement. The mushrooms growing off its root system are symptoms of its decay. You may have noticed them as you went up the steps. They were huge. The city arborist Elizabeth Walker and a tree company will examine the tree to see the best approach to lengthening the life of the tree.

Planted about 85-90 years ago, the elm spreading its branches around the corner and across the street. In the winter it lets the sunshine in. In the summer, its leaves off cooling shade. It has become the air conditioning for this historic library.



List of Men Subject to Military Duty in Clarke Co. W.T. in 1888

Extracted by Peggy M. Winston, CGRS¹

In 1888, the Legislature of the Territory of Washington passed an Act "for the more efficient organization and discipline of the militia of the Territory of Washington." It was each county assessor's duty to annually make out a list of all persons who were liable to do military duty under the laws of the United States and of the Territory. This list would include all able-bodied male citizens between the ages of eighteen and forty-five years, unless exempt by law.

The original register containing this list is located at the Southwest Regional Branch of the State Archives in Olympia. Only the name and precinct was shown, with the spelling just as it appears below.

MORTALITY SCHEDULES

The 1860, 1870, and 1880 mortality schedules for Clark County, Washington, was published in the VII Vol. 4 *Trail Breakers*. Check your back issues or library for this information.

The 1860 schedule includes name, age, is married, birthplace, month of death, occupation, cause of death and length of death. The 1870 schedule includes name, age, birthplace, month died, occupation, and cause of death. The 1880 schedule includes name, age, where born, where the father and mother were born, the month the person died, the cause of death and the attending physician. It may also include how long they were a resident.

Mortality schedules are reports of deaths for the previous year. As it was a federal census, it should be available for all states. It just could be a resource that could help you. In 1880 a Diphtheria epidemic swept through Clark County and many children are listed. The editor found two Goddard children relatives who fell to this epidemic. Washington was a part of Oregon in 1850.

On the Oregon Mortality schedules were found the deaths of Joseph Switzler (1870) and Mary Switzler (1850) – a help for this researcher.

FELL IN THE FRONT: Lieutenant Harry Boutelle Was With the Foremost Scouts.

People who knew Harry Boutelle as boy and young man are not surprised at hearing of his being in the front rank, where danger abounded. At Vancouver and Olympia and the different army posts where his father was stationed, he was always noted as a manly, brave boy, full of daring and a love of adventure.

A correspondent of Manila, Freedom, writing from Cabanatuan on November 3, said:

"Batson's scouts encountered insurgents lying in ambush between Santiago and Zaragossa, charged and drove them from their position, killing seven. Lieutenant Boutelle was killed, and one private was wounded in Batson's force.

"The death of Lieutenant Boutelle, of Batson's scouts, was the saddest incident of the day. As usual, he took the lead of the main body while advancing between Santiago and Zaragossa. The insurgents had laid a plan to ambush the intrepid band of scouts, and from close cover opened fire on them as they rode up, killing Lieutenant Boutelle and mortally wounding one of the men.

"The deaths were well avenged, for the detachment made a most savage attack against the ambushed foe, and by a most brilliant charge drove them headlong into the woods. The pursuit was kept up until every insurgent had been disposed of

or disappeared." *Vancouver Independent*, Dec 7 1899, p3.

A dispatch from Manila of the 11th says **Captian Sturgess** with a troop of the 11th Cavalry surprised forty insurgents of General Pando's command at Narsemergary yesterday. The insurgents had a major and two privates killed, a lieutenant and three privates wounded and a lieutenant and fourteen men with twenty-one rifles captured. This troop is the one in which several Vancouver boys, including **George Bundy**, **Ralph Wilson** and **Joe Goddard** are members. *Vancouver Independent*, Dec. 14, 1899, p3.

MEMORIAL SERVICES. The remains of **Edward S. Moore**, who was killed near Manila, February 28, 1899, while serving as a volunteer, in Company G, 1st Montana Volunteers, arrived here from Manila, P. I., last Monday.

A committee appointed by Vancouver Lodge No. 6, Knights of Pythias, of which deceased was a member, consisting of **J. A. C. Brant**, **S. J. Miller** and **M. L. Coovert**, in company with **Chester** and **Harry Moore**, brothers of the deceased, met the train bearing the body at Portland and brought it to this city, where the remains, enclosed in a metal casket, were kept in the Knight's lodge room, attended by a guard of honor detailed from Co. G, Washington National Guard until the funeral yesterday.

The Knights of Pythias had full charge of the funeral, which was held from the lodge room at 2 o'clock. After the knights had read their short but impressive burial service, Rev. Todd made a few appropriate remarks in conclusion of the services at the hall. The body was taken to the city cemetery on a government caisson, where the remainder of the service was held.

The following resolutions were adopted by the Knights of Pythias:

WHEREAS; It has pleased the Supreme Ruler of the Universe to remove from our midst our friends and brother **Edward S. Moore**, who was killed in battle in front of Manila, Philippine Islands, on the 28th day of February, 1899, while serving as a volunteer in defense of his country, as

a private in Co. "G" First Montana Volunteer Infantry, and

WHEREAS: **Edward S. Moore** was a life long resident of the city of Vancouver, and a member in good standing of Vancouver Lodge No. 6, Knights of Pythias; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That we, the officers and members of Vancouver Lodge No. 6, K. of P., deeply deplore the untimely death of our friend and brother **Edward S. Moore**. that in his decease this lodge has lost a faithful and honorable member, and the members a sincere and true friends and associate, while the state and nations have lost a loyal and patriotic citizen.

RESOLVED FURTHER, That we extend to the bereaved relatives of our deceased brother our heartfelt sympathy,

RESOLVED FURTHER, That these resolutions be spread upon the minutes of this lodge; that copies thereof be published in The Senator, the official organ of the order, and in the local press, and an engrossed copy be furnished to each of the brothers of the deceased, and another be engrossed and framed and hung upon the walls of our Castle Hall.

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the charter of this lodge be draped for the period of thirty days. COMMITTEE. *Vancouver Independent*, 1 Feb 1900 p3.

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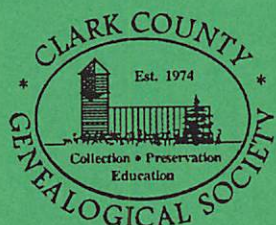
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
