Heisson, Wash. Dec. 21- Mr. and Mrs. Samuel M. Webb, residents on a farm near Crawford, Wash., celebrated their 68th

wedding anniversary Thursday. Both were born in Russell Co., VA, Mr. Webb Oct. 15, 1835, and Mrs. Webb on Oct. 18, 1846. They were married in Bristol, Tenn., on Dec. 12, 1861. At present they are both enjoying good health. Mr. Webb does some chores every day and will not use a cane. He is a faithful reader of the OR Journal and at times reads without the aid of spectacles. Mrs. Webb does all of her own housework and helps with the work outside.

Mr. Webb is a Civil War Veteran having served with Company 'G', 29th VAns, Confederate States of America. His wife, whose maiden name was Mary Ellen Taylor, can recall the trials and hardships endured by the mothers, wives, and children of the men on the battlefield.

After the war, the Webbs farmed in VA until 1882. On Oct. 4 of that year they left Abington, VA, with their seven children and went to St. Louis, and from there to Portland and moved to Crawford, where they bought 480 acres, part of which is the farm where they live at present. During the 47 years of their residence in Clark County, they have seen many changes. They have eight children, 14 grandchildren, and 12 great grandchildren.

WAGON TRAIN TO WASHINGTON TERRITORY

Recently, while browsing among very old genealogical publications in the local library, I came across a query from a lady in Washington state, stating she was descended from James Biles and his wife, Nancy M. Biles, who came to Washington Territory in 1853, and asking for information on the parents and family of Nancy M. Biles. The query reminded me of a list of names which might be of interest to family researchers, as well as the very interesting story of the first wagon train through the Naches Pass of the Cascade Mountains into the Washington Territory.

The hardships endured by the pioneers in the wagon train are recounted in 'The Busy Life of Eighty-Five Years by Ezra Meeker (Indianapolis: Press Wm. B. Burford, 1916), and Ox-Team Days on the Oregon Trail, by Ezra Meeker with Professor Howard R. Driggs, University of Utah. The story is too long for our purpose, here, and the names of the pioneers are our primary interest.

Nancy M. Biles, incidentally, was Nancy Merry Carter, daughter of James and Susannah (Dickey) Carter. James Carter was born in Bedford County, Virginia, in 1776 and Susannah Dickey was born in North Carolina in 1788. They married, 1803, in Davidson County (Nashville), Tennessee, and settled in Henry County, Tennessee, in 1822. (See The Colonial Genealogist, IV:3:72-80, "Carter of Lancaster County, Virginia, and of Tennessee".) Nancy M.

Carter married, first, George Wiley Biles and, after his death, she married his cousin, James Biles, a Presbyterian minister, who was a principal leader of this wagon train in 1853.

Early in the spring of 1853, a company gathered together from Indiana, Illinois, and Missouri to form a wagon train headed for the Willamette Valley in the Washington Territory. Somewhere on the Platte River, the company was joined by a group from Kentucky. James Biles was a leader of the train and Nelson Sargent acted as guide. Enduring extreme hardships, the wagon train made it through the Cascade Mountains in wintertime conditions--the first wagon train through the Naches Pass--having crossed the Yakima River eight times and the Naches River sixty-eight times, as well as the turbulent White River and the Columbia. For the last 50 miles there was not a blade of grass for their animals. When the bedraggled pioneers came out of the mountains, the people in the Willamette Valley were astonished, as there was no road through the mountains. The pioneers had literally to cut their way, at times, through sagebrush as high as a covered wagon and, at others, through the timber. They descended Mud Mountain in a drenching rain. Settlers in the valley could hardly believe their eyes. At one point, an almost perpendicular bluff of over 30 feet lay across the path, and a reconnoiter showed there was no way around the precipice. Sixty-six wagons had to be lowered one at a time by ropes lengthened with the hide of three steers cut into strips. A team of oxen was hitched to a wagon, the wheels locked, small logs with branches tied to the wagon for braking, and the ropes tied to the back of the wagon to lower it down the bluff. Two wagons were lost, but, in the two full days it took to get the wagons down, the other sixty-four wagons made it safely.

When the pioneers came out of the mountains, Mrs. James Longmire and her children were walking a hundred yards or so before the teams. She met a man walking toward her, who stopped in astonishment and exclaimed: "Good God, woman, where did you come from? Are there any more with you?"

The pioneers camped near the cabin of John Lackey, and he and Dr. Tolmie, head of the British company, furnished them with food. Most of the pioneers settled in the Puyallup Valley, the Biles family in Tumwater, Washington, George H. Himes and family in Portland, Stephen Judson in Steilacoom, Nelson Sargent in Grand Mound.

1 While most of these pioneers listed as from Kentucky may have been from Kentucky, two of the settlers, at least, were from Tennessee. Nancy Merry (Carter) Biles was from Henry County, Tennessee, and the Biles' home was Giles County, Tennessee, although it is not unlikely Nancy and James Biles settled in Kentucky after their marriage.

2. The Bakers listed here may also have been from Tennessee. A.W.D. Baker owned the land adjoining the Carter land in Henry County, Tennessee.

**History of Augusta County,
Virginia**, by; J. Lewis Peyton, A
fascinating, detailed history. Peyton
describes, among other things, how roads
were built and expanded; how numerous
Presbyterian churches were formed before
1740; and how Augusta Academy (later
known as Washington and Lee University)
was opened in 1749. Augusta County's
involvement in the Civil War, including
the battles of Mt. Crawford and Piedmont
Receives substantial treatment. Officer
rosters are included for the Staunton
Artillery, The West Augusta Guard, and
the 5th. and 52nd. Virginia Volunteer
Infantries. Numerous original records
supplement the volume. A section of the
book is dedicated to genealogies,
including the family of John Lewis, which
is carried into the 1860's. Eighty-eight
pages of genealogies follow, including the
families of Baldwin, Bell, Campbell,
Cochran, Crawford, M'Cue, M'Dowell,
Peyton, Preston, Stuart and Waddell.

**Virginia Carrolls and Their
Neighbors - 1618 - 1800's**, by;
Elizabeth Carroll Foster, This book
follows the Carrolls from Ireland to
Virginia. O'Cearbhaill was a descendant
of Cearbhaill and his son MacCearbhaill.
The Gaelic surname was anglicized to
O'Carroll or MacCarroll. The name
means "warlike champion." Before the
invasion of Ireland [795-1014] there were
six distinct septs of O'Carroll, and the two
most important ones were the O'Carrolls
of Ely (counties Tipperary and Offaly) and
the O'Carrolls of Oriel (counties
Monaghan and Louth). It is these septs
that the author traces. The "O" and "Mac"
were dropped for Carroll several centuries
back, only to pop up again near the end of
the 19th. century and later during the
Easter Rebellion. Carroll is used now
almost universally. Variations of the
Carroll surname include: O'Carroll,
MacCarroll, MacCarvill, and MacCarrill,
though most are O'Carroll.

List of Men Subject to Military Duty in Clarke Co. W.T. in 1888 – Part II

Extracted by Peggy M. Winston, CGRS¹

In 1888, the Legislature of the Territory of Washington passed an Act "for the more efficient organization and discipline of the militia of the Territory of Washington." It was each county assessor's duty to annually make out a list of all persons who were liable to do military duty under the laws of the United States and of the Territory. This list would include all able-bodied male citizens between the ages of eighteen and forty-five years, unless exempt by law.

The original register containing this list is located at the Southwest Regional Branch of the State Archives in Olympia. Only the name and precinct was shown, with the spelling just as it appears below.

CLARK COUNTY SPANISH-AMERICAN SOLDIERS

The remains of **John R. Thompson**, who was well known in this place, passed through Portland last Saturday on the way to Olympia, where they will be interred. Mr. Thompson died of disease while serving as chaplain of Washington Volunteers in Manila. *Vancouver Independent*, 8 Feb 1900 p3.

M. J. Hidden and **Harry Swartz** left Tuesday for Walla Walla and other eastern points in the state for duty with **Captain Cheever**, 6th cavalry, in the purchasing of 100 more cavalry horses. **Captain Wainwright**, who has been at the head of this work, has been stationed at Chicago on recruiting duty. *Vancouver Independent*, 8 Feb 1900 p3

Sergeant Cook, Co. C, 14th infantry, who has been home on a furlough for the past month, left for Manila last Monday to join his regiment. *Vancouver Independent*, 15 Feb, 1900

The remains of **Benjamin Hubbard**, who died of disease in the Philippines, arrived here Monday. *Vancouver Independent*, 15 Feb 1900

Irwin Shaw, son of **Wm. Shaw**, of this city, who has served an enlistment with Co. H, 4th Cavalry, the latter part of which was served in the Philippines, received his discharge and returned to his home in this city last week. *Vancouver Independent*, 15 Feb 1900 p2

The shipment of Cavalry horses that has accumulated at this place were transported to Portland Tuesday and Wednesday, and put aboard the transport *Lennox* which will leave for Manila during the week. This shipment is composed of 450 horses purchased throughout Washington and Oregon and is the second large shipment from this

place for Manila. Among those to go from this place as hostlers were **R. Ellis**, **C. M. Allen**, **I. Monee** and **John Poindexter**. *Vancouver Independent*, 8 Mar 1900

FUNERAL OF SERGEANT LAWS

The funeral of **Thomas J. Laws**, late Sergeant of company L, Fourteenth Infantry, whose remains reached here from Manila last Friday, took place Sunday from the Presbyterian church. Brief funeral services were conducted by the **Rev. Hugh Lamont**, pastor of the Presbyterian church. In addition to the relatives and a large number of friends of the dead soldier, the funeral exercises were attended by the members of Ellsworth Post G. A. R., and the Woman's Relief Corps, the regular Army and Navy Union and company G, National Guard of Washington, and a number of former members of the Fourteenth Infantry. The remains were deposited in the military cemetery.

Thomas J. Laws was born in Illinois, July 31, 1869. In 1889 he enlisted in the Fifth United States Cavalry, serving five years during which he took part in the battle of Wounded Knee against the Sioux Indians, and was one of a company of soldiers that were lost for many days in the Bad Lands of Dakota and nearly perished from thirst. Later he enlisted at Chicago in the Fourteenth Infantry and served three years. At the breaking out of the war with Spain, he again enlisted with his old regiment and accompanied it to the Philippine Islands, where he was killed in action June 13, 1899, having previous to that time taken part in every action in which his regiment was engaged. He was lying on his stomach in the act of firing, when he was struck in the mouth by a Mauser bullet and killed instantly. Deceased was a brother of **C.C. Laws**, of this city, and left a young widow, to who he was married in the city

December 5, 1897. *Vancouver Independent*, Mar 22, 1900, p3.

FROM CAPE NOME.

Cape Nome, Alaska, June 29, 1900

To the Editor:

Well we have reached the Eldorado of the North, the land of midnight sun.

Leaving Vancouver on the night of May 30th we reached Seattle the next morning at 7:45 a.m. and reported for duty at 9 a.m. when we were informed that we would hold ourselves in readiness to take the Transport **Atheman**, which was due to arrive in Seattle the following Saturday. She pulled into the dock at Seattle Saturday morning laded to 27 feet, including 1,850,000 feet of lumber. At Seattle we put aboard 86 animals, including 22 mules and six horses for Cape Nome. We were then tied up by the custom house officers for two days, they claiming that a foreign boat could not clear form and unload at two American ports, so we had to wait until the question was settled by the officials at Washington. On June 6th at 12:45 we pulled in our gang plank and amid cheers from fifteen hundred people sailed down the bay.

The old **Athenan** is a 15 knot boat, being 365 feet long and 45 feet wide and rides the water like a cork.

Saturday night, June 9th, we encountered quite a storm. I was on duty, waves rolling mountain high. Every time you took oncustop [?], you went about fifteen and I was compelled to turn in at 2:30. Some of the boys were sick, Bud being in bed the most of one day and high. Mr. Cook was quite sick but aside form the one night I felt fine, never missed a meal and we were treated royally by the cooks.

We did not go by way of Dutch Harbor, but by way of Outmak pass, which

This country is started from Nome and 60 miles back. None of the country has been prospected with the exception of the beach, which in some instances has proved quite rich, but take a tenderfoot's advice and stay in Vancouver. Working for U.S. is all right, but when you have to sleep on the wet, boggy ground with mud from 18 to 20 inches deep, which is the case with this whole country, around Cape Nome, with the whole country invested with Typhoid fever germs, then is the time when you wish you "hadn't left your happy house."

Our boys, 38 in number, are well. **Bud** was vaccinated on board ship, and has had quite a sore arm. **Reigle, Cook, Williams, Laws** and **John Peter Kiggins**, "he life and kicker of the party," are well.

So far we have had no work to do. The **Rosecrans**, which has all our supplies, and our cook, **Will Kruse**, was stuck for 6 or 7 days on the Yukon flats and had to return to Dutch Harbor for coast, so we are patiently waiting a chance to work.

We have met several of the old Vancouver boys. **John Secrist, Bill Bessmer, Wm. Healy**, and **Bill Wolenweber**. **Secrist** and **Bessmer** just came down from Dawson and had no more than got in that they ran across us. They look like Indians, they are so tanned up but they are just the same old boys.

I tell you Mr. Editor we were duly initiated into the wilds and mysteries of the wild and wooly north.

Last Monday night two men were killed within 100 feet of our house. Shot down in a dispute over the possession of a town lot. On Tuesday night we had another man for breakfast. An innocent bystander shot by a tin-horn gambler. A boy 21 years old who had just landed and was taking in the sights.
