JENNIE-AL-OH-GEE! by Jane Germann

Well, that's what some of the relatives called it when they'd ask how it was going. Some of them were teasing, but I think that was how a couple of the older people usually called it -- stressing the AL. And we didn't have any family members named either Jenny or Al. Oh, gee!

Jeanie-all-o-gee (genealogy) has been a serious hobby for me since I went to England with my cousin Hazel in 1984. I had prayed one of those far out prayers that went something like: "Well, Lord, you know how you have me working on the family history and I'd really like to go to England and visit some of the family places. You know I don't have the money for the air ticket over, and then you'd have to come up with some nut that would like to spend a lot of time in libraries." It was one of those, "No way will this happen" prayers. Well, he amazingly answered it within three months! Fortunately I had a valid passport, because Hazel called to say her husband Ken was simply refusing to go and would I like to go on his ticket -- in two days. And Hazel lovingly fit that library nut I had asked for in my prayer.

Actually, I had taken some CCGS classes and had started building family sheets and files. And I had friends challenging me about doing this thing that is clearly rejected in the New Testament! They would remind me that it said, "avoid genealogies" in 1 Timothy 1:4 and Titus 3:9. You can't get any more direct than that!

So what did it mean and why were all those genealogies listed in the Bible if they weren't important to God? It started me on a scripture study. In a concordance I looked up genealogy and genealogies. It took me in to I Chronicles 4:33, 5:1, 7, & 17, 7:5 & 7, 7:9 & 40, 9:1 & 22; to II Chronicles 12:15, 31:16-19; to Ezra 2:62; 8:1 & 3; to Nehemiah 7:5 & 64; to 1 Tim 1:4 and to Titus 3:9. And this didn't even get me into all those lists of begots.

Let me be clear that my Mormon relatives -- I'm not -- (one on my husband's side and one on mine) were encouraging. But I had some friends who were very critical. I was attending St Luke's

Episcopal Church at the time and really appreciated the training I got there -- to check it all out before making a conclusion and, as Father Walters put it, summarize it into a Nutshell Gospel -- that is a one phrase zinger.

So I began and found that the Jews kept genealogical records. (They still do.) And they talked about being unclean and being deleted from the record. They talked about a census of fighting men (sound familiar?). There were records kept by prophets and seers. Records were kept to validate who could serve in the temple: the records were searched and if they were not found, they were excluded from the priesthood as unclean. In the New Testament, we are told not to devote ourselves to endless genealogies as they promote controversies rather than God's work (I Tim 1:4) and again to avoid foolish controversies and genealogies because they are unprofitable and useless (Titus 3:9). Balanced with the Old Testament, a Nutshell was forming: God has no grandchildren!

We can't use the shirttail method of depending upon the faith of others to see us get into heaven -- we need to come on a first name basis because God has no grandchildren. It is that personal relationship with the father that counts.

So I'm still working away at my genealogy, because God is my father. And I continue to look for those elusive lines like a good detective

(Oh by the way, my husband does have an Uncle Al, a cousin Al, and had a step-grandfather Albert. Guess I ended up with some jeannie-AL-o-gee after all.) And my cousin Hazel took me back to England -- again in January! Hurray!

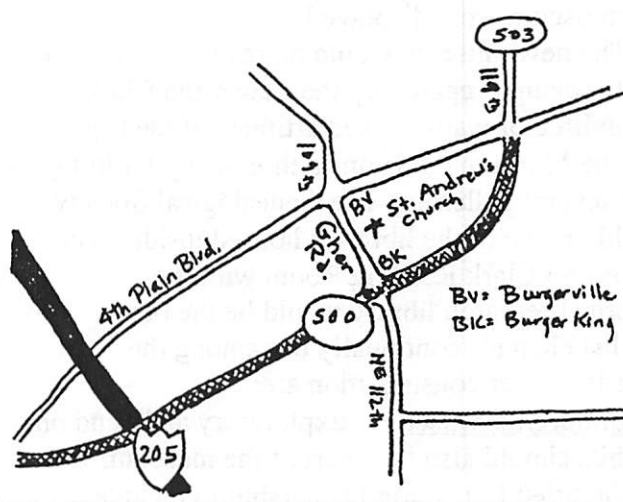

It is important that Jesus comes from the house of David and that he has a harlot in his line. It is important that Abraham, Issac, and Jacob were related (Grandfather, Father, and Son). A NEW MUSEUM FOR CLARK COUNTY

The new museum project is finally off with a bang. It is many years in the making, but plans are to have a new museum in time for the Lewis and Clark Bicentennial Celebration.

In June the historic Hudson's Bay flag, which was recently restored by the Ft. Vancouver Historical Society, was loaned to the Canadians for exhibit in Victoria. A gathering of city officials with the Historical Society members and the men aboard the frigate HMCS VANCOUVER celebrated at the Beaches Restaurant honoring the loan of the flag.

Cups with the above logo of Lewis and Clark were for sale and placards about the building of a new museum were displayed.

The new museum would be ready to house an exhibit being prepared by the Lewis and Clark Committee of many loaned artifacts of the trip.

The Museum envisions a three-story building with several galleries. The Genealogical Society would be one of the libraries housed inside. The Lewis and Clark Reading Room with the historical research library would be the other. The list changes continually but among the galleries under consideration are:

Children's Museum: Exploratory and hand on exhibits should also be a part of the museum. Maybe titled Education Leadership to include adults?

Chinook Nation: From the Pacific Ocean to the The Dalles a dozen tribes occupied the lower Columbia River Valley with strong centers at the Columbia River mouth, the Wasco and rendezvous area of Celilo Falls, Wishram and The Dalles and in and adjacent to Clark County.

Columbia River: What part does the Columbia River play in our lives?

Culture Ethnicity: A proposed major expansion toward a real History and Culture

Center. Hispanics and Asiatic of the Pacific Rim would be included.

Environment and Natural History could be included without the stuffed birds and animals of traditional museums. (Perhaps holograms will be available in the future at a price we could afford?)

Exploration Pioneering: Many cultures explored the Pacific Northwest.

Garden Country: Our area can grow very diverse produce.

Geology: The Pacific Northwest has a unique and fascinating geology.

Health Care: The first Chief Factor, Dr. John McLoughlin was a doctor and the area has been progressive in the building of hospitals and clinics. An old medical office is already a small exhibit that could be expanded.

High Technology new developments.

Maritime and Military could receiver much more coverage as two separate museum areas.

SP&S Railway Museum: Already a part of the museum, this display can easily be doubled by recent and future changes such as Amtrak, the logging railroads, commuter rapid transit.

Visual Arts: Perhaps a place where local artists could display their art.

These are among the galleries /museums being considered for the new building. It would be a large and new building and could also contain a Visitors Information Center which would be open 24 hours a day. As the public we need to let the committee know what we envision for the new museum. What would you like to see?????

Eight thousand square feet has been requested for CCGS. This museum is indented to last in the next century and we want to have space to grow with it. The new building would be handicapped accessible.

And it would certainly be nice to have office space along with the library and have our own hours. What do you see for the Clark County Genealogical Society in the next hundred years?

Dealing with the Old Building

While we wait for the new building, we are still actively and continually seeking to improve the library. Two issues pop immediately to mind: handicap accessibility and additional hours.

The steps up and back down to the basement are formidable. Those who can negotiate three steps can call ahead and let the museum know you are coming. They are glad to open the back area and allow you to come down the steps in the storage area that opens to the library. Some wheel chairs can make this also. It takes some advance

planning if you wish to be there for the opening, as one would have to call the day before to arrange for the curator to be ready. The phone number is 695-4681.

The additional hours are being worked on. First we need staff to be available. Morning hours and evening hours are being considered. What would you like to see? Longer hours in the morning? Longer in the evening? Another day. Right now we do have times when the library is empty (believe it or not). What works best?

Clark County Pioneer: William S. Douthit Family

Lois M. Moller, 1620 NE Country Club Ave., Gresham, OR 97030, 1-503-666-4041, submitted these corrections and additions to page 490 of the "Clark County Pioneers, A Centennial Salute."

William S. Douthit was married to Margaret Wagenblast (not Wiley). Lois notes that Margaret's sister, Louisa, was married to Henry Weinhard. After the family moved to Oregon in 1881, three more children were born: Burton L., b. 24 March 1881 - d. 31 October 1950; Margaret Ruth, b. 3 January 1884 - d. 1971; Amy Fay, b. 23 March 1887 - d. 4 September 1949.

Dies at 97

One of Multnomah county's pioneer women who assisted in the establishment of two churches in the county, Mrs. William S. Douthit passed away in Portland January 31st at the age of 97. Funeral Services were held last Friday.

Pioneer Passes

Funeral services were held last Friday, February 4th, at a Portland Funeral chapel for Mrs. William S. Douthit, nee Margaret Wagenblast, 97-year-old pioneer resident of eastern Multnomah county and mother of Mrs. John Moller. Announcement of Mrs. Douthit's death in Portland on January 31st, was carried in the Fairview news of The Outlook last week.

The service was conducted by Rev. Pederson, of Portland, and interment was made in the Masonic cemetery in Portland.

Mrs. Douthit was born in St. Joseph, Missouri, on August 13, 1846, and would have been 98 years old next August. She had been confined to bed for the last eight years, but prior to that had maintained an active interest in civic, fraternal, religious and political affairs which had filled her life for many years.

The deceased came to the northwest with her parents in an ox train, walking most of the way. They were members of Dr. Keil's colony and spent their first winter at Willapa Bay, Washington. The next spring the family moved to Oregon City, but later returned to Washington and located at Vancouver, where she married William Sherwood Douthit in 1964. Ten Children were born to the couple and the father passed away in 1890.

An ardent worker, Mrs. Douthit greatly assisted her husband who was prominently

identified with the early political life of the northwest and was a member of the first legislature of the state of Washington.

The Douthits moved to Oregon in 1881 and located on a large farm along the banks of the Columbia river. The place is now the site of Portland air base. Mrs. Douthit and her husband assisted in the organization of the Methodist church at Columbia Slough and also at Fairview. She was a member of the Oregon Pioneer Association and a life member of Rockwood Grange.

Surviving Mrs. Douthit are seven of her 10 children, Charles W. Douthit, of Clatskanie; George A. Douthit, of Vernonia; Roy G. Douthit, of Lancaster, California; Burton S. Douthit, of Portland; Mrs. John Moller, of Fairview; Mrs. Amy Frakes, of Alameda, California, and Henry Douthit, of Troutdale. She is also survived by 16 grandchildren, 16 great grandchildren, and one great, great grandchild.

Many Gather to Honor Aged Portland Woman

The home of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Douthit in the Victory district was the scene Sunday of a celebration in honor of Mrs. Margaret Douthit, mother of Henry Douthit, whose 86th birthday anniversary fell on August 18. Twenty-six persons were present and an enjoyable day was spent with picnic dinner under the great cherry trees.

Seven of Mrs. Douthit's eight living children were present, with members of their families. They were Mrs. John Holtgrieve of Vancouver, Wash; Roy Douthit of Los Angeles, George Douthit of Vernonia, B.F. Douthit of Portland, Henry Douthit of Troutdale, Mrs. John Moller of Fairview and Mrs. George Frakes of Scappose, Ore. Charles Douthit of Clatskanie was the son not present.

Mrs. Douthit was born in Missouri. She came with her parents to Oregon in 1855 [article corrected from original] and celebrated her eighth birthday anniversary of the plains. The family lived at Oregon City and Vancouver, Wash. Mrs. Douthit lived for a short time near Gresham but has been a resident of Portland for many years.

The third child of William and Margaret is listed as "Anna J." Her name was Ella J. and she married John Holtgrieve on Christmas 1890, not to a David Wessels in 1893. Her first son was born in December 1893. Carrie E.

Douthit was married to Thomas Savage (not John F. Totton).

Mr. Holtgrieve is survived by the widow, Ella J., two sons, Raymond of Bridal Veil, Or., and Lester of Vancouver, route 5, a brother Charles E. of Portland, two sisters, Mrs. Oceanna Baker and Mrs. Henrietta Miller of Portland.

Generation No. I

1. JAMES MUNSELL⁵ BURT, DR. (MUNSELL⁴, BENJAMIN³, SAMUEL², CHRISTOPHER¹) was born June 05, 1832 in Cistro, Ohio, and died November 11, 1903 in Vancouver, Washington. He married (1) MARTHA TERHUNE October 30, 1851 in Edgar Co. Illinois. He married (2) XANTIPPA CRABB November 23,

1854, daughter of JEREMIAH CRABB and JANE SWANN.

Dr. James M. Burt began the study of medicine in 1862, attending lectures in Ohio, but never obtained a degree. He practiced medicine four years in Adair and Grundy County Missouri. In 1874 he came to Clark County, Washington and for a short time resided in Vancouver. From here he removed to Battleground where he lived for a number of years. For a long time he was almost the only physician who practiced in the northern portion of the county. It was while making these visits over a new and almost inaccessible country, generally on horseback that he suffered the exposures which afterwards undermined his health.

When in his prime Dr. Burt was an enthusiastic sportsman. While with a hunting party in 1893 the accidental discharge of a rifle so injured his left arm as to necessitate its amputation at the shoulder. Dr. Burt was a prominent member of the Odd Fellows Lewisville Lodge No.97. The above story from Dr. Burt's obituary in The Oregonian Nov. 1903.

The following excerpt is from "The History of Battleground" in which Dr. Burt was interviewed by E. Skarstedt:

Battlegrounds first "resident" doctor was James M. Burt, who began studying medicine in 1862, received his "lectures" in Ohio in 1866 and 1867 began practicing in Missouri. He came to Battleground in 1874 and settled at the end of an old road on a place which is presently on Allworth Road about 2 miles east and south of Battleground. Dr. Burt moved to Lewisville in 1887 and continued his practice in the area until 1892, moving his office to Vancouver.

E. Skarstedt noted that the doctor had no library when he visited his home

in 1886, though he gave him credit for some skills. The Doctor did not have a degree. Mrs. Burt (Xantippa Crabb) was described by Skarstedt as being an unattractive unpleasant old lady, who wouldn't visit a single newcomer from Europe as long as there was a "native" to visit.

James M. Burt married Xantippa Crabb. She was born in Indiana, and it is believed that they were married in Vermilion Co. Indiana. Xantippa Crabb was the daughter of Jeremiah Crabb and Jane Swann. Jeremiah Crabb was born in 1804 in Indiana. Jane Swann was born in 1804 in Pennsylvania. Her father was born in Maryland and her mother in Virginia. Xantippa's father died prior to 1850. Her mother Jane came to Clark Co. Washington with her daughter and lived with them until sometime after 1880.

James M. Burt, in the early years, Lewisville, Washington had 2 stores. One of the stores was built in 1887, on the west side of road 503, north of the Lewis River, it was built by Dr. James M. Burt and was operated by the doctor and his son Francis, for 3 years.

The father of Xantippa Crabb was Jeremiah Crabb born, Oct.22, 1804 in Indiana; he most probably died before 1850 in Vermillion County, Indiana.

Xantippa's mother was Jane Swann, born April.20, 1804 in Pennsylvania. Jane Swann's father was born in Maryland, and her mother in Virginia. Xantippa Crabb married Dr. James M. Burt on Nov.23, 1854, most probably in Indiana. Xantippa and her husband Dr. Burt moved to Clark Co., Washington in 1874. At that time Xantippa's mother Jane moved with them. So did Xantippa's brother Stephen Crabb and his large family, who all resided in Clark County, Washington. Xantippa's mother Jane was living with them in 1880 and died sometime thereafter.

James M. Burt, mentioned in this article, is the first person listed on the medical register for Clarke County. He registered one day before Richard S. Davis and two days before Ephraim T. McKenny. The whole article by Peggy Winston, CGRS, is next.

Medical Register Washington Territory Clarke County

Abstracted by Peggy M. Winston, CGRS

The Legislative Assembly of Washington Territory in 1881 created a law called *The Practice of Medicine and Surgery Regulated*. (Sections 2284-2294, Code of Wash. Terr., pp. 394-396.) In pursuance of this act, each county auditor was to maintain a medical register of the county, registering each practitioner of medicine and surgery practicing in that county. It was also to include any non-resident who advertised as a physician or surgeon and practiced in the county.

The Medical Register for Clarke County was used by the County Auditor from 1881-1890. The original register is located at the Southwest Regional Branch of the State Archives in Olympia.

The primary information recorded in this register and abstracted below include page number of register, name of practitioner, place of nativity, place of residence, name of college or university that conferred the degree of doctor of medicine and year conferred, any other degree that practitioner desired to place on record. (Vancouver, La Center, Washougal, and La Camas are located in Clarke County.) Chas. Brown, County Auditor, signed the records on pages 1-11. Pages 12-42 were signed by James A. Snodgrass, County Auditor. The remaining pages, 43-47, were unsigned by the auditor.

Her father completed and published the genealogy of her family four years ago. This major research effort into the Arrol, Arroll and Arrell families has been published in an 800 page, 7" X 9" volume, case bound in simulated leather and contains a photo gallery of 32

pages. Her father passed away two years ago. It is her desire to see this book in libraries and with genealogy societies so that it can be of value to others in their research.

We are very happy to add to our collection John Arrol's legacy. This book is a comprehensive study of those families bearing the surname Arrol, Arroll and Arrell and variant spellings. It is the result of an intensive ten year effort to locate families around the world bearing these surnames. The effort included personal visits by the author with many families in Australia, Canada, England, New Zealand, Northern Ireland, Scotland and the United States.

The study traces the names Arrol, Arroll, and Errol to the southeastern part of Loch Lomond in Dumbartonshire in the 1300's. It includes the genealogy of many families dating to the early 1600's in the same area of Scotland. The origin of these names, the earliest references to the name, and the geographic locations and occupations of those with these surnames has been extensively researched.

Additionally, the study gives a comprehensive overview of the name Arrell for those families who trace their heritage to Northern Ireland. The genealogy of the Arrells is traced to the early 1800's. Taken from an excerpt of the address given to the Washington Pioneers June 21, 1905, by Thomas W. Prosch.

"The first of these men were of the overland immigration of 1844, the most conspicuous figure among them being Michael T. Simmons. Simmons was a Kentuckian, tall, commanding, learned in the ways of men, but not of schools. Other with him were James McAllister, Samuel B. Crockett, Jesse Ferguson, David Kindred, Gabriel Johnson and George W. Bush, all but Crockett and Ferguson with families. On arriving at Fort Vancouver they did as everybody else did—inquired of McLoughlin and Douglas as to the country, the prospects, opportunities, and for advice. The representatives of the great company freely and frankly told them all they wanted, to-wit: That the Americans generally were locating south of the Columbia river, not one so far being north; that the Willamette was the largest valley north of Mexico, and was then in a condition of rapid commercial development; that the soil and climate there were good, the chances for trade excellent, the only schools in the country there, and that in every way they believed it to be preferable for those from the States there to settle."

A COMRADE'S TRIUTE

(By Glenn N. Ranck.)

EDITOR INDEPENDENT. A few weeks ago I was told that **John Barlow**, formerly a member of Co. G, 1st Washington Volunteers, was on his way home, and looked forward with pleasure to the day when I should again grasp his hand in friendly greeting. But my cup of joy was cruelly dashed aside, when I heard last Thursday, that my comrade was already dead and buried. We are prone to read long narratives, largely fictitious, about the heroes of some distant period, while one in our very midst suffers and dies un-honored and unsung. Though my friend was a member of Clarke county's own company, and gave up his life for us and our country, his death received but scant notice in the county papers.

John Barlow was a typical son of the state of Washington, having been born and raised on a farm in this county. He was patriotic by birthright and tradition, for his father died of wounds incurred during the great Rebellion. Our hero possessed the rugged virtues and blemishes of the ordinary country boy. He was neither polished nor scholarly. He was not a "society man." He was not at all ideal, as all essay heroes ought to be. It must even be confessed that I have never heard how high he stood in the little district school near Salmon Creek; nor do I wish to know. Enough for me that he fought bravely beneath the folds of that glorious flag that has never known defeat. Enough for me the simple fact that he died for his country. Warren did no more than this upon the slope of Bunker Hill, nor Ellsworth when he fell bleeding, on the stairway in Alexandria. The bugle call of duty had transformed the simple farmer boy into a deathless hero.

Dear comrades, Private **Barlow** will be with us no more on our march through life. In dreams only will we see him as we did at Manila, Santa Ana, Taging, Pateros, or in our little tents on the crest of Guadeloupe Ridge. He has heard the heaven-blown call of taps. After the weary march and the hard fought battle he rests peacefully amid the dews and damps of the consecrated cemetery at Wilson's Bridge.

"How sleep the brave, who sink to rest,
By all their country a wishes blest!
When spring with dewy fingers cold,
Returns to deck their hallowed mould,
She there shall dress a sweeter sod,
Than Fancy's feet have ever trod.
By fairy hand their knoll is sung,
By fortune unseen their dirge to sing;
There Honor comes a pilgrim grapy,
To bless the life that wraps their clay,
And freedom shallrepair,
To dwell a weeping hermit there."

DEATH OF SERGEANT MAJOR KELLEY: --
News was received in Vancouver last Monday of the death at Dyea, of **Sergeant Major Kelly**, of the 14th Infantry. He died on the evening of March 19, of cerebro-spinal meningitis, after an illness of only three days. A letter from Dyea says that he was strong, robust and healthy up to the hour of being taken with the disease, and his unexpected and untimely death has plunged the regiment into grief and alarm. Sergeant Kelly left a young wife in Vancouver, who has been sick for several months, and is not in a critical condition, brought thus by the news of the death of Mr. Kelly. A letter from Dyea states: "The day he was taken sick the soldiers were putting up the regimental flag-staff in front of Kelly's ten. When the flag was raised today it had to be put at half-mast - a most gloomy and foreboding omen for the regiment." The body was embalmed and sent to Seattle, and is expected here within a few days. Sergeant Kelly was very popular among the boys of the regiment and had many friends in this city. He was a member of the Young Men's Institute and also of the Catholic Knights. The Y. M. I. will conduct the funeral. *Vancouver Independent*, Mar 31, 1901, p3.

Ed McCammon, formerly of Vancouver Barracks, made a short visit with friends in the post and city Sunday, en route to San Francisco, where he will take passage for Manila. *Vancouver Independent*, April 4, 1901, p3.

A startling suicide was committed by Private Lansing of the 7th Infantry, last Sunday, in the presence of a score or more of witnesses. During retreat at the garrison he stood just behind the buglers and shot himself through the heart just as the cannon went off a sundown. Private Lansing was sent home from the Philippines a year or more ago on account of sickness and was stationed here as a convalescent for some time. He suffered a sun stroke while in the Philippines from which he never fully recovered. He was given a military funeral Monday. . *Vancouver Independent*, Nov. 7, 1901, p3.

BOOM FOR VANCOUVER.

The Army Board that has been in session at Washington since January 10th, has decided that Vancouver Barracks is to be the one great Army post of the Pacific Northwest. The board provides that twelve companies of Infantry, or a regiment, and two companies of Coast Artillery are to be stationed here. This increase in the strength of the post means a complete re-building of the barracks for soldiers and a large addition of quarters for the officers. Besides this it means Department Headquarters, that has long been threatened with removal, is to remain right here. This decision of the army board is of vast importance to Vancouver. This number of men to be stationed permanently here means an increase of permanent business, besides the building boom to be occasioned by providing quarters for this large garrison. Carpenters and workmen will be in demand, and building material will find a ready market. General Randall, commander of the Department of the Columbia, and a member of the army board, when called upon by a committee of the Vancouver Commercial Club before his departure for Washington said in case Vancouver was made a permanent post, he would recommend the erection of brick quarters for the men. This means plenty of work for the brickmasons. . *Vancouver Independent*, Feb 13, 1902, p3.

The remains of Chief Musician Morris of the 14th Infantry Band, who died in the Philippines about a year ago, arrived here Monday, and will be given a military

funeral Sunday, at two o'clock p.m. *Vancouver Independent*, May 8, 1902, p3.

SHOT A NEGRO.

APER RECEIVED FORM Manila during the week, relate the plucky act of Miss Edna Flick in shooting a negro burglar. Miss Flick, now in Manila as an army nurse, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J.D. Flick, of this county, and is well know, having graduated from the High School here in 1893. The story of the shooting as related in the Manila American of March 19, is as follows:

"Miss Lucile E.S. Flick, a member of the Army Nurse Corps, short and seriously wounded a negro named Huckleberry, who attempted to enter the nurses' quarters at 2 o'clock yesterday morning. Three shots were fired, and one took effect, piercing the left lung and making exit through the back. The man was picked up by police in a shack near the California Lumber Company's yard and taken to the San Juan de Dios Hospital, where he died of his wound. The shooting was entirely justifiable, the negro having made several attempts to enter the nurse's rooms and there was no other course to pursue but shoot. The pluck of Miss Flick, under the most trying circumstances, has won general admiration, and she has gained an enviable reputation for marksmanship."

Miss Flick graduated from the Vancouver High School in 1893. In 1894 she entered the Good Samaritan Hospital in Portland and graduated with honors in 1898. In 1900, she enlisted in the Army Nurse Corps and was stationed at the Presidio, California, until January of this year, when she was ordered to the Philippines. She is about 26 years of age. *Vancouver Independent*, Feb 13, 1902, p3.

CLARKE COUNTY BOY HONORED.

A recently issued order from the War Department directs that the sea coast batteries on the Presidio of San Francisco has been named in honor of Second lieutenant Henry W. Bontaile, Third United State Artillery, who was killed in action near Alinga, Philippine Island, November 2, 1898.

Lieutenant Bontaile was the only son of Captain F. A. Bontaile, now retired and living near Lewisville, this county, and was well know in Vancouver.

The battery mentioned will be know as Battery Bontaile. *Vancouver Independent*, Oct. 23, 1902, p3.

His obituary in the Vancouver Daily Columbian, dated Monday, April 8 1918 states differently and is consistent with information on marker. There was an additional newspaper article "Vancouver Independent", dated August 25 1898, page 3, that would support part of his military service, though not that of the cavalry.
