

**ANASTASIE SAVOIE:  
A Search for her Parents  
By John A. Young**

Among the early Acadian immigrants to arrive in the Opelousas Post area were Charles COMEAUX and his wife Anastasie SAVOIE. Their arrival in the area sometime prior to 1771 is documented in the census taken that year. At the time the census was taken they had two children, boys, aged four and two, allowing us to surmise that Charles and Anastasia were probably married sometime prior to 1767. The date and place of their marriage has yet to be found.

Charles and Anastasie remained in the Opelousas Post area until their deaths, she was buried on October 18, 1802, and he on August 19, 1805 "at age about 60 years".<sup>1</sup> During their life together they had at least seven children, many descendants of whom are still living in the southwest Louisiana area.

Identifying Charles COMEAUX as the son of Jean COMEAUX and Madeleine AMIRAULT of Chipoudy, Acadia was not difficult.<sup>2</sup> Identifying the parents of Anastasie SAVOIE has proven to be much more challenging.

The first evidence found thus far of Charles COMEAUX and his family being in the Opelousas Post area comes from the 1771 census.<sup>3</sup> On that census, Charles COMEAUX and his family appear as follows:

Charles COMO, age 29 [b. 1742]; Pierre SAVOIE, age 26 [b. 1745]; wife of Charles COMO, age 27 [b. 1744]; one son age 4 [b. 1767]; one son age 2 [b. 1769]; 19 cattle; 7 horses; 6 arpents without title.

Six years later, on the 1777 census,<sup>4</sup> the family of Charles COMEAUX (family # 110) appears as follows:

Charles COMAUT, age 40 [b. 1737]; 100 cattle; 15 horses; 50 hogs; and 0 sheep; Anastasie SAVOIE, age 34 [b. 1743] wife; Charles [Jr.], age 10 [b. 1767]; Pierre, age 8 [b. 1769]; Dorautee [Dorothy], age 7 [b. 1770]; Emelie, age 4 [b. 1773]; and Susanne COMEAUX, age 1 [b. 1776]; Slaves 1.

Living next to the Comeaux family at the time the 1777 census was taken is the following family (# 111):

Pierre SAVOIE, age 36 [b. 1741]; 60 cattle; 12 horses; 20 hogs; Louise BOURG, wife, age 20 [b. 1757]; one daughter, Scolastie, age 3 [b. 1774].

These two census (1771 and 1777) raise an interesting question. Why is Pierre SAVOIE listed with the family of Charles COMEAUX and his wife Anastasie SAVOIE on the 1771 census and with his family, living next door to them in 1777? From Bona Arsenault, Historie et Généalogie des Acadiens, and Harry J. SAVOY, Savoy/Savoie/Savois Families of Louisiana <sup>5</sup> we can ascertain that Pierre SAVOIE who married Louise BOURG at Pointe Coupee on July 11, 1771, is the son of Paul SAVOIE and Judith MICHEL of Chipoudy, Acadia, born in 1741. Bona Arsenault lists the following children born to Paul SAVOIE (son of Germain SAVOIE and Marie BREAUX) and Judith MICHEL (dau. of Jacques MICHEL and Catherine COMEAUX); <sup>6</sup>

1. Judith SAVOIE, b. 1723.
2. Marie Josephe SAVOIE, b. 1726.
3. Marie Madeleine SAVOIE, b. 1728.
4. Marguerite SAVOIE, b. 1730.
5. Francois SAVOIE, b. ca. 1730.
6. Charles SAVOIE, b. ca. 1732,<sup>7</sup> m. ca. 1754, Anne THIBODEAUX.
7. Pierre SAVOIE, b. 1741; m. 11 Jul 1772 (PC), Louise BOURQUE, d/o Charles BOURG & Anne BOUDREAUX.

It appears that possibly Pierre and Anastasie SAVOIE were related, possibly brother and sister. What is presented here is certainly not a preponderance of evidence, but rather, just a hint and a direction for further research.

Until a marriage record for Charles COMEAUX and Anastasie SAVOIE is found or other evidence uncovered, we can only speculate that, perhaps Pierre and Anastasie are brother and sister. If this were found to be fact, then Anastasie, born about 1743, would be the eight child in the family of Paul SAVOIE and Judith MICHEL. This would explain why Pierre was living in the Comeaux/Savoie Household in 1771 and next door to them in 1777. Further research into the family will either prove or disprove that Anastasie is a child of Paul SAVOIE and Judith MICHEL.

**MY GUILLORY ROOTS**

The Guillory family is very large with many branches. Each branch can be connected and relationship found if it is traced back far enough. We have been researching one branch of the tree. The ancestors and descendants of McKinly GUILLORY and Ella VEILLON of Pine Prairie, Louisiana. Both are now deceased but have left a great legacy.

Starting with the first Guillory we could find, Francois GUILLORY, born in Chateau sur Cher dois de, France in May 1606, died September 1666. Francois married Anna G. GAIOUN in 1628. They had several children, the one we were interested in being Simon GUILLORY, born in France on February 16, 1645, or 1646. Simon married Louise BOUCHARD in June of 1667. Louise was born on March 12, 1646, also in France and died May 15, 1703. Simon and Louise immigrated to Montreal, Canada where they both died, he on December 6, 1697, and she on May 15, 1703.

Simon and Louise had several children. The one of interest to us was Francois GUILLORY, born June 1676. Francois married Jean MONFORT in 1702. Francois and Jean died at Dauphins Island, Alabama, he in December 1731. The date of Jean's death is unknown.

Francois GUILLORY and Jean MONFORT had several children one being Joseph Gregory GUILLORY, born December 16, 1712, at Dauphins Island. Joseph Gregory married Marie Jean LACASSE, born about 1715, on August 20, 1739. She died about 1764, and he about 1770, in Mobile. Joseph Gregory and Marie Jean had a large family, some of the children being born in Mobile and others in St. Landry Parish. One son, Lastie GUILLORY was born in Mobile on December 22, 1754. Lastie married Marie Jean FONTENOT on July 12, 1781. Marie Jean was born June 6, 1766. Lastie died in St. Landry Parish on January 3, 1831, and Marie Jean in August 1842.

Lastie GUILLORY and Marie Jean FONTENOT had several children, among them was Lastie GUILLORY, II, born October 10, 1842. Lastie, II, married Julie BARON in St. Landry Parish on January 2, 1824. Julie, the daughter of Vallery BARON and Marie BORDELON was born on March 6, 1805. Lastie, II, died on March 7, 1853, and Julie on December 6, 1877. Among their children was Achille GUILLORY, born June 26, 1851, in Prairie Rhonde.

Achille married Lenora CHAPMAN (JAKMAN, CHACKMAN, etc.) on March 19, 1876.

(Guillory Roots con't.)

Lenora was born July 22, 1856. Achille GUILLORY died in Pine Prairie in March 1922, and Lenora on June 16, 1942. From the marriage of Achille and Lenora was born McKinley GUILLORY on September 10, 1901, in Ville Platte. McKinley was named for president William McKINLEY who was assassinated during his second term as president in 1901. McKinley married Ella VEILLON on February 18, 1922. Ella, the daughter of Regile VEILLON and Marie ARDOIN was born on January 9, 1904. McKinley died February 10, 1978, and Ella on December 5, 1992.

**Iota Homesteaded As Cartville; Famous for Artesian Wells**

"The community of Iota had its beginning in settlements by natives and the process of homesteading. Real influx came with the locating of a sawmill by the ABBOT family in the woods between the present town site and the town of Eagan.

At this site was also probably the first artesian well, which like the springs gave over to the flow of oil.

Change of times is reflected in such memories as those of Mrs Jules MENOU, Sr., who tells of her father's purchase of two trees for \$1.50 each with which he constructed a complete two-story house which consisted of four rooms and a kitchen!

Point Aux Loups, was the name given to the area in the vicinity of the present church. A Catholic mission was located at this site and the original chapel is now part of the present parochial hall of St. Joseph Church.

Cartsville, was the name of the first post office, located on what is now the Rufus LEJEUNE farm, about two miles northwest of the present town of Iota. It was operated by Savien CART.

Later it was moved to the place where now stands the J. P. SEILHAN home on the State Highway. At this site it was operated by Louie CART for two years.

With the advent of the railroad, a warehouse was built at about the present location of the MENOU warehouse. In this warehouse the post office was set up. Also a store was opened therein by Omar DAIGLE.

When DUSON developed the section of town owned by Achile DOUCET, which is now listed as the DUSON addition, the name Iota was given to the community. This development with the sub-division of the property of Cade' POUSSON, completed the linking of Cartville with Point Aux Loups to form the present townsite.

The first formal school was probably the four-room Catholic school located in the southeast corner of Fifth and St. Joseph Streets. The first public school in the town proper was located on the present site and in the building now used as the Baptist church. Then the elementary building was constructed in 1910.

The Artesian Springs, known as the Point Aux Loups Springs and which had the possibility of becoming a health and recreational mecca of the parish were discovered and developed about 1854 by Antoine B. CART. The springs were boarded in to furnish bathing facilities and also constructed at that time was a hotel dear to the memories of many old timers today.

**THOMAS RAND, Jr.:**  
**Early St. Landry Parish Baptist Minister**  
**and Educator**

**Elder Thomas Rand, Jr.**

"The subject of this sketch was born in West Springfield, Mass., July 10th 1813. His father, Thomas Rand, Sr., was also a Baptist preacher, and had an academy at West Springfield, where many men afterwards distinguished received the rudiments of learning. The son was brought up in a literary atmosphere, and imbibed an ardent thirst for knowledge. He improved the opportunities he enjoyed, and became a ripe scholar. At an early age he became the subject of divine grace; and in 1836 he was licensed to preach.

That he might the better qualify himself for the sacred calling, he entered Hamilton Theological Seminary, where he graduated in 1838. Not long afterwards he came to Louisiana and engaged in teaching, in St. Landry Parish. He was ordained in 1841. He devoted his life to preaching and teaching, and both by precept and example encouraged a higher standard of ministerial attainments. The fact that the Louisiana Association fostered ministerial education was largely due to his influence.

He encouraged the Association to raise a library fund and purchase books for the use of her ministers. A valuable library was thus accumulated, to which all her ministers had access and by which they were greatly benefited. He was for some time missionary of the Association, and enjoyed the confidence of the Creole population among whom he labored; and was instrumental in bringing many to the light of the Gospel. He died at Lake Charles, in the Parish of Calcasieu, July 1st, 1869."



## WHAT IS IN A NAME

DURING THE TIME OF THE OPENING OF THIS COUNTRY TO IMMIGRATION TO THE PEOPLE OF THE WORLD. THEY CAME IN DROVES, FROM THE 15TH CENTURY TO THE PRESENT. MOST OF THE IMMIGRATION WAS LEGAL, AND THE PEOPLE CAME BECAUSE THEY WERE PERSECUTED BECAUSE OF THEIR RELIGIOUS BELIEVES, THEIR ETHNIC BACKGROUNDS, THE SUPPRESSION OF THEIR FREEDOMS, THE LACK OF OPPORTUNITIES TO ENJOY LIFE, AND A MULTITUDE OF OTHER REASONS.

AS THEY ENTERED THIS COUNTRY, MOST OF THEM COULD NOT SPEAK ENGLISH, AND IN MOST CASES THE OFFICIALS COULD NOT UNDERSTAND THEM, SO AN INTERPRETER WAS NEEDED TO HELP THEM ALONG THE ROUTE TO GAIN ENTRY. AS THEY MERGED INTO THE STREAM OF AMERICAN LIFE, PEOPLE FOUND IT DIFFICULT TO PRONOUNCE THE NAMES OF A GREAT MANY OF THESE PEOPLE. AS THIS HAPPENED MANY OF THE NAMES WERE CHANGED, SHORTENED, SPELLING REARRANGED, ALSO MANY OF THE PEOPLE COULD NOT READ OR WRITE, SO AS LETTERS OR OTHER DOCUMENTS WERE WRITTEN AND THEY SIGNED WITH THE 'X' THE WITNESSES WOULD SIGN THE NAMES AS THEY SOUNDED, SO IN MANY WAYS THE NAMES OF TODAY ARE CHANGED GREATLY FROM THEIR ORIGINAL SPELLING AND PRONUNCIATION.

AS WE WEND OUR WAY THROUGH THIS PROJECT, WE WILL TRY TO PUT THE 'OLD AND NEW' IN NAMES AND PLACES IN THEIR PROPER ORDER, AND MAYBE WE WILL RUN INTO A GREAT MANY SURPRISES.

AT THE END OF THIS NARRATIVE, I WILL LIST THE SOURCES OF MY INFORMATION, AND IF ANY READER CAN ADD TO IT, WE WILL GREATLY APPRECIATE ALL THE INPUT WE CAN GET, ALONG WITH COPIES OF THE ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS CONTAINING THE OLD WAY OF SPELLING A CERTAIN NAME. WE ARE AWARE THAT SOME NAMES WILL HAVE MANY WAYS THAT IT EVOLVED DOWN TO THE PRESENT SPELLING. THE NAME MAY HAVE BEEN SPELLED DIFFERENTLY IN THE SAME FAMILY. DIFFERENT ACCENTS WILL HAVE A GREAT INFLUENCE ON THE WAY A NAME SOUNDS TO DIFFERENT PEOPLE AND SO THE SPELLING IS CHANGED. ALSO A NAME CHANGE WAS A VERY CONVENT WAY TO CHANGE IDENTITIES FOR VARIES REASONS. ALL IN ALL IT SHOULD MAKE FOR A VERY INTERESTING TIME, ALONG WITH SOME INTERESTING READING.

**BRIERE<** Is another typical example of the changing in spelling due to the inability of the named person to spell in English, and the interpreter to understand the spelling in the foreign language. It came in originally as LaBriere. Sometime in the early 1800's the La, or Le was dropped and the name is now in its present form.

**ROCHELLE<**Is another name that went thru the same area of spelling. Originally it was LaRochelle or LeRochelle. The La or Le was dropped so as to make the American version more tasteful.

**CHAUSSEGROS<** Is a name from southern France and come to this country thru Canada, Nova Scotia, on down to the south of Louisiana, Making many stops along the way. At each stop, a change was in order for many reasons, ease in spelling, ease in pronunciation or just lack of the ability to do either. It is found in its modern style as Chausson, Jason, Chausseau, Chauseaux.

**BENIOT<** is a French found in the French communities all over the world, especially in So. Louisiana, It was originally spelled Beniot. The "S" was silent therefore it was left out in translation.

**JACQUELINE,** is a name that is unique. It has been changed around and also is still found in its original form. The name today is spelled Jackuline, Jackie, Chaquie, Chaquiline. These are the most common.

**MARGUERITE<** is another name in the same category, in addition to the originally spelling, it is more commonly found as Margaret.

**COMEAU<** is almost one of a kind. It is spelled in many ways, but the most common is due to the spelling on the immigrant applications, as Como, Comeaux, Commo, Comeau, and many other ways at the whim of the writer.

**LOQUET>** Loquet is probably one of the many names that came from the persons occupation. As loquet in (French) is lockmaker, or latch-maker. It first appears in the 1580's in Northern France, and is not very common. Apparently it was a specialized occupation. The name is not found in Louisiana as of yet, and it does not seem to have been derived from any other name. No other spellings have been associated with this name. No other information was found.

ROZAS < The name is probably Spanish in origin, and probably was common along the Spain & French Border lines> The name is Roses In Spanish and the French word for Rose is Roz. So the two peoples became entwined and as they came to American thru the normal channels of immigration French was the spoken language, hence the Cajuns adopted them into their culture and has been so, for many generations.

Ortega and Ortego are from the same background. The name is Spanish in Origin, and also was common along the French & Spanish Borders. Most of the people could speak both languages, and as they migrated to So Louisiana, to be among a common language, they became integrated with the french speaking people and the Spanish language died out. The spelling was a matter of choice.

Gemlich. Is a German name and was spelled Gimlich Gynlich, Gymnich. As these people came thru the immigration lines, most of them could not speak English, and the vast majority could not read or write their own native language, therefore, the name was spelled as it sounded to the person taking down the information. I have a Gr. Gr. Gr. Grandfather, a Phillip Gemlich, arriving in this country in 1854, His name is spelled GEMPLICH, his brother was interviewed by a different person, and his name is Heinrich Gimlich, the other brother Franz, wound up as Gymlich. Three brothers, three different spellings.

Langlois> Probably arrived in this country in the early 1600's as the name can be found in 1608, in Virginia. It migrated thru out the south and east. It is of English origin and was spelled "LANGLY" do to the French influence in Alabama and Louisiana, it has went thru a change. In La, it is spelled and pronounced in the french version. In the east it has mostly retained the English spelling and pronunciation.

Buller> A very prominent name in The french or Cajun area in So. Louisiana is of German origin, and arrived in the mid 1700's. The original spelling was "BUHLER", This version has long been replaced by its present spelling, and the main reason for the change as in most names was the lack of many people with the ability to read or write. So the scribes translated it as it sounded.

Cowen>> Is a name with German origins, and probably originated among the Jewish Citizens of the Germanic states. The original spelling was COHEN, and as it immigrated to the USA in the late 1700's and 1800's, the name was spelled as it sounded. AW was used in place of the H.

Van Nuys, is a misspelled name from France. It arrived in this country approxmatly 1826. It was origannly spelled VAN NICE and was very common, and still is in the southern area of present day France.



## The Land of the Ardoins

### -A Brief History of Ville Platte, Louisiana-

Ville Platte, Louisiana is the parish seat of Evangeline Parish. Many, many years ago the area that now makes up the city was a part of the Opelousas District that in 1805 became St. Landry Parish. In 1911, Evangeline parish was created from that part of St. Landry that included the community of Ville Platte. During the 1790s (prior to 1796) a man named Francois Ardoin moved to this area of Louisiana, where he and his wife, Laurine Quebedeaux, produced and reared their family of fifteen children, eight boys and seven girls. Most of the Ardoin children remained in the area, settling in or around what is now the city of Ville Platte in Evangeline Parish, making this area the "land of the Ardoin's." The family played a prominent role in the history of the community and the parish. Since the story of the Ardoin family in Louisiana is so entangled with the history of the Ville Platte community, the following story of Ville Platte is included as part of this publication.



## **LOCAL HISTORY OF VILLE PLATTE, LA.**

*Ville Platte, was the first community on level land that stagecoach passengers met, when traveling north to Alexandria. Its name was derived because of this, and literally translates to mean "Flat Town."*

*The first settler to the Ville Platte area is believed to be a Scotch-Irishman named O'Donegan who established a blacksmith shop on the old Buffalo Trail.*

*However, Major Marcellin Garand was the founder of Ville Platte. He served in both the French ARMY and in Napoleon's ARMY as an adjutant general. Following his Napoleonic campaigns, he kept a tiny tavern on the site of Ville Platte's old post office. Travellers on the Rapids Trail often stopped to hear his stories about the "Little Corporal."*

*Garand is credited with introducing "Le Tournoi," a revival of the ancient French jousting tournaments, to the area. The Tournoi was run as late as 1890 when it was abandoned for about half a century. Garand's grave may be seen in the Old Town Cemetery in Ville Platte.*

*Early French and Spanish settlers referred to the entire Evangeline Parish area as a "Vacherie," which translates to "a grazing land for cattle." This "vacherie" extended from the Atchafalaya River to the Sabine River at the Texas-Louisiana State Line. Huge roundups were held each year on this great open range. As settlers homesteaded the area, fences were built, small towns sprang up and the vast land known as the "vacherie" disappeared. Colonization was well underway by the 1700's.*

*The Old Spanish Trail from Louisiana to Texas wound its way through the "vacherie" and traces of the old trail may still be seen off present-day Highway 167. Other sections of this early trail may be found in the Chicot State Park area.*

*Ville Platte was incorporated on Mar. 16, 1858, and has continuously grown to its present population of over 10,000 inhabitants.*

*Originally, Ville Platte was located in St. Landry Parish. However, in 1911, the town's political interest led to the eventual dividing of St. Landry Parish into two parishes, making Ville Platte the parish seat of the new Evangeline Parish.*

*Mamou is the second largest town in Evangeline Parish. This vast prairie was known as Mamou Prairie as far back as the 1700s and the Anglo-Americans first called it the "Mammouth Prairie" because of its immense size. When the Frenchman came, they called it "Mamou" for mammouth. Mamou Prairie was settled in the early 18th century by the French, Spanish, and Acadians.*

*Within this vast prairie, the site of Mamou was laid out in 1907 by Curley C. Duson of Eunice. He was president of the Mamou Townsite Company which opened an office*

*on the corner of Seventh and Chestnut. Lot auctions were held weekly with one lot selling for \$50.00. The original village covered one square mile. Mamou was incorporated on Jan. 11, 1911 by proclamation of the governor.*

*Evangeline Parish is widely noted for being a "Melting Pot" of various nationalities who settled this area. Its rich French, Spanish, Italian, and German background are major influences on today's culture. The addition of Nova Scotian, African, Santa Domingan and Vietnamese also add to the flavor of the Cajun Culture.*

*"Le Tournoi de la Ville Platte," is a joust or tournament that requires speed, agility and accuracy on the part of both the rider and his mount. The sport which was originally introduced in the 1800s, was run until the late 1890s, when it was abandoned. It was revived in 1952 by a group of veterans as part of their July 4th celebration and has continued as such since that time. A rider in the Tournoi (French for tournament) carries a long, slender lance which he uses to put through a small ring as he races his horse around a quarter mile track. Seven rings which represent seven enemies of cotton are suspended from posts along the track. Riders make three rounds (or heats) to decide the winner.*

*The Boggy Bayou Festival" is held on the first full weekend in March at the Boggy Bayou Festival Fair Grounds one mile south of Pine Prairie, La. The festivities began Friday with a special Kiddy day. Saturday's events include the Boggy Bayou Olympics and selection of the Boggy Bayou Queen. Good Cajun cooking, a country store and live entertainment are featured throughout the weekend. Proceeds from the festival are donated towards the purchase of special equipment for the residents of Prairie Manor Nursing Home.*

## TASSO

Was thumbing thru some old books and documents and ran onto the word "TASSO" listed in two places. As we all know Tasso, is a very delicious dish of Cajun food consisting of highly flavored strips or cubes of beef, pork, deer, or other edible meats, smoked over a slow smoking hardwood fire. The Tasso is served by itself in a red-eye gravy over rice, or used in other dishes to give the food a very distinctive flavor. Tasso is sometimes added to Gumbo to flavor the chicken, and if you have never tasted this Cajun dish, you are in for a real treat.

The other listing is for a small community, they is now extinct. It was located about five miles south east of Eunice, La. in St Landry Parish. It does not show on any modern maps, it was listed as a village on older maps prior to 1950. The story of how this small community acquired its name is quite interesting. It seems as if the natives in the area had a industry all their own. They assumed all the cattle and hogs running on the open range at the time did not belong to anybody. So many cattle and hogs were rustled on the prairie, slaughtered and made into Tasso, the whole area had a distinctive aroma of smoke and tasso seasoning. It was the only industry in the area, as almost every family, and there were quite a few, had their own operation. Smoke-houses (Boucaneur) were located in every small clump of woods, in every yard and operated daily. The Tasso was taken to Eunice, Lawtell and Opelousas to be sold.

As people passed close to the area they could smell the wonderful odor and knew exactly where they were. So the area became known as "TASSO" and the name stuck, until the rustling of the live-stock became to dangerous to pursue, and the industry went under cover or died out completely.

As the people moved out and the mailing address were assigned to a Route from Eunice, the names Tasso was slowly forgotten. It is found only in older records, and is a part of the Cajun History.

## WHAT'S IN A NAME?

What's in a name? A great deal, if one is of Cajun descent and lucky enough to live in southwest Louisiana.

Many of us, especially the younger generation, do not realize that many of the family names common to this area have their origins in very early European history.

Some of the family names are sometimes hard to recognize because some were corrupted in their spelling or otherwise changed while becoming anglicized.

Another reason for many of the name changes has to do with the multiple government and language changes in our state from the time it was first settled until the Louisiana Purchase in 1803. Town clerks and registers of different nationalities changed the spelling of names to conform to their own origins.

Surnames were not common in many early European countries for anyone but the nobility and the powerful clergy. Most of the members of the so called middle or lower classes were simply known by a first name among the ruling class.

While there may have been only one person with a given first name under class direction, a village or settlement may have had several Johns, or Henrys, or Marys, or Sophies.

Although a means of identifying each individual's first name may not have been necessary for the ruling class, it became necessary among the masses. Therefore, surnames were often taken or given, for example, to describe a person's place of residence, his occupation or some physical characteristic.

If a person left his town to live somewhere else, he would add the name of the new town to his name. If he lived on or near a hill, he would use the word hill as his family name.

Many of the occupations reflected in our family names were those known in villages or large households. Every town had a carpenter, a cook, a miller, a shoemaker, etc..

Many of the last names were descriptive. In France, a person with a ruddy complexion became Red, or Reid or Rousseau: A tall man became Legrands: A short man became Lecourts and a fat person became Legras or Legros.

Many of us in this area are very familiar with names that follow these traits and origins, although we may not stop and think about where our last name came from or what it means.

The most common last name in our immediate area is 'Fontenot', derived from Font, which in itself has more than one meaning. 'Font' either means a fountain or a source. If you prefer, the name might have been given because the person was a deep thinker or respected dispenser of advice or problem solver.

A good local example of the last name being given because of one's place of origin would be 'Ardoin'. This is a form of the town of "Hardouin", a town in the south of France, an area where some of the most famous French wines originate.

The surname of Fusilier(Fuselier) also comes from what one did for a living. This is a derivative of 'Fuseau'. The ancestors here probably dealt with weapons of war, in this case sabers.

Indications are that members of this family may have been leaders in the military, as first commandant of the Attakapas territory, in Louisiana was a 'Fusilier'.

Many more of our Cajun names come from interesting backgrounds.





## ***DO YOU REMEMBER WHEN?***

### **THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS, COUNCIL 1754, AND THE WAR EFFORT**

#### **Introduction**

The Knights of Columbus, a Catholic mens' fraternal organization, was founded in New Haven, Connecticut, in 1882. It gradually spread westward, and by 1902, the first council in Louisiana, New Orleans 714, was established. By the next decade, Council 1754, was firmly established in Ville Platte. The Knights have always been an important part of the Ville Platte community, and as a youngster, I can remember my Dad and his involvement in the KCs. The following, an article that appeared in the February 10, 1944, issue (Vol. XXX, No. 14), page 1, illustrates what the Knights were doing more than half a century ago for the improvement of the council home on High School Drive, the community, youth, servicemen, and for spiritual development.

#### **Knights of Columbus (By P.F. Morein)**

At its last regular meeting of the local Council, Knights of Columbus perfected plans for the improvement of its home. The home is now the headquarters for The USO, the Sodality Organization for boys and girls, the Community Library, and sponsor of Troop 36 Boy Scouts. The improvements will consist of building a rest room, toilets, bath equipment, etc.

Plans were made for the serving of chicken gumbo at its next regular meeting. Those wishing to partake of this gumbo must give his name to G.H. Vidrine before that date or he may be disappointed. The members only will be allowed to attend.

A closed Retreat at the Lady of the Oaks Retreat House, Grand Coteau, for men of this vicinity will be held in May. All those wishing to take part were instructed to contact Judg[e] J.C. Fruge at once for reservations.

Over 1800 packs of cigarettes have been sent to soldiers and sailors through the local Council free of charge, with the compliments of the citizens of Ville Platte. Plans are underway for the sending of 2000 more packs to the service men overseas. This is one way of showing the boys in service our appreciation of their services for Democracy.

Knights are boosting the 4th War Bond Drive to the greatest extent possible.





## Gautherot (Gaut(h)reau(x))

### The Family History

Francois Gautherot was born in France, most likely in the province of Touraine, in 1612 or 1613. He came to Acadia in 1632 with Commander de Razilly. In 1664, he married Edmee Lejeune, a union of two of the earliest Acadian families. Edmee was his second wife, the first was named Marie although her family name is unknown. Edmee Lejeune, born in 1623 near Port-Royal, was one of the first Acadian children born in Acadia. Her father came to Acadia in 1611 with Pointrincourt and Biencourt and married a woman of the Micmac tribe.

Francois Gautherot and his two wives had at least eleven children for whom at least some record has survived. The five girls Mariel'aisnee, Marie la cadette, Renee, Marguerite, and Jeanne, married into well known Acadian families like Dupuis, Theriault,(Theriot), Giroir, and Lanoue. The six boys were Charles l'aisne, Jehan(Jean), Francois, Claude, Charles le cadet, and Germain. Of these six boys, three became coureurs de bois (wood-runners) with Micmac cousins and disappeared from the Acadian censuses.

Charles l'aisne married Francoise Cousin in Quebec in 1665 and lived the rest of his life there. He died in 1714 at the age of 76.

Claude married Marie Therriot, the daughter of Bonaventure Therriot and Jeanne Boudrot (Boudreaux) in 1685 at Port Royal. He and his family were participants in the founding of the community of Riviereaux-Gaspereaux near Grand-Pre. Claude and Marie had at least four boys and five girls. One of these sons, Charles, married Marie-Josephe LeBlanc, the daughter of Jacques LeBlanc and Catherine Landry on Oct. 8, 1725 at Grand-Pre. It is known that one of his sons, also named Charles was made prisoner during the deportation era but was held at Fort Beausejour rather than deported. He married Marie Marguerite Bourgeois in captivity at the fort on Sept. 4, 1762. They eventually moved to the French North Atlantic island of Miquelon but later returned to Acadia, thus helping to re-establish the Gautreau name there.

Charles le cadet also married in 1685 to Francoise Rimbault and also participated in the founding of Riviere-aux-Gaspereaux. They had eleven children. Their oldest son, Francois, married Marie Vincent, the daughter of Michel Vincent and Marie-Josephe Richard in 1709 at Grand-Pre. They were among the Acadians who went to live on the Ile St-Jean (prince Edward Island) during the mid 1700s in order to avoid English rule. In 1758, the English took the island and a second wave of deportations began from the island. Francois and Marie were caught up in the deportation and perished at sea en route to exile in Europe. The youngest son of Charles le cadet and Francoise Rimbault, Pierre-Mathurin married Anne-Rosalie Daigle, the daughter of Jean Daigle and Marie Anne Beau sometime around 1755. They managed to escape the deportation and fled to Quebec. Twenty years later he and his family moved to the banks of the St-Jean River in New Brunswick, but with the arrival of the Loyalists fleeing the aftermath of the American Revolution, Pierre-Mathurin was again expelled from his land by the British and had to flee north. He moved to the north-east coast of New Brunswick near Tracadie where he died between 1795 and 1798.

Following the deportation of the Acadians in 1755, two Gautreaux families made their way to Louisiana during the 1760's. The first of these families, headed by Simon Gautreaux and his wife, Marie-Madeleine Breaux, arrived around 1765 and settled along the Acadian coast in St. James

Parish. Simon eventually acquired a plantation of over 500 acres on the west bank of the Mississippi near the present day community of Welcome. The plantation was called St. Joseph and remained in the family for over a century. Simon's seven sons remained in St James and Ascension parishes and firmly established the Gautreaux name along the Mississippi River.

The other Gaautraux arrival in Louisiana was Amand Gautreaux and his wife Marie Landry, along with their only son, Jerome. This family settled first at St. James, but moved to the Attakapas country along the upper Bayou Vermillion by the 1790s. Jerome married Marie-Sophie Dugas and established a homestead in south-central Louisiana.

Jerome's five sons remained in the general area of Attakapas(Opelousas)> Jerome Jr., and Onesime settled near Grand Cateau. Pierre and Symphorien established themselves on the Bayou Teche near Breaux Bridge, and Joseph settled to the west on the prairie near Church Point.

During the 1800's one of Simon's Grandsons, Alexandre (m. 1829 Euphemie LeBlanc), moved from St. James to the Opelousas district. His sons, Adolphe, Dozelien, and Joseph all married in to the LaMorandiere family.

Nine Gautreaux families came to Louisiana with the 1785 migration of deported Acadians from Nantes, France. Most of these families were sent to Bayou LaFourche, and their Descendants established Assumption and LaFourche families as the center of the Gautreaux name in south Louisiana by the 1880s. Among the 1785 arrivals, the family of Joseph Gautreaux and his wife Anne Pitre, with their five sons produced the largest Gautreaux clan along the Bayou LaFourche. Several of their descendants, including grandson, Euselin (m. 1839 Celeste Boyer) settled near Labadienville. Others, including a grandson named David (m. 1832 Marie-Gertrude Honore) moved closer to the southern end of Bayou LaFourche. Some of their sons settled near Lockport and LaRose, while others moved to Bayou Terrbonne, near Houma and Montegut.

Today, in Louisiana, this Acadian family name is spelled various ways, including Gauthreaux, Gauthreaux, and Gautreau. I Canada, where the name is present in New Brunswick, Quebec and Nova Scotia, the Gautreau spelling predominates.

Klaus> Arrived in this country around 1840, it is of German origin. The original spelling was probably KLAUESSEN. But over the next few generations under went many changes. The first was a shorting of the name to Klaussen, from *Klaussecker* then to Klauss, Clauss, and finley to its present spelling of Klaus.

Blunk> is another name that has been rewritten many ways over the few years it has been in the USA. It also arrived in the mid 1800's, from Germany and started in as Blunker, and has been spelled Plunker, Plunkett, Blunkett and finley to the spelling of today BLUNK. Most of these changes were due misunderstanding in the immigration centers and the interperturs.
